A Regular Meeting of the San Clemente City Council was called to order on February 3, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers, located at 100 Avenida Presidio, San Clemente, California, by Mayor Hamm.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER BROWN, CARRIED 5-0, to recess to Closed Session at 5:30 p.m. to discuss the following:

Council reconvened at 6:17 p.m., with all members present.

Councilmember Brown gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pro Tem Baker led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

A. Presentation of Proclamation – Blue Ribbon Activities

Mayor Hamm presented a Proclamation to Janet Dunford, Crime Prevention Specialist, proclaiming February 3 -16, 2015 as days set apart for Blue Ribbon activities in San Clemente.

B. State of Water Resources and Conservation

Andrew Kanzler, Water Conservation Analyst, narrated a PowerPoint Presentation entitled "Water Resources Update". A hard copy of the presentation is on file in the City Clerk Department.

2. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 1)

Storm Drains on Del Gado Road

Michael Moniak, San Clemente, voiced concerns with the storm drains that the homeowners association installed on Del Gado Road in 2009 (and modified in 2014); opined that the drains on the private property do not comply with the California Building Code; suggested that the storm drains should be subject to the City's permit process. A hard copy of the PowerPoint presentation is on file in the City Clerk's office.

Vista Hermosa Sports Park

Anthony LaFrano, San Clemente, voiced concerns regarding the possibility of a wave pool and miniature golf course at the Vista Hermosa Sports Park; urged Council to not allow alcohol sales at the Sports Park.

San Clemente Campus of Saddleback Memorial Hospital (Potential Closure)

<u>Sharon Gonzalez</u>, President of the Assistance League of Capistrano Valley, spoke in support of the state-of-the-art Urgent Care/Outpatient Center proposed by Saddleback Memorial Hospital.

<u>Colin Leclair</u>, San Clemente, Healthcare Policy Advisor, spoke in support of the transformation of the hospital to a state-of-the-art outpatient facility.

<u>Warren Vidrine</u>, San Clemente, voiced concerns with the potential closure of San Clemente Hospital; opined that the statistics concerning bed counts at the hospital are not accurate; stated that the Memorial Care Board members do not appear to be communicating with each other on the issue of the hospital closure.

<u>Lowell Kleinman, MD</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of the proposed Urgent Care Center; opined there are several benefits to patients, including comprehensive care, that do not currently exist in the community; stated the proposed facility will raise patient care to a new level.

<u>Dr. Gus Gialamus</u>, San Clemente, thanked Council for its support; shared a Press Release from Assemblyman William P. Brough and Senator Patricia Bates, which stated their intent to pursue legislation to help resolve the hospital situation, if needed.

<u>Tony Struthers</u>, Administrator of Saddleback Memorial Hospital San Clemente, spoke concerning outreach efforts to the community regarding the potential changes to Saddleback Hospital San Clemente; spoke in support of administrative or regulatory relief from the State of California to allow free-standing emergency rooms; voiced objection to the full page newspaper ad that was taken out by the Save the Hospital organization.

Commercial Vehicle Parking

<u>George Gregory</u>, San Clemente, voiced concerns over the City's commercial vehicle regulations because of his belief that they discriminate against tradesmen.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER WARD, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, CARRIED 5-0, to approve, and authorize the Mayor to execute, Contract No. C15-09 by and between the City of San Clemente and South Coast Engineering Services, providing for engineering and design services for Water Reclamation Plant Structural Concrete Repairs, and Primary Clarifier Covers and Grating Replacements, Project Nos. 25208 and 25206, respectively, in the amount of \$97,890.

H. <u>Limited Term Building Inspector I/II Position</u>

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER WARD, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, CARRIED 5-0, to:

- 1. Authorize one Limited-Term Building Inspector I/II position for approximately 14 months with the following benefits (in addition to the required payroll-related benefits): vacation at the rate of 80 hours per year, health coverage (medical, dental and vision), and City-observed holidays.
- 2. Authorize an additional appropriation of \$51,000 from the General Fund Unassigned Fund Balance to the 001-422 program for Salary and Benefits.

ITEMS REMOVED FROM THE CONSENT CALENDAR FOR DISCUSSION

E. Fee Waivers - Calle Valle/Los Molinos Utility Undergrounding Project

Following notation that a member of the public requested that this item be removed from the Consent Calendar after Council action was taken, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER BROWN, CARRIED 5-0, to reconsider Council's earlier action on fee waivers for the Calle Valle/Los Molinos utility undergrounding project. (See Page 5 of these minutes for Council's earlier action).

George Gregory, San Clemente, suggested that funding for undergrounding projects would be better spent in multi-family areas of the city, as opposed to the commercial/industrial areas; noted that safety would be enhanced by removing utility poles from sidewalks.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM BAKER, CARRIED 5-0, to approve waiving electrical permit and plan check fees related to the SDG&E Calle Valle/Los Molinos utility undergrounding project.

G. Water Conservation Projects

Water Conservation Analyst Kanzler narrated a PowerPoint presentation that identified water conservation efforts that are currently in place. A hard copy of the presentation is on file in the City Clerk Department.

Council requested that the City Clerk provide a memo that describes the criteria utilized in determining whether an item is agendized under the consent calendar.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM BAKER, SECOND BY MAYOR HAMM, CARRIED 5-0, to approve the turf removal plan for the City of San Clemente Community Development building, Forster Ranch Community Park, Camino de los Mares medians, Marblehead Inland Park, and Vista Hermosa Sports Park and return Mira Costa Park to its original design.

7. PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. General Plan Clarifications and Amendment Initiation

Public Hearing to consider General Plan Clarifications and Amendment Initiation.

City Planner Pechous and Associate Planner Wright narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "General Plan Clarifications and Amendment Initiation" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of the PowerPoint is on file in the City Clerk Department.

MEETING RECESSED

Council recessed at 7:43 p.m., and reconvened at 7:55 p.m., with all members present.

Mayor Hamm opened the Public Hearing.

Alba McKinley, San Clemente, read a letter from John McKinley concerning his property in the Pier Bowl area; opined the MU4 zoning should remain for Coronado Lane; noted that a hotel exists on the property and indicated concern that rezoning the property to high-density residential would render the property non-conforming. A copy of the letter, dated February 2, 2015, is on file in the City Clerk Department.

Nick Buchanan, San Clemente, stated that he purchased an abandoned gas station on South El Camino Real; opined that changing the allowable building height from 45' to 30' would preclude the ability to construct a quality building and urged that the rules not be changed.

<u>Larry Culbertson</u>, San Clemente, suggested that Mixed Use in the T zone will worsen the parking situation and will hinder the goal of enhancing the pedestrian nature of the downtown.

Michael Luna, San Clemente, noted that zoning in the southern portion of El Camino Real currently allows a building height of 33', but staff is proposing a 30' height limitation; opined that a 30' height is insufficient to allow a two-story structure with quality architecture; recommended that Council uphold the recommendations of the General Plan Advisory Committee.

<u>Bob Conrad</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of Mr. Buchanan's proposal for the property at the corner of Esplanade and El Camino Real; urged Council to retain the current height limit due to his belief that it will serve as a catalyst for future area improvements.

Mark McGuire, San Clemente, opined that the FAR for the North Beach self storage site was intended to be .5, noting that a .35 FAR would be below the property's current FAR; opined that the mid-block area on El Camino Real was never proposed to be reduced from a maximum 2.0 FAR to 1.0 FAR; stated that the FAR for the mixed use overlay was not incorporated in the Land Use Map and asserted that Brian Judd, of The Planning Center, indicated that the density/intensity standards for the mixed use overlay would be consistent with the MU3.1 designation.

<u>Shawn Danesh</u>, San Clemente, owner of 1430 South El Camino Real, spoke on the design and financing challenges that would be encountered if Council were to lower the height limit to 30'.

There being no others wishing to speak, Mayor Hamm closed the Public Hearing.

Report from the Public Works Director/City Engineer concerning the possibility of amending the Code of the City of San Clemente to allow utility annual encroachment permits for utility companies when conducting routine work associated with existing utilities in the public right-of-way.

Assistant City Engineer Bonigut reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report; requested that the words "on newly resurfaced streets" be omitted from Section 1 of the Ordinance.

<u>Kristen Camuglia</u>, Cox Communications Government Affairs, urged Council to vote in support of the issuance of annual encroachment permits for utility companies.

<u>Duane Cave</u>, San Diego Gas & Electric, spoke in support of the issuance of annual encroachment permits for utility companies, noting that it will expedite routine projects.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER BROWN, SECOND BY MAYOR HAMM, CARRIED 5-0, to introduce Ordinance No. 1592 entitled AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SECTION 12.20 OF THE SAN CLEMENTE MUNICIPAL CODE TO INCLUDE A NEW SUBSECTION 12.20.025 TO ALLOW ISSUANCE OF UTILITY ANNUAL ENCROACHMENT PERMITS, with the modification that the last sentence of Section 1 be modified to read as follows: "Such authorized work may include, but not be limited to: routine inspection and/or maintenance on existing facilities, modifications to existing facilities provided there is no increase in the size of the facility and/or it is not relocated, pulling cable/wire or work that does not require any roadway or sidewalk excavation, tree/shrub trimming as needed for clearance and access to utility lines, emergency work on existing facilities for service restoration, and small excavations (as defined in the utility annual encroachment permit) on newly resurfaced streets." Strike-out type indicates deleted verbiage.
