I. Relocation of La Cristianita Monument to Casa Romantica Site

Community Development Director Holloway reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report; advised that a donor has expressed interest to fund the relocation of the La Cristianita monument; responded to Council inquiries.

<u>Rick Divel</u>, San Clemente, speaking on behalf of Bertha Henry Taylor, commended Council for moving forward with the relocation of the La Cristianita monument.

<u>Rebecca Robles</u>, San Clemente, opined that the monument should be relocated to the historic site near Cristianitos Road; voiced concern that Native American groups were not notified of the potential relocation of the monument.

<u>Larry Culbertson</u>, President of the San Clemente Historical Society, voiced support for the relocation of the monument to Casa Romantica.

<u>Mel Vernon</u>, Captain of the San Luis Rey Band of Mission Indians, spoke on the importance of cultural preservation and awareness; encouraged that Native American groups be invited to celebrate the relocation of the monument.

<u>Don Kunze</u>, San Clemente, conveyed support for the relocation of the monument; spoke on the importance of the historic site as part of the trail system near Cristianitos Road.

Council recommended that signage be located near the monument to provide visitors with directional information concerning the original historic site.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER BAKER, CARRIED 5-0, to:

- 1. Accept the donation from Dr. Giovanni Cirocco for the relocation of the La Cristianita Monument to the Casa Romantica site.
- 2. Authorize a \$3,000 budget from the City Council Contingency Account to Community Development Administration Contractual Services Account 001-441-43890 for any significant overages associated with the relocation of the La Cristianita Monument to the Casa Romantica site.

- 3. Approve the placement of the monument and plaque per the recommendation of the Casa Romantica Board and in conformance with the Zoning Administrator approval and per authorization by the State Office of Historic Preservation, with the addition of an interpretive sign that celebrates the cultural history and provides wayfinding to the historic La Cristianita site.
- 4. Request that Casa Romantica host a grand opening celebration, and invite Native Americans associated with La Cristianita to the event.

8. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Ole Hanson Beach Club Rehabilitation Concept Plans

Report from the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Director concerning the rehabilitation concept plans for the Ole Hanson Beach Club.

Recreation Manager Passow narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Ole Hanson Beach Club Repair and Rehabilitation" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of Ms. Passow's presentation, dated November 27, 2012, is on file with the City Clerk.

<u>George Gregory</u>, San Clemente, suggested design modifications to the facility; urged that public notification concerning the Ole Hanson Beach Club be expanded to 500'.

<u>Larry Culbertson</u>, President of the San Clemente Historical Society, spoke on the historical significance of the Ole Hanson Beach Club; urged Council to move forward with the aesthetic restoration in conjunction with the facility rehabilitation.

Margo Beauchamp, San Clemente, urged Council to ensure that the building design takes into consideration the security of the women's changing room; suggested that the reception desk be located in an area that can observe the changing room entrances.

<u>Georgette Korsen</u>, San Clemente Historical Society, stressed the importance of balancing historical preservation of the Beach Club and improving the efficiency of the facility; encouraged the restoration of original features and historical elements.

Following discussion, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER DAHL, CARRIED 5-0, to direct Staff to schedule a workshop at the January 8, 2013 City Council meeting relative to the rehabilitation of the Ole Hanson Beach Club, with specific focus on the cost itemization of the initial phase and future improvement phases, potential funding sources to complete the rehabilitation, and an architectural discussion of changes that include exterior elements and citizen safety.

MEETING RECESSED AND RECONVENED

Council recessed at 7:52 p.m. and reconvened at 8:00 p.m. with all members present.

B. Audible Warning System (AWS) Update and Budget Request

Report from the Community Development Director concerning the audible warning system (AWS) upgrade and budget request.

Councilmembers Baker and Dahl recused themselves from deliberations on this item because they each own property within 500' of the railroad tracks; left the Chambers at 9:00 p.m.

Community Development Director Holloway reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report and responded to Council inquiries.

<u>Kirk Steele</u>, San Clemente, thanked Council and Staff for their work to resolve the train horn noise; encouraged Council to continue moving forward with the AWS system.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, CARRIED 3-0-2 (COUNCILMEMBERS DAHL AND BAKER ABSTAINING), to:

- 1. Authorize a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$86,500 to Quiet Zone Account 001-441-45900-37802 from the General Fund unassigned fund balance.
- 2. Approve, and authorize the Mayor to execute, the First Amendment to Contract C12-07, by and between the City of San Clemente and Goodin, MacBride, Squeri, Day and Lamprey, LLC, providing for professional services related to establishing a Safety/Quiet Zone. This amendment increases the contract cost from \$58,000 to \$134,500 (an increase of \$76,500).

Councilmembers Baker and Dahl returned to the dais at 9:05 p.m.

A. Request for Proposal for San Clemente Bus Circulator Study

Report from the Public Works Director/City Engineer concerning the possibility of issuing a request for proposals for a comprehensive evaluation on the viability of a local bus circulator.

Public Works Director/City Engineer Cameron reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report and responded to Council inquiries.

<u>Brenda Miller</u>, San Clemente, spoke on the need to improve pedestrian infrastructure to promote walkability; voiced support for the City to explore the possibility of a circulator bus in the future.

Following discussion, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, CARRIED 5-0, to deny the issuance of a Request for Proposals for a Transit Planning Consultant to provide a comprehensive evaluation and recommendations on the viability of a local bus circulator.

B. <u>Supplemental Appropriation for the Bonito Canyon Tennis Court Rehabilitation</u>

Report from the Public Works Director/City Engineer and Beaches, Parks and Recreation Director concerning the rehabilitation of the Bonito Canyon Tennis Court.

Councilmember Dahl recused himself from deliberations on this item because he owns property within 500' of Bonito Canyon Park; left the Chambers at 9:30 p.m.

Assistant City Engineer Rebensdorf and Beaches, Parks and Recreation Director Heider narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Bonito Canyon Tennis Court Rehabilitation" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of the presentation, dated November 27, 2012, is on file with the City Clerk.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER BAKER, CARRIED 4-0-1 (COUNCILMEMBER DAHL ABSTAINING), to direct Staff to pursue a Joint Use Agreement with the Capistrano Unified School District for use of tennis courts and to report back to Council at the 2nd meeting in January, 2013.

Councilmember Dahl returned to the dais at 9:50 p.m.

C. <u>Caltrans Request for Encroachment Permit Electrical Service for Changeable</u> Message Sign (CMS) on Northbound I-5 Near Avenida Dolores

Report from the Public Works Director/City Engineer concerning a request from Caltrans for an encroachment permit for electrical service for a Changeable Message Sign (CMS) on Northbound I-5 near Avenida Dolores.

Public Works Director/City Engineer Cameron reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report; displayed slides depicting the proposed CMS signage; responded to Council inquiries. Hard copies of Mr. Cameron's slides are on file with the City Clerk.

Mike Varipapa and Ryan Chamberlain, of Caltrans, stated that CMS signs are needed to notify motorists of congestion, travel times, accidents, Amber Alerts, and other traffic-related information; spoke on the success of the signage program to raise awareness on child abductions, to relieve traffic congestion, and provide public service announcements; explained the rationale for proposing that the sign be located near Avenida Dolores; responded to Council inquires.

<u>Steve Haubert</u>, San Clemente, urged Council to continue the subject to allow additional public review; suggested that Caltrans investigate the possibility of installing the sign farther south on I-5.

<u>Margo Beauchamp</u>, San Clemente, voiced opposition to the installation of the proposed CMS sign; urged Council to conduct a public hearing on the subject; suggested alternative locations for a proposed CMS sign.

<u>Kathleen Ward</u>, San Clemente, opined that there is not a need for additional CMS signs; stated that she checks traffic conditions prior to traveling.

Following discussion, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DAHL, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER BAKER, CARRIED 5-0, to:

- 1. Deny an encroachment permit to Caltrans for the extension of electrical service to the Caltrans Changeable Message Sign on Northbound I-5 near Avenida Dolores.
- 2. Send a formal request to the State Director of Caltrans to not proceed with a Changeable Message Sign on Northbound I-5 near Avenida Dolores.

D. <u>Max Berg Plaza Park Playground Equipment Replacement and Option for</u> Universally Accessible Playground Upgrades

Report from the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Director concerning Max Berg Plaza Park playground equipment replacement and the possibility of upgrading to universally accessible playground equipment.

Beaches, Parks and Recreation Director Heider narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Max Berg Plaza Park Playground Replacement Options" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of Ms. Heider's presentation, dated November 27, 2012, is on file with the City Clerk.

Following discussion, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER BAKER, CARRIED 5-0, to:

- 1. Approve Option 1 to install Universally Accessible playground equipment at Max Berg Plaza Park, as summarized in the Administrative Report, dated November 27, 2012, that is on file with the City Clerk.
- 2. Allocate \$25,000 from the Park Acquisition and Development Fund to the Park Asset Replacement Fund Account 014-820-45300-000-12724.
- Direct Staff to conduct community neighborhood workshops for community input and notify City Council when workshops are scheduled to occur.
