BEACHES, PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY UPDATE

Listed below are a variety of items that the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Department are currently focusing.

### BEACHES, PARKS AND RECREATION Administration Administration – Initiated by Sharon Heider

#### BEACHES AND PARKS MAINTENANCE DIVISION

- B&P staff responded to an emergency call from Marine Safety regarding an area near North Beach where erosion had created an unsafe condition with the railroad rip rap. Staff located a contractor to push sand into the "void" and restore the area for safe access
- Staff assisted in the transition of maintenance for the Ralph's Skate Court and Baron Dog Playgrounds from TruGreen LandCare to E. Stewart & Associates. Stewart took over these two areas at no cost in negotiation to extend Stewart's landscape maintenance contract at Steed Park. This results in annual savings of \$36,400.

#### MARINE SAFETY DIVISION

Approximately 379,000 people enjoyed our beaches in July. Lifeguards performed 1,210 rescues, 299 medical aids, 14,516 preventative actions, and, gave 2,126 warnings for ordinances.

### Beach Volleyball Camp

Summer Beach Volleyball is hosted at the North Beach volleyball courts and meets Mon-Thurs, 10am-12pm, for four, two-week sessions. Players of all levels will have an opportunity to develop their skills through instruction and structured play. Due to the extreme success of last year's enrollment and demands, staff added a fourth session and continued to see high enrollment.

#### Fun on the Run

Fun on the Run kicked off its summer season with four weeks of summer fun. Themes included water games, pirate adventures, summer safety tips, Power Play, and Olympic sports. Each week included games and crafts.

During July, Fun on the Run teamed up with City of San Clemente Aquatics Staff to put together a free swim lesson program offered to Fun on the Run families. The program will run for four weeks for two hours each Friday, and students will learn the necessary skills to be water safe. Transportation is provided for all participants and their families to and from the San Clemente Aquatics Center. The "Swim and Learn" program is sponsored by Great Opportunities and the Friends of the Beaches, Parks & Recreation Foundation.









## **Active Adventures Camp**

"Active Adventures" is in full swing and is half way through the summer season. Active Adventures Camp offers healthy activities on both land and water. Activities include

capture the flag, ultimate scoops, games, hiking, swimming, crafts and field trips! Some of the field trips that campers have adventured off too; Ocean Institute, Boomers, Santa Ana Zoo, Wave Water Park and Pump it Up to name a few. Recreation staff is doing a great job organizing and implementing these activities on a daily basis. Located at the San Clemente Aquatics Center in the Vista Hermosa Sports Park, it is the ideal location to activate summer adventures. Camp will end on September 6.







### Youth Performing Arts Camp

This year marked the 11<sup>th</sup> season of the performing arts summer camp program. Staff continued to develop the program to engage a more dynamic and diversified group of participants of all levels, ages, and experiences. There were two different camp options for families to choose from, a one-week workshop camp and a two-week production camp, featuring "Shrek the Musical". The workshop camps were designed for children with little to no theater experience, wanting to learn more about the dynamics and many facets of stage acting. The camp was concluded with a showcase presentation that friends and families attended, and students had an opportunity to display all the techniques they learned. This camp style was extremely successful for its second year with 43 children enrolled between the two camp sessions.

The two-week production camp was equally successful reaching 20 participants! This year's performance was "Shrek the Musical." Students were taught everything from music, dance choreography, acting, accents, stage combat, set design, costumes, and makeup. Recreation staff directed, choreographed, edited, ran all sound and lighting, as well as set design and construction for the show. The show and camp were a smashing success and received rave reviews from parents, participants, and community attendees.
