This contract amendment increases the contract amount from \$40,486 to \$80,486, an increase of \$40,000, and extends the contract terms through April 30, 2017, or until services are no longer needed.

6B(4). Planning Commission Adjourned Regular Meeting Minutes of January 18, 2017

Council referenced Item 8D of the Adjourned Regular Planning Commission meeting minutes of January 18, 2017 relating to Discretionary Sign Permit 16-178, Los Mares 76 Station Master Sign Program (Coury), and questioned if the Applicant is considering LED lighting for the station's signage.

Interim City Planner Gregg noted that a Condition of Approval for the project, which the Applicant has accepted, requires that the Applicant work with Staff relative to various signage options, including LED lighting and other technological advancements, to ensure that the signage does not create adverse impacts; noted that while the City has not yet adopted Dark Skies Guidelines, dark skies are addressed in the Implementation Measures of the General Plan.

Council directed Staff to inform the City Council and the Planning Commission of the solution reached by the City Planner and Applicant for lighting of the 76 Station signage.

G. Amendment to the Measure M2 Seven-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Projects for FY 2016/17 through FY 2022/23

Council provided an update on the SC Ride program, noting that ridership continues to increase; urged residents to use Lyft as an alternative to public bus service; acknowledged the importance of using the full balance of the funds allocated by OCTA for the program.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER SWARTZ, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER HAMM ABSENT), to approve an amendment to the Measure M2 Seven-Year Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2016/17 through 2022/23 to include the Rideshare Services and Summer Trolley projects.

J. FY 2017- FY 2020 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Between the City of San Clemente and the San Clemente City Employees Association (SCCEA)

Human Resources Manager Lowe itemized the provisions of the proposed MOU with the San Clemente City Employees Association.

<u>Matt Squires</u>, President of the San Clemente City Employees Association, thanked Council for its ongoing support of City Staff and for approving the MOU.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER SWARTZ, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER HAMM ABSENT), to:

- 1. Approve the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of San Clemente and the San Clemente City Employees Association.
- 2. Approve all salary, pension offset, holiday changes, vacation buyback, opt-out provisions, and cafeteria benefit changes noted above for the Executive, Mid-Management, and Confidential employee groups.
- 3. Adopt Resolution No. 17-03 entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 14-38, APPROVING EMPLOYER PAID MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS.

In response to Council request, Provisional Recreation Manager Thomas provided an update on San Clemente Day and reviewed the activities planned to commemorate the occasion.

Council requested that Staff reach out to San Clemente's sister cities to include them in San Clemente Day celebrations.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER HAMM ABSENT), to:

- 1. Designate the last Saturday in February of each year as San Clemente Day.
- 2. Direct Staff to develop celebration opportunities.

9. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. 2016 T-Zone Occupancy Count Update

Report from the Community Development Director concerning the 2016 T-Zone Occupancy Count update.

Associate Planner Jones narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "2016 T-Zone Occupancy Count Update" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of Mr. Jones' presentation is on file with the City Clerk.

During the course of discussion, Council requested that Staff 1) evaluate the possibility of expanding the trolley schedule to include Thursdays (i.e., operate Thursday through Sunday); 2) consider the possibility of outsourcing parking enforcement; 3) encourage business owners to ask their patrons to utilize appropriate parking lots; 4) assess the feasibility of expanding the parking radius for employee parking to shared parking lots situated within 900' of the employees' work location (as opposed to the current radius of 500'); 5) consider raising the priority of Recommendation 25G (shuttle system) to the top ten priorities; and 6) invite ride providers. such as Lyft or Uber, to offer suggestions to improve the downtown parking situation (e.g., coupon vouchers, etc.). Additionally, it was noted that some business owners have indicated support for parking meters as a revenue new parking. Staff recommended that owners/landowners submit a petition to the City to help it understand the extent of the support for parking meters.

<u>Don Brown</u>, Planning Commission Chair, noted that the Planning Commission has conditioned recent restaurant projects on El Camino Real on shared parking agreements and that the businesses promote their parking site(s) to their patrons; stressed the importance of forming an internal City parking management team.

Following discussion, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER HAMM ABSENT), to:

- 1. Implement Recommendations 1-7* (as described in the Administrative Report, dated February 7, 2017, which is on file with the City Clerk) at this time.
 - *Note: Recommendation #7 was modified to read as follows: "Consider forming Form an internal City parking management team to create a coordinated parking management effort that includes Planning, Traffic, Maintenance and Sheriff (no additional costs)."
- 2. Investigate and implement Recommendations 8-17 as opportunities present themselves.
- 3. Continue current parking management policy, Recommendations 18-24.
- 4. Recommendations 1-24 plus 25G (relating to the trolley) and 25H (relating to ride-sharing services) are to be considered as a comprehensive work plan for the new internal City parking management team. The team's work plan is to be organized in a way that is focused on results and measurability, and the team is to report back to Council in six months relative to progress made in solving the downtown parking situation.
- 5. Initiate comprehensive parking and circulation strategy, Recommendation 25, after the higher priority Implementation Measures in process are complete (e.g., Zoning Ordinance Update/Specific Plan update, Local Coastal Plan, etc).

B. 2016 North Beach Parking Study

Report from the Community Development Director concerning the 2016 North Beach Parking Study.

Associate Planner Jones narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "2016 North Beach Parking Study" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of Mr. Jones' presentation is on file with the City Clerk.

During the course of discussion, Council provided direction as follows: 1) That Staff establish the framework for in-lieu parking fees for Council consideration as part of the comprehensive parking and circulation strategy (Recommendation 9); 2) That future studies consider Pico Park as a parking

resource, especially during evening hours; 3) That the Internal City parking management team work with City staff to ensure that parking enforcement occurs in North Beach and the surrounding area; and 4) That the Internal City parking management team work with City staff to ensure that continuous sidewalks on Buena Vista and Boca de la Playa remain unobstructed by enforcing the prohibition of parking over continuous sidewalk areas.

<u>Don Brown</u>, Planning Commission Chair, spoke in support of tasking the newly developed Internal City parking management team with the oversight of North Beach parking issues.

MOTION BY MAYOR WARD, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER HAMM ABSENT), to:

- 1. Implement Recommendations 1-2 (as described in the Administrative Report, dated February 7, 2017, and on file with the City Clerk) at this time.
- 2. Investigate and implement Recommendations 3-4 as opportunities present themselves.
- 3. Continue current parking management policy in North Beach, Recommendations 5-8.
- 4. Initiate comprehensive parking and circulation strategy, Recommendation 9, after the higher priority Implementation Measures in process are complete (e.g. Zoning Ordinance Update/Specific Plan Update, Local Coastal Plan, etc.).
- 5. Direct that the foregoing actions be overseen by the Internal City parking management team and that the team look at parking enforcement for continuous sidewalks in North Beach proper.

10. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 2)

<u>Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD) – Health and Safety Concerns in Schools</u>

<u>Dawn Urbanek</u>, San Clemente, voiced concern that the Capistrano Unified School District Board does not plan to abate asbestos in schools for twenty years; related concerns with school crowding; stated that the CUSD board has authorized \$120 million in pay increases instead of addressing health and safety issues.

Parking on El Levante (Item 6-F on the Consent Calendar)

<u>Starr Bales</u>, San Clemente, related concerns that the sober living home on El Levante generates significant on-street parking on El Levante; urged Council to authorize the installation of red striping on El Levante.

Council informed Ms. Bales that parking restrictions on El Levante were approved as part of the Consent Calendar that was considered earlier in this meeting (Item 6-F).

Ann Barr, San Clemente, thanked Council for approving parking prohibitions on El Levante and specifically thanked Jane Mrotek, in Engineering, for her time and effort in preserving the parking space in front of her home.
