# Message from the City Manager

I am pleased to announce two new faces at City Hall. On February 17<sup>th</sup>, the City Council appointed Scott Smith to the position of City Attorney and Matthew "Mal" Richardson to be Assistant City Attorney for the City of San Clemente. Both positions are contract positions, and will effectively begin work on March 1<sup>st</sup>. Mr. Smith and Mr. Richardson have impressive resumes with extensive legal knowledge and expertise, while specializing in serving municipal governments.



Mr. Smith is a partner in the Municipal Law practice group of Best Best & Krieger LLP (BB&K), where he has specialized in municipal, land use and environmental law since graduating from law school in 1985. He graduated valedictorian from Utah State University with a degree in political science and Spanish. He received his J.D. degree with honors from Brigham Young University Law School in 1985. He joined BB&K upon law school graduation and bar admission in 1985. In 2011, the Los Angeles Daily Journal named Mr. Smith one of California's top 25 land use attorneys. He serves on the California State Bar Public Law Section's Executive Committee, the League of California Cities Legal Advocacy Committee, and as Secretary of the Orange County City Attorneys Association.

Mr. Smith currently serves as contract City Attorney for the Cities of Aliso Viejo and Lake Forest. He resides in San Clemente with his wife Wendy. And have three sons and one daughter.



Mr. Richardson, also a partner with BB&K, assists both private and public clients in transactional and litigation issues in municipal government, land use, and environmental law. Mr. Richardson received his law degree from the University of California at Los Angeles and received graduate and undergraduate degrees in Comparative Literature from Brigham Young University. He has served as Deputy and Assistant City Attorney for numerous cities throughout southern California. He currently serves as Assistant City Attorney for the cities of Lake Forest, Azusa, and Mammoth Lakes, overseeing the cities' planning and land use issues, and providing advice on all aspects of municipal law. Mr. Richardson is married with three daughters and a son.

For those of you who do not regularly attend City Council meetings to see the City Attorney, you may have little knowledge of what a city attorney does for a city. So, what exactly is a city attorney? First, it's important to realize that the Government Code of the State of California provides that the city attorney of a general law city advise the city officials in all legal matters pertaining to city business, frame all ordinances and resolutions required by the legislative body, and perform other legal services required from time to time by the legislative body.

In a nutshell, though the city attorney's work is not limited to giving legal advice and the drafting of ordinances, resolutions, contracts and other legal documents, the city attorney is also expected to defend the city, its officers and employees in suits and actions filed against them. In addition, he represents the city in such suits, actions or other legal proceedings as are initiated by the city. And we all know how critical sound legal analysis and knowledge of the law is when expecting advice and legal services on behalf of our city. There are a slew of complex laws to understand in the governance of a city. I feel confident with their ability to practice not only good law, but to do so with the utmost integrity and conduct.
