PRESENTATION OF WRITTEN MATERIALS TO COUNCIL

MEETINGS RECORDED AND TELEVISED

Meetings are also recorded via audio CD and DVD and retained as a City record in accordance with the City's records retention schedule.

USE OF ELECTRONIC VISUAL AIDS BY PUBLIC AT MEETINGS
