REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING CONVENED

The Regular Business Meeting of February 20, 2018 convened at 6:00 p.m., with all members present, except Councilmember Swartz and Mayor Pro Tem Hamm.

Pastor Roger Gales, Heritage Christian Fellowship, gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Brown led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

A Presentations by Representatives of Legislators in Honor of the City of San Clemente's 90th Birthday

Representatives for Senator Pat Bates, Assemblyman Bill Brough, and Supervisor Lisa Bartlett, presented the City with resolutions in recognition of the City of San Clemente's 90th birthday.

B. Toll Road Update

Councilmember Ward narrated a PowerPoint entitled "South OC Mobility New Idea for Consideration", dated February 8, 2018, that was presented at the last meeting of the Transportation Corridor Agency. A hard copy of the subject PowerPoint is on file with the City Clerk.

C. <u>Presentation by Carni Campbell and Trey Russell Concerning Campus</u> <u>Activities at San Clemente High School</u>

D. Presentation of Certificate of Recognition to Vinnie Poncino, Golf Pro

Mayor Brown presented a Certificate of Recognition to Vinnie Poncino, Golf Pro, in honor of qualifying to play in the 2018 Genesis Open at the Riviera Country Club in Los Angeles on February 15-18, 2018.

E. <u>Presentation of Certificate of Recognition to Gary Voborsky, Assistant Engineer</u>

Mayor Brown presented a Certificate of Recognition to Gary Voborsky, Assistant Engineer, in honor of being named the 2017 recipient of the City's Core Values Award.

F. <u>Presentation of Certificate of Recognition to Glen Goldring, Facilities</u> <u>Maintenance Coordinator</u>

Mayor Brown presented a Certificate of Recognition to Glen Goldring, Facilities Maintenance Coordinator, in honor of being named the City of San Clemente's 2017 Employee of the Year.

2. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (PART 1)

Ridge Route Trail Improvements

<u>Chloe Kamp</u>, Co-President of the Community Problem Solvers Club at San Clemente High School, narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Ridge Route Trail Improvements", which focused on the fire dangers posed by smoking and unauthorized motor vehicles on the trail. A hard copy of the subject PowerPoint is on file with the City Clerk.

<u>Esther Mafouta</u>, member of the Community Problem Solvers Club at San Clemente High School, urged the installation of "No Smoking" and "Nature is Not Your Ashtray" signage on the trail.

Nick Petrocelli, member of the Community Problem Solvers Club at San Clemente High School, requested that temporary signage, flyers, and weekly Police patrol, be utilized to discourage unauthorized motor vehicles (such as motorcycles) from using the trail.

Sophia Mains, member of the Community Problem Solvers Club at San Clemente High School, proposed that a "Caution Sharp Turn" warning be painted on the pavement before the blind curve on the trail to prevent collisions between pedestrians, bikers, and vehicles; recommended that new trail entry signs be installed.

San Clemente High School Jazz Band Concert

Olivia French, manager of the San Clemente High School Jazz Band, urged that the annual jazz concert at the pier be continued; commented on the 18-year tradition of the event and its value to the musicians and community at large.

<u>Jack Boatman</u>, San Clemente High School Jazz Band, urged that the City continue to host the jazz concert at the pier because the pier is the epicenter of the City and it accommodates maximum attendance.

<u>Foster Poling</u>, San Clemente High School Jazz Band, noted that the annual pier concert is the biggest event for the San Clemente High School Jazz Band, as well as the Shorecliffs Middle School Jazz Band that also performs at the concert; noted that the concerts inspire future musicians.

Assistant City Manager Sund stressed that the San Clemente Jazz Concert is not being cancelled; explained that Staff is assessing the possibility of relocating the event to North Beach as a joint event with the Farmers Market; commented that the proposal could entail the San Clemente High School Jazz Band performing on the beach with smaller ensembles performing at the Farmers Market as part of a "Triton Night" event.

Outlets at San Clemente Signage

Bob Baker. San Clemente, urged that the City not allow signage at the Outlets to exceed the signage allowed by the City's Sign Code; objected to excessive commercial signs.

Richard Boyer, San Clemente, opined that signage at the Outlets should be limited to that allowed by the Sign Code.

<u>Pete van Nuys</u>, San Clemente, stated that traditional malls are closing and no amount of signage will save the Outlets, adding that success of the Outlets is dependent on tenant creativity and the originality of Craig Realty Group; urged that Council not sacrifice San Clemente's uniqueness.

<u>Karen Ahola</u>. San Clemente, urged Council to uphold San Clemente's standards and protect San Clemente's quality of life when it considers the Outlet signage issue on March 6, 2018; recommended that Council limit signage to the amount permitted by the City's Sign Code.

<u>Kathy Armenteros</u>, San Clemente, stated that she formerly enjoyed dark skies from her home in Marblehead, but now has her sleep disturbed by illuminated signage at the Outlets.

(1) <u>Update on Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA)</u> Items. (Councilmember Donchak)

Councilmember Donchak thanked citizens for their patience during construction of the La Pata extension and I-5 widening and advised that a ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held in March 2018 to celebrate the conclusion of the I-5 three-phase Measure M project; reported on the OCTA Board meeting of February 2, 2018, focusing on the 2018 Project V Community Based Transit Circulators Program Call for Projects of \$12 million (which represents an opportunity to improve/enhance the City's trolley program), and the Long Range Transportation Plan 2040 as it relates to 1) HOV lane extension from Avenida Pico to the San Diego County line, and 2) SR-241 connector with the 91 express lanes.
