Staff Recommendation

Consider the following courses of action with regard to the City's Ethics Policies:

Comprehensive Update. Under this alternative the Council would order a comprehensive update to the City's Ethics Policies, including (1) an update to the Officials' Policy to conform to current FPPC regulations, (2) resolution of the inconsistencies and ambiguities discussed in the Administrative Report, including resolution of the issue that could require adding consideration of an ethics complaint to a Council agenda after publication of the agenda, and (2) conformance of the Employees' Policy to the City's Personnel Policies and Procedures and other due process requirements. Staff recommends that any update address the following issues: (1) the initial investigation and informal hearing (e.g., the relationship and timing between the two), (2) the consequences of a dismissed complaint (e.g. whether or under

what circumstances a dismissed complaint may be refiled), and (3) the final action on a complaint (e.g., what disciplinary action may be taken for a violation?). This alternative should also include a Council directive that the Policies be reviewed regularly (perhaps at the time of the periodic review of the City's Conflict of Interest Code) to ensure that inconsistencies with state law do not again develop.

- Repeal of the Policies and Replacement with Public Education and Referral Services. As indicated in the Administrative Report, all provisions of the City's Ethics Policies are covered by parallel provisions of state law. Unlike the City Policies, these state laws grant enforcement authority to the FPPC, the Attorney General, and the District Attorney, with the ability to seek and impose administrative fines, and civil and criminal penalties for violations. The Employees' Policy is covered by other City personnel rules and enforceable under those rules. The Council could repeal the Ethics Policies and replace them with public education and referral services to assist the public in filing complaints and grievances with appropriate enforcement agencies or, as regarding staff, with the City Manager, under applicable state law and City personnel policy.
