Council reconvened at 6:01 p.m., with all members present.

#### 1. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

#### A. Certificate of Recognition – Larry Rannals

Mayor Hamm presented a Certificate of Recognition to Larry Rannals, in honor of his service as Community Plans and Liaison Officer at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton.

Wayne Eggleston, San Clemente, thanked Mr. Rannals for his service and presented him with a photograph of Park Semper Fi.

## B. Wellness and Prevention Center San Clemente

<u>Susan Parmalee</u>, Director, Wellness and Prevention Center San Clemente, provided Council with an update of past-year accomplishments of the program and current challenges facing youth, families and the community.

<u>Dr. Ed Taub</u>, Advisor to the Wellness and Prevention Center, spoke on drug use in the community; urged Council to continue to support the Wellness and Prevention Center program.

Michael Halt, San Clemente High School Principal, spoke of the positive impacts the Wellness and Prevention Center has had on the students at San Clemente High School.

## 2. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 1)

## Vista Hermosa Sports Park (Alcohol Sales)

Anthony LaFrano, San Clemente, urged Council to not allow alcohol sales at the Vista Hermosa Sports Park because of safety concerns; displayed statistics from Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) on alcohol consumption and associated impairments. A hard copy of the documents provided by Mr. LaFrano are on file with the City Clerk.

## Potential Closure of Saddleback Hospital San Clemente Campus

<u>Wayne Brown</u>, South Orange County Economic Coalition, commented on the high level of care and cost-effectiveness associated with the out-patient pavilion proposed by Saddleback Memorial; spoke in support of time-sensitive legislation to allow stand-alone emergency rooms.

<u>Pamela Schuler</u>, Dana Point, spoke in opposition to the closure of San Clemente Hospital; spoke on the upcoming Wag-A-Thon, El Presidential Ball and Swallows Day Parade.

<u>Dr. David Deyhimy</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of Saddleback Memorial's proposal for a state-of-the-art ambulatory care campus.

<u>Dr. Lowell Kleinman</u>, San Clemente, noted that a state-of-the-art ambulatory center will provide patients access to many different medical specialists on one campus.

<u>Hugo Folli</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of a state-of-the-art ambulatory center and opined it will serve a larger patient base than the current hospital.

<u>Tony Struthers</u>, San Clemente, stated Saddleback Memorial Care will never lower its standard of care; noted that many medical centers are moving toward outpatient ambulatory centers; reported that while Saddleback Memorial is interested in potential opportunities through legislation, Saddleback will continue to explore an ambulatory center.

<u>Kristy Khachigian</u>, Consultant for Saddleback Memorial and resident of San Clemente, opined that a 24-hour outpatient center will provide a lower cost option for residents in need of medical attention.

<u>Dr. Steve Cullen</u>, San Clemente, opined that an additional medical office on Camino De Los Mares will not be sustainable; asserted that Memorial Care has been disingenuous in its statements to the City and residents.

Roger Jolicoeur, San Clemente, spoke in opposition to the closure of San Clemente Hospital; voiced concerns with the additional time needed to access Mission Hospital in the event of an emergency.

Council requested that an update on San Clemente Hospital be agendized for the City Council meeting of March 17, 2015.

## San Clemente High School Crosswalk to Albertsons

<u>Dan Snyder</u>, San Clemente, urged Council to consider a crosswalk (or other controlled mechanism) at the corner of Avenida Pico and Avenida Presidio to help high school students safely access the Albertsons shopping center.

Staff is to provide Council with an update on this issue.

#### Wellness and Prevention Center

<u>Carie Webb</u>, San Juan Capistrano, spoke in support of the Wellness and Prevention Center at San Clemente High School; urged Council to provide financial support for the program.

## 8. <u>UNFINISHED BUSINESS</u>

## A. <u>Proposed El Camino Real Parking Lot at North Beach</u>

Report from the Public Works Director concerning the proposed parking lot on El Camino Real at North Beach.

Public Works Director Cameron narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Proposed North Beach Parking Lot Visual Impact Analysis"; noted a correction to page 8-A-3 of the Administrative Report, in that the report should have cited a 30" wall height, instead of a 36" wall height; responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of Mr. Cameron's PowerPoint is on file with the City Clerk.

<u>Tyler Johnson</u>, North Beach Community Association, conveyed support for the City-approved parking lot design.

<u>Ricardo Nicol</u>, San Clemente, urged Council to support his alternative plan for the El Camino Real parking lot at North Beach.

<u>Vonne Barnes</u>, San Clemente, narrated a PowerPoint presentation that supported an alternative plan for the North Beach Parking Lot; urged Council to vote in support of the Alternative Plan to protect the El Camino Real view corridor. A hard copy of the PowerPoint is on file with the City Clerk.

<u>Tom Barnes</u>, San Clemente, stated the Coastal Commission preferred the Alternate Plan for the North Beach Parking Lot; urged Council to vote in support of the alternative plan.

Richard Price, representing the Architectural Guild of South Orange County, offered the Guild's services to provide an unbiased view of the design.

<u>Brad Malamud</u>, San Clemente, voiced concern regarding the 3-minute limitation for public speakers to voice their opinions.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER BROWN, SECOND BY MAYOR HAMM, CARRIED 3-2 (MAYOR PRO TEM BAKER AND COUNCILMEMBER WARD VOTING NOE), to direct staff to consider the input provided by the Coastal Commission and to try to address those issues to create an optimal design, remembering that time is of the essence. Ricardo Nicol, Tom Barnes and Vonne Barnes are to be included in the process. Staff is to keep Council informed and ensure that professionals agree with the final design. The design is to be submitted to the Coastal Commission without returning to Council. Issues to be addressed include the following:

- Public Safety (including single versus dual entrances and one-way circulation versus two-way circulation).
- Permeable surfaces
- View Corridor impacts (possibly grading down the lot surface to help preserve views)
- Modifying the white wall to a landscape hedge or other green alternative.

#### **MEETING RECESSED**

Council recessed at 8:37 p.m., and reconvened at 8:50 p.m., with all members present.

# B. <u>Consideration of Opposing Toll Lanes on the 405 Freeway and all</u> New Toll Lanes on Other Orange County Freeways

City Manager Makshanoff reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report.

Following deliberations, MOTION BY MAYOR HAMM, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM BAKER, CARRIED 5-0 to adopt Resolution No. 15-05 entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, OPPOSING IMPLEMENTATION OF TOLL FACILITIES ON THE 405 AND ALL OTHER ORANGE COUNTY FREEWAYS, as amended to include content as follows:

WHEREAS, the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) in association with the State of California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the cities adjacent to the 405 Freeway Corridor between the SR-73 and 605 freeways, has been working on the 405 Freeway Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the State of California continues, despite overwhelming public opposition to toll facilities, to push to implement toll facilities on State freeways by converting existing High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) facilities to HOT facilities requiring the paying of tolls to use previously non-toll facilities; and

WHEREAS, toll facilities only increase vehicle throughput in the Express toll facilities at the expense of vehicle capacity in the general purpose or mixed flow facilities; and

WHEREAS, Orange County is a self help County and Measure M2 was approved in 2006 by 70% of Orange County residents and prohibits use of funds for toll facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Clemente does not support the conversion of existing freeways to toll facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City agrees with OCTA that this is possibly the only chance in decades to improve the 405 corridor between the SR-73 and the 605, and because this is a rare opportunity, the City believes the socially, economically, and politically responsible action is to construct the greatest transportation improvements that best utilize taxpayer funds without requiring motorists to pay tolls to use portions of the improvements constructed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of San Clemente, California, that:

SECTION 1. The City of San Clemente opposes any new toll facilities on Orange County highways.

SECTION 2: The State of California should be obligated to find other funding solutions to improve the level of service on our roads and highways.

SECTION 3: Any proposal to add new toll facilities on Orange County highways should be placed before the entire Orange County electorate for a vote.

SECTION 4: The City of San Clemente supports keeping all current 2+ HOV facilities free.

SECTION 5: The City of San Clemente supports the efforts of Costa Mesa, Fountain Valley, Huntington Beach, Los Alamitos, Seal Beach, Westminster and other Orange County cities in their efforts to stop toll facilities through their cities and supports State legislation to keep our roads free.

SECTION 6: A copy of this Resolution shall be sent to the Orange County Transportation Authority and the State of California Department of Transportation.

SECTION 7: This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage and adoption.
