Councilmember Brown gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilmember Donchak led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

A. San Clemente High School Update

San Clemente High School students Sara Barnes and Brigham Maready narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "San Clemente High School, October 4, 2016" concerning campus activities. A hard copy of the PowerPoint is on file with the City Clerk.

2. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 1)

Marquita Canyon Issues

Mark Mortasini, San Clemente, voiced concern that homeless individuals reside in the Marquita canyon access at Calle Puente and West Marquita; displayed photographs of trash and graffiti in the canyon. A hard copy of Mr. Mortasini's photographs are on file with the City Clerk.

Homeless Shelter

Anthony LaFrano, San Clemente, opined that property near Denny's should not be zoned for possible homeless shelter use, because of its proximity to San Clemente High School; presented an email from Jim Bieber relating to vacation rentals by owner (VRBOs).

Ole Hanson Beach Club Grand Opening/ Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC)

<u>Richard Gardner</u>, Capistrano Beach, congratulated Council and Staff on the grand re-opening of the Ole Hanson Beach Club and commented on his candidacy for MWDOC's district seven seat, which covers San Clemente.

Outlet Mall Signage

Ben Doran, San Clemente, spoke in opposition to the outlet signage due to his belief that they are unnecessary, create visual clutter, block views, and pose safety hazards for motorists; urged that the City soften the impact that the signage at the mall will have on the community.

<u>Jeff Pantakhoff</u>, President of Faire Harbour Homeowners Association, suggested the signage at the outlet mall causes visual blight and that the lighted signage violates the City's dark sky ordinance; opined that current technology negates the need for excessive signage.

<u>Sonia Farnsworth</u>, San Clemente, noted she approves of the Spanish architecture of the outlet mall but suggested that brand signage on buildings is not necessary to attract customers; opined that signage should be limited to one "Outlets" sign and/or freeway directional signage.

Marilyn Ferber, San Clemente, voiced concern with commercial signage at the outlet mall; suggested that signage is not necessary for the mall to be successful.

Legal Fees Rate Structure

<u>Brad Malamud</u>, San Clemente, opined that Council should adopt a most favored nations clause billing rate for future legal work; voiced concern with the City's legal fees and suggested that the City hire in-house litigators to reduce costs.

Robert Thompson, San Clemente, voiced concern that the City's litigation costs are increasing.

City Planner Pechous responded to Council inquiries.

<u>Jake Vollebregt</u>, Director of Regional and Legal Affairs at Moulton Niguel Water District, reported that Moulton Niguel Water District supports the proposed SOCWA voting structure and urged Council to support the changes.

Toll Road Public Forum

Mayor Pro Tem Ward reported that the Transportation Corridor Agency is hosting a meeting on October 5, 2016 at St. Andrew's Church to discuss potential toll road extensions through San Clemente.

Naming of Ole Hanson Beach Club Pool

Councilmember Donchak stated a group of residents has requested that Council agendize the possibility of naming the Ole Hanson Beach Club pool after Evangeline (Van) Rutan, who served as San Clemente's first swim teacher. Council concurred and directed Staff to include in its report a listing of Ms. Rutan's credentials, possible location(s) for the plaque that would be displayed at the Beach Club, and assessment of the precedent-setting potential for such an action.

Ole Hanson Beach Club Grand Re-Opening

Councilmember Brown recognized the Ole Hanson Beach Club grand reopening and noted the pool is not yet open for operation, but is expected to be open for use by the end of the month; explained that the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Commission will discuss the hours of operation for the Ole Hanson Beach Club pool and Vista Hermosa Aquatics facility at its meeting of October 26, 2016.
