Council reconvened at 6:14 p.m., with all members present.

Chris Smith, Pastor with Southcoast Church International, gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Hamm led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

A. <u>Holiday Serenade – Our Lady of Fatima Catholic School Student</u> Performance

Students from Our Lady of Fatima Catholic School performed a holiday serenade, under the direction of Marion Smithson.

B. Presentation of Painting to Mayor Hamm

Artist Monte Livingston, of the Living Art Gallery, presented a painting of a dive bell to Mayor Hamm.

C. Election of Mayor and Mayor Pro Tempore

<u>Bill Brough</u>, California Assembly Member, thanked Mayor Hamm for his outstanding service and presented him with an Assembly Resolution.

Mayor Hamm expressed gratitude to Council, staff, his family and the community for their support during his mayoral term; expressed concern with the potential closure of San Clemente Hospital and urged residents to continue to be involved in the community.

City Clerk Baade opened nominations for the office of Mayor.

Councilmember Donchak nominated Councilmember Baker for the office of Mayor. Councilmember Hamm seconded the nomination. There being no further nominations, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER HAMM, CARRIED 5-0, to close nominations and elect Councilmember Baker to the office of Mayor.

Mayor Baker opened nominations for the office of Mayor Pro Tem.

Mayor Baker nominated Councilmember Ward for the office of Mayor Pro Tem. Councilmember Brown seconded the nomination. There being no further nominations, MOTION BY MAYOR BAKER, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER BROWN, CARRIED 5-0, to close nominations and elect Councilmember Ward to the office of Mayor Pro Tem.

2. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 1)

Short -Term Vacation Rentals

<u>Michelle Howe</u>, San Clemente, noted that she owns a short-term vacation rental property; stated she has improved her property and as a result, her neighbors have also improved their properties.

Russ Parks, San Clemente, reported that he owns short and long-term rentals in San Clemente and rents to both local families and families that are vacationing; asserted that he enforces the rules of his leases which include curfews and quiet times.

<u>Eric Olson</u>, San Clemente, reported that his vacation rental is a high-end home and clients are affluent families that bring revenue to the City; explained that he has taken steps to alleviate the occasional problem, which included raising the minimum age of renters from 21 to 25, hiring a trash service, and retaining a rental management company.

<u>Jerry Quinland</u>, San Clemente, noted that he owns a vacation rental and strictly enforces a 9:30 p.m. quiet time; asserted that he has had only positive experiences with his renters.

<u>Judy Minor</u>, San Clemente; explained that she has used her home as a vacation rental for the past 9 months and has not experienced any problems.

<u>Greg Webster</u>, San Clemente, suggested a solution to the issue of vacation rentals is properly managing the properties and enforcing noise and nuisance laws; pointed out that renters provide revenue to the City.

<u>Michelle Alexander</u>, San Clemente, noted that she manages a vacation rental in San Clemente; asserted that the rental property attracts families that bring revenue to the City.

<u>Don Slater</u>, San Clemente, spoke on the benefits of sharing San Clemente with families on vacation.

<u>Bradley Den Dulk</u>, owner of Beachside Vacation Rentals, reported that his business manages over 40 properties in six coastal cities; asserted that renters pay significant rent and will not damage homes or disrupt neighborhoods.

<u>Scott Ostlund</u>, Coto de Caza, stated that he owns a vacation property in San Clemente; suggested that Transient Occupancy Taxes could be used to retain the hospital; opined that property owners and long-term renters on the street of his vacation rental create more problems than his short-term renters; asserted that outlawing vacation rentals by owners will cause unintended consequences.

City Manager Makshanoff reported that the Planning Commission is having a Study Session concerning short term vacation rentals on December 3, 2015 at the Community Development Department.

<u>Saddleback Hospital – San Clemente Campus</u>

<u>Carol Wilson</u>, Dana Point, thanked Councilmembers for their efforts to keep the hospital open and offered her assistance; stated that a Kaiser Hospital was constructed in one year in San Diego.

During the course of discussion, Public Works Director/City Engineer Cameron and Senior Civil Engineer Ilkhanipour responded to Council inquiries relative to the possibility of closing the overpass during the repair period to save \$30,000 to \$40,000 and ensure a cohesive final appearance, versus paying the additional cost so that half of the overpass could remain open during construction.

10. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 2)

Short -Term Vacation Rentals

<u>Tricia Mading</u>, San Clemente, asserted that vacation rentals are incompatible with residential neighborhoods; opined that vacation rentals are detrimental to health, safety and general welfare and strain public safety services.

<u>Jim Laurent</u>, San Clemente, stated that short-term vacation rentals are businesses that generate significant revenue for property owners; identified the negative impacts of short-term rentals on neighborhoods, noting that the best case scenario is having owners reside on site.

<u>Jennifer Massey</u>, San Clemente, explained that she is the owner of a vacation rental; opined that private home rentals are less expensive than hotels and consequently make it possible for more families to vacation at the beach; noted that owners keep their vacation rentals in attractive condition to attract guests.

<u>Patrick Telfor</u>, San Clemente, opined that regulations need to be established for short-term rentals; asserted that business licenses should be reviewed annually and re-issued with satisfactory performance.

North Beach Bulbouts

<u>Don Slater</u>, San Clemente, thanked Council for approving the bulbouts at North Beach; noted that pedestrian safety has improved as a result of the bulbouts due to a decreased rate of vehicle speed.

San Clemente, Chile

<u>Fred Swegles</u>, San Clemente, presented Council with a letter from the Mayor of San Clemente, Chile, and displayed photographs from his recent trip to Chile. Hard copies of the photographs are on file with the City Clerk.
