#### Staff Recommendation

Approve, and authorize the Mayor to execute, Amendment No. 2 to Contract AC-706, by and between the City of San Clemente and TranSystems Inc., providing for ADA design services for the rehabilitation of the Marine Safety Building. This Amendment increases the contract amount from \$66,400 to \$86,100 (an increase of \$19,700), expands the scope of services of the contract, and extends the contract term to June 30, 2019.

#### PRESENTATION OF WRITTEN MATERIALS TO COUNCIL

#### MEETINGS RECORDED AND TELEVISED

City Council meetings are broadcast live and are replayed periodically on Cox Communications Local Access Channel 30 (or Channel 854 for high-definition televisions). Meetings are also recorded via audio CD and DVD and retained as a City record in accordance with the City's records retention schedule.

#### **USE OF ELECTRONIC VISUAL AIDS BY PUBLIC AT MEETINGS**
