Summary:

Staff recommends that the Beaches, Parks & Recreation Commission recommend to

the City Council change Marblehead Inland Park to Marblehead Park.

Background:

Park Naming Policy

Attached is the Park Naming policy created in 1987 by the then Parks and Recreation Commission for naming parks and park facilities. The policy defines the procedure for solicitation and provides selection criteria guidance. The policy can be summarized in the following three steps:

Step 1) Solicit names from the community—this was done in the past, so it is not required.

Step 2) Bring names before the Beaches, Parks & Recreation Commission for consideration

Step 3) Recommend the Beaches, Parks & Recreation Commission preferred name to City Council

Discussion:

As staff is replacing signage throughout the City's parks and public spaces, all public signage is being evaluated. Staff is seeking consideration by the Commission of the name Marblehead Inland Park.

Marblehead Inland Park was developed in the 1990's, prior to the completion of the Marblehead Coastal (now Sea Summit) community. At its March 10, 1992 meeting, the then Parks and Recreation Commission recommended the name Marblehead Park for the park being developed in the Marblehead Inland area. The "Inland" was likely included at the time to avoid confusion with the parks in the Marblehead Coastal area which were yet to be named. With the Marblehead Coastal area now known as Sea Summit, and the parks all officially named, this distinction is no longer necessary.

Recommended

Action:

STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT the Beaches, Parks & Recreation Commission recommend to the City Council rename Marblehead Inland Park to Marblehead Park.

Naming of Rancho San Clemente and Marblehead Inland Neighborhood Parks

Summary:

On October 8, 1991, the Parks and Recreation Commission requested community input regarding officially naming Rancho San Clemente and Marblehead Inland Parks as part of the upcoming development process surrounding both the parks. Currently, the parks have received informal names based upon the specific plan ranch areas where they reside. However, these names are not official and therefore are not necessarily the most appropriate names for the parks.

The following is the City adopted Park Naming Policy.

- A. The submittal of recommended park names for consideration to be received in writing, accompanied by a statement summarizing the justification, to the Parks and Recreation Commission.
- В. Parks and Recreation Commission review of the new park name submittals at a scheduled Commission meeting for the purpose establishing a formal Commission recommendation to the City council.
- City Council action on the final decision to name a new park from the full list of C. submittals received from the Parks and Recreation Commission.
- The criteria for park names which may be most appropriate would include but not D. be limited to historical figures, national and/or military heros, living or deceased individuals who made significant contributions to the community, local geographic locations, neighborhoods, prominent landmarks, appropriate Spanish language designations, and/or close by schools.

Staff received press coverage requesting community input with the naming of the parks in the Daily Sun Post on October 11, 1991 and in the San Clemente News on October 24, 1991. Submittals were to be accepted at the Community Center, 100 North Seville, through November 15, 1991. No submittals were received as of the deadline.

The Parks and Recreation Commission, at their December 10, 1991 meeting, decided to ask the master homeowner associations of each specific plan ranch area where the two parks are located for their input. Both the Rancho San Clemente Community Association and Marblehead Community Association responded. In addition, one sub-association (Highland Light Homeowners Association) within the Marblehead Inland ranch area responded. All requested that their parks be named Rancho San Clemente Community Park and The Parks and Recreation Commission reviewed these requests at their March 10, 1992 meeting. The Commission voted 4-1 to approve Rancho San Clemente Park and Marblehead Park as the official names. Commissioner Fernandez dissented. She preferred Marblehead Inland Park being named Vista Hermosa Park since the street Vista Hermosa runs adjacent to the park. The word "community" was left off due to both parks being defined as "neighborhood" parks versus "community" parks within the Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

Recommended

Action:

STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT City Council approve (1) Rancho San Clemente Park and (2) Marblehead Park as the official names for each neighborhood park located within their respective specific plan ranch areas.



 - B. The Parks and Recreation Commission review of the new park name submittals at a scheduled Commission meeting for the purpose of establishing a formal Commission recommendation to the City Council.
 - . C. City Council action on the final decision to name a new park from the full list of submittals received from the Parks and Recreation Commission.
