APPROVAL OF THE RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE (ROPS)

Summary:

Under Health and Safety Code Section 34180, certain actions of the Successor Agency (City) require approval of the Oversight Board. As part of the requirement to dissolve the Redevelopment Agency, the City Council is required to take actions under AB 26. These include the approval of the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) and the Successor Agency's Administrative Budget.

The ROPS was presented at the February 21, 2012 City Council meeting and approved for submission to the Oversight Board. The ROPS is for the period February through June 2012. At the time the AB 26 was upheld by the California Supreme Court, several projects were already underway. The ROPS schedule lists the financial obligations of the redevelopment agency that were outstanding, including payments related to contracts and agreements; project specific costs; debt payments; and other miscellaneous payments. Included on the schedule are costs related to the dissolution of outstanding obligations of the former Redevelopment Agency. These outstanding obligations include the Casa Romantica Lease Obligation, General Fund Advance, obligations under the Pier Bowl Sidewalk Project, approved affordable housing assistance agreements and dissolution administrative costs.

Information on each of the items listed on the ROPS follows:

Casa Romantica Lease Obligation. This obligation relates to the rental agreement with the Casa Romantica Cultural Center (CRCC). The former RDA is obligated to perform certain maintenance items specified and do an exterior painting every 10 years; with the first painting currently due. This amount is based on an annual maintenance requirement of \$30,000 annually and \$80,000 twice during the estimated life of the original redevelopment agency.

General Fund Advance. In July 2002, the RDA refinanced outstanding debt that was used to purchase the Casa Romantica historical site and related improvements. The loan (advance) was refinanced with the General fund balance in an original amount of \$3.4 million with an interest rate of 2.9% and a term of 16 years, with annual payments equal to \$269,830. This loan was to be paid with property tax increment.

Pier Bowl Lighting and Landscape Project. This project was completed approximately in May of 2011, however due to outstanding issues funds were held in retention. The project is

wrapping up the construction management and these outstanding issues with full acceptance of the project anticipated in the near future. Upon final acceptance outstanding payments will be completed and made on this project.

Affordable Housing Assistance. These assistance agreements were approved prior to the approval of AB26 and are related to Low and Moderate Income Housing funds to provide transitional assistance and affordable housing to individuals.

Administrative Budget. The City has detailed the estimated administrative costs (as listed in Attachment B) related to the dissolution of the Agency which will be submitted to the Oversight Board as required under Health & Safety Code Section 34177(j). AB 26 provides for an administrative allowance to allow a successor agency to wind down the former redevelopment agency and administer an oversight board. The allowance covers staff time, attorney and consultant time, rent, supplies, audit fees, record-keeping costs, etc. The law allows 5% of the amount listed on the fiscal year 2011-2012 ROPS for administrative costs (with a minimum allowance of \$250,000), and then 3% of the ROPS for the following fiscal years.

In addition to the current ROPS, a future ROPS will need to be prepared for additional costs relating to the period of July 2012 through December 2012.

STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT THE OVERSIGHT BOARD

- 1) Approve the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) as presented.
- 2) Approve the Administrative budget for operations from February 1, 2012 to June 30, 2012 in relation to the dissolution of the former Redevelopment Agency.
