BEACHES, PARKS AND RECREATION ADMINISTRATION

BEACHES AND PARKS MAINTENANCE DIVISION

- Beaches and Parks have solicited quotes for the resurfacing of the Bonito-Canyon Park tennis courts. Work should be completed by summer.
- On March 19, the City Council approved the extension of 12 Beaches & Parks maintenance contracts. Significant savings were garnered with the extensions.
- Beaches & Parks had the spring contractual sand pushing on City beaches accomplished the first week of March.

MARINE SAFETY DIVISION

Approximately 82,000 people enjoyed our beaches in March. Lifeguards performed 12 rescues, 16 medical aids, 496 preventative actions, and, gave 345 warnings for ordinances (numbers accurate through March 29, 2013).

Nearly 95% of participants showed up for the tournament and parents and friends came out to support their children. San Clemente Playschool

Playschool soared during the month of March with three successful programs, a special event, and grant recognition from the Sunrise Rotary Club of San Clemente. Programming included a course on Dr. Seuss and two courses of Turf Time. During the Dr. Seuss course students read four different Seuss books, learned songs, played silly Seuss games, and made crafts. Turf Time included sport instruction on soccer, baseball, football, and track and field.

Also during March, Playschool put on its first special event, the Springtime Eggstravaganza! The event was geared specifically towards 3-5 year olds and included two hours of spring crafts and activities. The event included a visit from the San Clemente Animal Shelter with a live bunny, photos with the Easter Bunny, bunny games, egg dying, spring songs, a picture frame craft, and an egg hunt! The program was attended by 36 preschoolers and fun was had by all!

The Aquatics Center will continue to recruit lifeguards and water safety instructors in preparation for the busy summer months.

Goal Zone

April marked the beginning of flag football for Goal Zone. This is the second time that flag football was offered at Goal Zone, and it continues to be met with great enthusiasm by parents and students. Students have begun to develop skills in passing/receiving, kicking, flag pulling, and understanding the rules of the sport. For nutrition education, staff will be covering the following topics: body mass index (BMI), healthy lunches, portion control, MyPyramid, and Power Play. The tournament between all three schools will be held on May 21 at the Vista Hermosa Sports Park on the football field.

San Clemente Playschool

During April, Playschool featured three different classes, "Bugalicious," "Lil' Dribblers," and "Kicks & Swings". During the Bugalicious class, preschool aged children read two books and went on bug hunts on the trail at the Vista Hermosa Sports Park to discover and explore all the bugs living in the hills. On Saturday, April 13th, six Aquatics Center Lifeguards attended a special TOTAL Guard training presented by CPRS District 12 and the San Diego County Aquatics Council in Coronado. Lifeguards learned about preventative lifeguarding, pool rescue statistics and how to prevent lifeguard failure. After the in-class portion of the training, guards got in the water to practice their rescue skills. Drills highlighted the importance of teamwork when performing rescues, first aids and CPR as well as made lifeguards think outside of the box by having them perform two person rescues, rescues while blindfolded, etc.
