#### **BEACHES AND PARKS MAINTENANCE DIVISION**

### Activate at Shorecliffs - Chris Smith

#### After Hours Middle School – Chris Smith

The relaunch of the theater program at the middle schools has met with good success as well, which will round out our Summer Performing Arts Camps, giving us year-round impact in this area.

Vista del Mar is the only school site in San Clemente that incorporates both elementary and middle school students, which is why this program is only offered exclusively at this site.
