BEACHES AND PARKS MAINTENANCE DIVISION

June is traditionally the busiest month in Beaches & Parks:

- Removed and replaced Phoenix palm, Camino Estrella
- Removed and replaced two podocarpus trees, Canada
- Replaced damaged picnic tables and pads at Mira Costa Park
- Resurfaced Bonito Canyon tennis courts
- Replaced damaged plant material on several slopes, Forster Ranch Park
- Sidewalk pressure washing in "T-Zone" and Pier Bowl
- Replaced aging plant material, Los Mares median between Calle Nuevo and Vera Cruz
- Began summer sand grooming program

MARINE SAFETY DIVISION

Approximately 300,000 people enjoyed our beaches in June. Lifeguards performed 578 rescues, 149 medical aids, 7,042 preventative actions, and, gave 1,255 warnings for ordinances (these numbers are accurate through June 26, 2013).

Recreation Programs

Recreation began the summer session on June 17, 2013. A total of 13 camps began that week which included surf, art, sports, science, and recreation camps. Summer registration began on May 8 with a total of 313 people registering (revenue of \$20,719),

and a total of 184 people registering on the first day of summer (June 17). Revenue for that day was \$14,963.75. It was a busy day for all. There are a variety of classes offered this summer from drama camps, dance camps, art, cooking, and swimming, surfing, and much more, giving the youth something fun and exciting to do in San Clemente. A new camp to look out for is Bricks for Kidz, which is popular around town. The fall publication is in its first review and is expected to reach homes early August.

Goal Zone Sports

Goal Zone ended in May and will startup again in the fall. Over the next few months staff will be working with school administrators to confirm program scheduling.

San Clemente Playschool

During the month of June, Playschool ran two tiny tot programs, "Jr. Detectives" and "Lil' Dribblers". Both programs received positive feedback from parents and children. The "Jr. Detectives" focused on their detective skills by using their 5 senses, guessing skills, and process of elimination abilities. The children went on a clue hunt through Courtney's Sand Castle and received their Jr. Detectives badge at the end of the program. The "Lil' Dribblers" class offered children the opportunity to work on the court skills. Staff taught them the basics of bouncing a ball, two handed and one handed, dribbling in a line, passing, and shooting into a hoop.

Active Adventures Camp

"Active Adventures Camp" is an all day summer camp that began June 12 and runs through September 6. Camp offers healthy activities on both land and water. Football, capture the flag, trail hikes, swimming, crafts and field trips! Located at the San Clemente Aquatics Center in the Vista Hermosa Sports Park, it is the ideal location to activate summer adventures. Parents can choose to enroll their child for a full week or half days. Extended hours are also offered for parents who work early mornings or get off late.
