Subject: Organics Diversion from the Landfill with Anaerobic Digestion

AB 1826 (Chesbro) was approved by the Governor on September 28, 2014. This law will require businesses to separate their food scraps and yard trimmings for composting or anaerobic digestion. The requirements will be rolled out over several years. The first date for compliance is April 1, 2016 for businesses generating eight cubic yards or more of organic waste per week. The City's waste hauler franchisee, CR&R, will present information on their anaerobic facility and proposal for helping the City to comply with this regulation.

Subject: NPDES Stormwater Regulation Changes and New Monitoring Updates

On February 11, 2015 the Regional Water Quality Control Board amended the Regional MS4 Permit and enrolled the City of San Clemente along with nine other South Orange County Cities and the County. The permit modifies several aspects of the preceding permit. The new permit requires the City to draft a Water Quality Improvement Plan (WQIP) with stakeholder involvement that details the priority pollutants and future efforts for addressing these pollutants in each watershed. It increases monitoring efforts significantly in an attempt to identify focus areas for pollutant load reduction efforts. It made effective monitoring changes to the AB411 bacteria monitoring program along the coast.

On April 7, 2015 the State Water Resources Control Board will consider adoption of Statewide Trash Amendments for Stormwater runoff. These amendments would be enforced through the Regional Water Quality Control Board in the NPDES Stormwater Permit. The new regulation is an approach that prohibits the discharge of trash into surface waters of the State. There are two compliance pathways. The first pathway requires installation, operation and maintenance of approved full capture trash devices in priority land use areas. The second compliance pathway allows for projects and controls aside from just full capture devices but requires demonstration that the approach achieves full capture equivalency. Both pathways are projected to require significant funding in order to obtain compliance. County representatives and the California Stormwater Quality Association (CASQA) will present to the State Board on behalf of the Orange County Cities. A request will be made to change the language in order to reduce compliance costs. The main objection focuses on the high priority land use designation of 10 units per acre residential which encompasses many single family home neighborhoods that are not typically high trash generators. The recommendation is to revise the threshold for high density residential to 15 units per acre or higher. The compliance schedule will be at a minimum 10 years from the effective date of the NPDES permit amendment.
