# REGULAR CITY COUNCIL BUSINESS MEETING CONVENED

The Regular Council Meeting of September 19, 2017 convened at 6:08 p.m., with all members present, except Councilmember Swartz, who was absent.

# **INVOCATION**

Jim Davis, Sr. Chaplain, Orange County Sheriff's Department, gave the invocation.

# PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ward led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### 1. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

### A. Toll Road Update

City Attorney Smith reported that since Council's last meeting, the City participated in a mandatory settlement conference, explaining that the City presented its demands in opposition to the toll road extension through San Clemente; noted that the case is being prosecuted and that efforts are underway to have the case moved to Los Angeles County; noted that the Orange County Superior Court, where the case was first filed, has categorized the case as complex.

Councilmember Donchak invited the public to participate in a Toll Road Trek on September 23, 2017, noting that it is an educational tool to celebrate the beauty of San Clemente and to explain potential toll road alignments; explained that Joel Robinson, Naturalist, will participate in the event.

# 2. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 1)

### **Pier Pride Month**

Mikii Rathmann, San Clemente business owner and member of the Pier Pride organization, explained that the purpose of Pier Pride is to raise money to facilitate improvements to the municipal pier; identified Pier Pride events scheduled for October 2017, and requested that the City proclaim October 2017 as Pier Pride Month.

### San Clemente Hospital

<u>Dr. Steve Cullen</u>, San Clemente, voiced concern with an article by Peter Bastone, of the Voice of OC, that asserted that the City Council forced the closure of San Clemente Hospital; reviewed the history of the San Clemente Hospital closure issue, noting that Council tried to save the hospital and provide citizens with access to emergency care.

## Dog Beach

<u>Mike Majors</u>, San Clemente, requested that segments of the beach be designated for dog access during specified times; asserted that the majority of dog owners are responsible.

# Property Line Markers and Speed Bumps on Avenida Presidio

Lyn Stanley, San Clemente, voiced concern that her neighbor's fence/wall is encroaching onto her property because it was not possible to determine the exact property line due to the lack of property markers; requested that Council take steps to install property line markers on sidewalks; urged that speed bumps be installed on Avenida Presidio to calm traffic.

- 2. Direct that the Beaches, Parks, and Recreation Commission consider the types of public parks that are suitable for the subject property and recommend an appropriate update to the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

# F. <u>Contract Amendment – Temporary Staff Augmentation (Sagecrest Planning + Environmental)</u>

<u>Larry Culbertson</u>, speaking on behalf of the San Clemente Historical Society, urged that the temporary staff that is retained include one Planner who is trained in historic preservation.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER HAMM, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER SWARTZ ABSENT), to:

- Approve a budget transfer in the amount of \$60,000 from Account 001-433-41010-000-00000 (Salaries, Full Time) to Account 001-431-43890-000-00000 (Contractual Services).
- Approve, and authorize the Mayor to execute, Amendment No. 1 to Contract No. 17-17, by and between the City of San Clemente and Sagecrest Planning + Environmental, providing for temporary part-time planning services through June 30, 2018 or until services are deemed no longer necessary. This Amendment increases the contract amount from \$45,000 to \$70,000, an increase of \$25,000.

# 7. PUBLIC HEARINGS

# A. Complementary Paratransit Services as Part of the San Clemente Trolley

Public Hearing to consider a complementary service plan associated with the City of San Clemente's fixed route transit service in conjunction with the San Clemente Trolley funded through the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) and Project V. The complementary paratransit services are for individuals whose disabilities make them unable to use the fixed route.

Public Works Director/City Engineer Bonigut reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report; noted that Council recently received an email from a citizen who was concerned that the trolley lifts may only be able to accommodate wheelchairs, and not other mobility devices, such as the scooter that she utilizes; noted that the issue has been resolved and the citizen indicated that she was successful in using the trolley this past weekend with her scooter.

Mayor Ward opened and closed the Public Hearing, there being no others desiring to speak to this issue.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER HAMM, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER SWARTZ ABSENT), to adopt a Complementary Paratransit Plan as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) 2017 Project V Grant for fixed-route local transit service (the San Clemente Trolley).

# B. <u>Miramar Events Center and Restaurants - Historic Property</u> <u>Preservation and Parking Waiver/Incentive Agreement 17-248 (1700 North El Camino Real)</u>

Continued Public Hearing to consider a request for a Historic Property Preservation and Parking Waiver/Incentive Agreement (HPPPWIA) for the rehabilitation and adaptive reuse of the historic Miramar Theater into a performing arts and event center, and the historic bowling alley into a culinary eatery, in return for a 92 parking space waiver and parking mitigation agreement. The site is located at 1700 North El Camino Real, in the Mixed Use Zoning districts and the Architectural, Coastal Zone and Central Business District Overlays (MU1-A-CZ-CBD).

Council noted that the Public Hearing on this item will be continued to the Council meeting of October 17, 2017.

Mayor Ward opened the Public Hearing.

<u>Larry Culbertson</u>, speaking on behalf of the San Clemente Historical Society, spoke on the importance of incentivizing historic preservation; complimented the proposed project, noting that the traffic study indicates that a problem will not be encountered; urged Council to approve the project.

George Gregory, San Clemente, spoke in opposition to giving parking spaces to the owners of the Miramar Theatre, while the project increases parking demand; opined that the project is too big and patrons will park on neighboring streets.

Gayle Higgins, San Clemente, stated that her home overlooks the Miramar Theatre, noting that she has never seen the beach parking lot near the Miramar to be full, even during holidays; urged Council to waive the parking requirement and approve the project.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM BROWN, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER SWARTZ ABSENT), to continue the Public Hearing to the Council meeting of October 17, 2017.

Report from the Public Works Director/City Engineer concerning the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 and amendment to the Fiscal Year 2018 Capital Improvement Program.

Public Works Director/City Engineer Bonigut reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report.

<u>Derek Cahill</u>, San Clemente, questioned and received clarification that the subject gas tax funds can only be used for road maintenance and rehabilitation, and not for beach sand issues.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER DONCHAK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER HAMM, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER SWARTZ ABSENT), to:

- Direct staff to create a new Fund Number 011 titled "Gas Tax Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA)" or take similar actions to appropriately receive, segregate and track anticipated future State Gas Tax RMRA revenue and expenditures.
- 2. Accept anticipated Fiscal Year 2018 Gas Tax RMRA revenue of about \$374,000 into the new Gas Tax RMRA Fund, Account 011-000-33535.
- 3. Accept anticipated Fiscal Year 2018 Gas Tax Loan Repayment revenue of about \$76,000 into the existing Gas Tax 012 Fund.
- 4. ## LED Lights (Marblehead Coastal)

<u>Derek Cahill,</u> San Clemente, stated that he lives in Marblehead Inland and his view overlooks the outlet mall; voiced concern that lighting within Marblehead Coastal contains a wide array of colors, which creates light pollution.

### **Development Management Team**

<u>Larry Culbertson</u>, San Clemente Historical Society, voiced concern that the City's Development Management Team (DMT) meetings are not publicly noticed; noted that a project for a vacant lot between two historically significant properties on La Cuesta was considered at a DMT meeting, but noticing was not provided to the public or abutting property owners.

Councilmember Donchak recused herself from discussions because Mr. Culbertson mentioned her property in his comments; left the Chambers at 7:10 p.m.

In response to Council inquiry, Staff explained that State law does not require DMT meetings, which consist of City staff, to be publicly noticed; noted that Council could request that DMT meetings be noticed, if desired; explained that the purpose of DMT meetings is to determine whether a development application is complete.

Council requested that Staff provide a white paper describing the composition, purpose, function, and meeting frequency of the DMT.

Councilmember Donchak returned to the dais at 7:11 p.m.

# <u>Presentations at Council Meeting concerning Extension of HOV Lane</u> on the I-5 and the El Camino Real Overpass Realignment

Council requested that the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) be requested to give a presentation at a future Council meeting concerning the status of the Project Study Report to extend the I-5 HOV lane from Avenida Pico to the San Diego County line. Council specifically requested that the presentation address alternatives that the OCTA is considering, traffic counts, traffic projections, timing, potential property takings, and how the subject portion of the freeway fits into the long-range transportation plan. Additionally, Council requested a presentation concerning the El Camino Real overpass realignment by either the OCTA and/or CalTrans, as appropriate.

# <u>First Responder Night (Hosted by San Clemente High School Football Team)</u>

Councilmember Hamm reported that he attended First Responder Night, which was hosted by the San Clemente High School football team; stated that the event was successful and well attended.

# **Downtown Business Association**

Councilmember Hamm, Council's representative to the Downtown Business Association (DBA), reported that the Association is considering opportunities to expand its events and improve their cost efficiency.

# Bob Hayden's 100th Birthday Celebration

Councilmember Donchak reported that Bob Hayden celebrated his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday last week; conveyed that Mr. Hayden expressed appreciation to the Mayor for issuing a commendation in honor of his birthday.
