It is widely known that a growing traffic congestion problem exists in South County and we are in dire need of a solution. This problem will only worsen, primarily based on projected population, housing, and job growth over the next 20 years.

I want to assure you of my core principles in assessing solutions for traffic relief in our communities:

- 1. I will not support a project that disrupts and divides neighborhoods by taking homes.
- 2. I will not support a project that adversely impacts schools in our communities.
- 3. I <u>will not support</u> a project that does not measurably improve regional mobility, public safety, and traffic relief on I-5.
- 4. I <u>will</u> continue to insist on a transparent and inclusive public engagement process as Caltrans and Transportation Corridor Agencies explore traffic relief options, and if at any time you feel it is not, I will work diligently to take corrective action.

I encourage you to continue to provide South County mobility solutions to my office. This collaboration will enable us to work towards developing a balanced solution to reduce traffic congestion on the I-5 freeway in South County while maintaining our quality of life.

I can assure you that in light of the many calls and emails I have received, I have called on Transportation Corridor Agencies to exhaust every opportunity possible to allow for public engagement and meaningful evaluation of public input throughout the entire process.
