Letter from the City Manager

With the summer season on the horizon, it's a good time for a refresher on beach safety. For this reason, the City of San Clemente will recognize National Beach Safety and Rip Current Awareness Week from June 5th through 12th. I encourage everyone to get involved and take part in some activities the city has planned.

San Clemente is host to some of the nicest weather, beaches, and surf found anywhere in the world. Though it's fun and exciting, the ocean can also be dangerous. Last year San Clemente lifeguards rescued over 2,300 swimmers in distress from our waters. Lifeguards estimate that 80 to 90% of these rescues were swimmers caught in rip currents.

San Clemente Lifeguards will be offering free, one-hour Ocean Safety Clinics where you will learn about ocean safety and have an opportunity to get into the water with a lifeguard - learning how to negotiate waves and get out of rip currents. This is open to the public on the second and fourth Saturdays in June and July (June 11 and 25, and July 9 and 23). The clinics will be conducted at Marine Safety Headquarters from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. If you are new to town or just want to learn more about how to keep your family or yourself safe at the beach, this is a great opportunity.

If you can't attend the above events, follow these tips to stay safe at the beach:

- Learn to swim
- Swim near a lifequard
- Never swim alone
- Check with the lifeguards before going into the water
- Learn rip current safety
- Obey posted signs and flags
- Use sunscreen

I encourage beachgoers to always contact a lifeguard before going in the ocean. The lifeguards will have the best information about the surf size, ocean conditions, and any hazards that may not be apparent. It is our goal to ensure you have a safe and enjoyable summer!

Joint The City For A Special Presentation-Return of the Big Marine Predators to California Waters

The City of San Clemente and the San Clemente Lifeguard Association will host Dr. Chris Lowe who will provide a free lecture on the Return of the Big Marine Predators to California Waters. Dr. Lowe is a professor in marine biology and director of the Shark Lab at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB). The lecture will be held at City Hall in the Council Chambers located at 100 Avenida Presidio in San Clemente on Thursday, June 16, 2016 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Doors open at 6:30 p.m.

The Shark Lab is one of the largest acoustic telemetry labs on the west coast. At CSULB Dr. Lowe and his students work with acoustic and satellite telemetry techniques to study the movement, behavior, and physiology of sharks. They have been studying the baby great white sharks of Southern California for 10 years. To learn more about the CSULB Shark Lab, visit their website here.

Construction Alert!

Beginning Friday, June 10, 2016 crews are scheduled to perform back-to- back weekend closures of the Camino de Estrella on-ramps to the northbound I-5 in order to complete paving activities necessary to proceed to the next stage of construction.

These extended closures will allow crews to demolish portions of the existing pavement on the ramps and immediately repave them. The reconfigured ramps will accommodate the new lanes being added on the I- 5 freeway.
