Stayin' Alive!

At our council meeting on April 1st the Fire Department didn't stop by to play a prank on us...but our dedicated firefighters and paramedics did drop in to demonstrate how every citizen has the ability to save a life by administering 'Hands Only CPR'.

There are only 2 steps to this life saving technique, FIRST call 9-1-1 or have someone call for you, SECOND administer chest compressions by pushing hard and fast in the center of the chest. The American heart Association recommends administering chest compression to the classic disco song "Stayin Alive" which will help you administer the recommended 100 beats per minute to help someone Stay Alive. By starting Hands Only CPR, you will significantly increase the likelihood of saving a victim.

In order to get the Hands Only CPR out to our staff, we will be placing posters like the one you see here in prominent areas around all of our city facilities. I would encourage all of you to do the same.

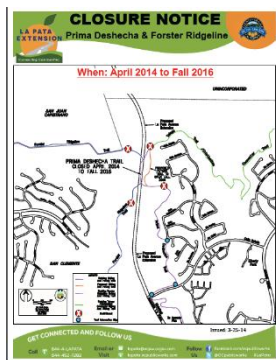
