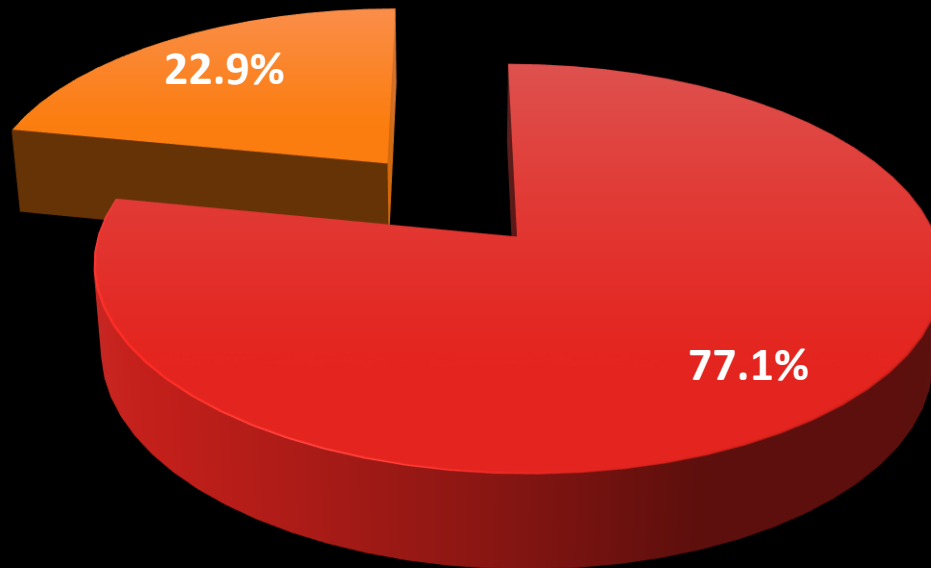

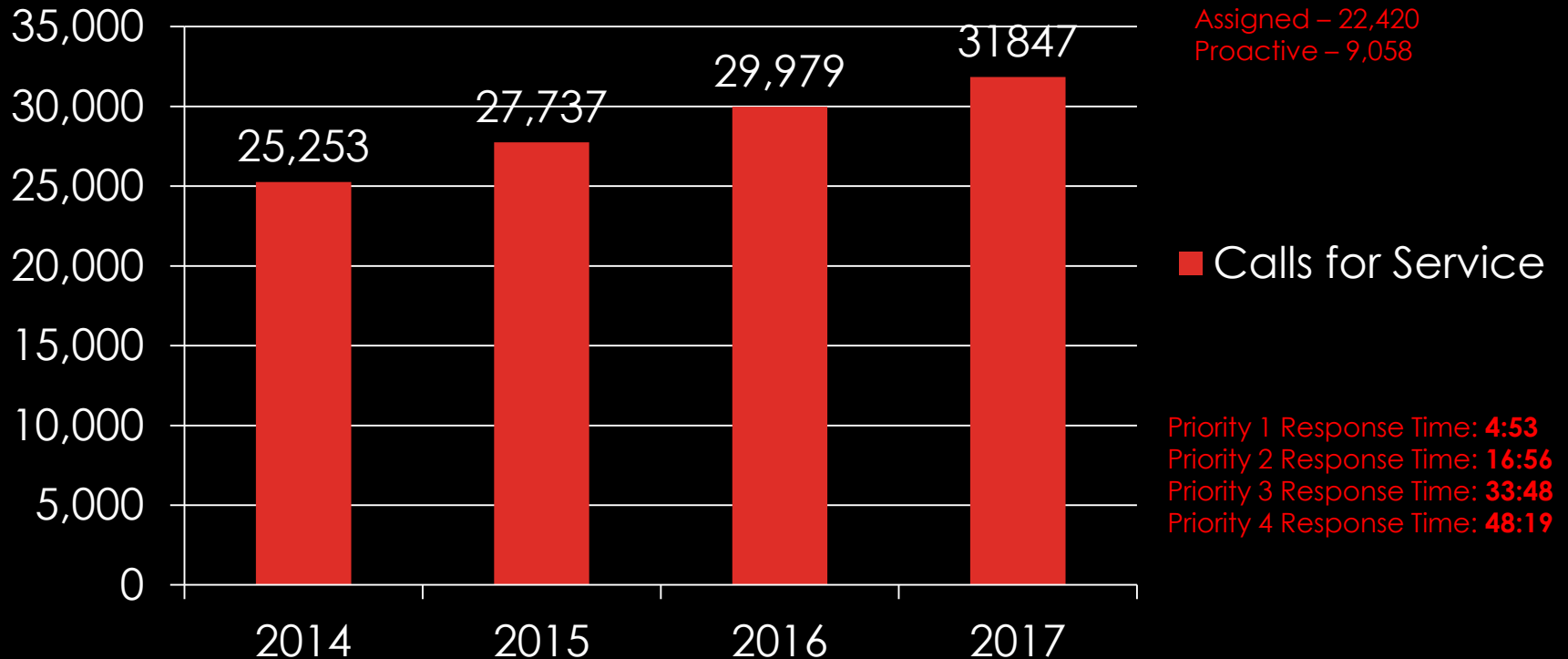

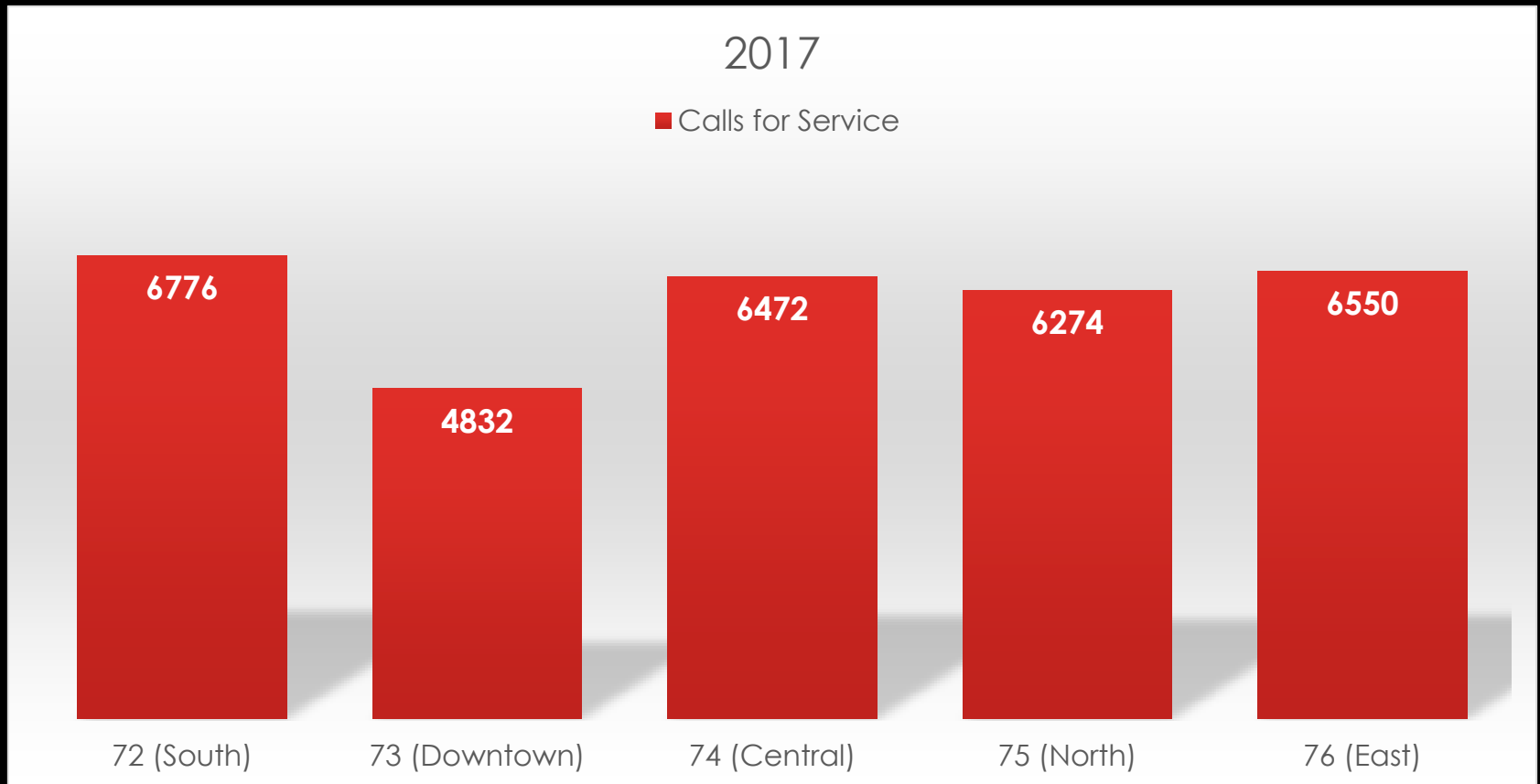


CALLS FOR SERVICE

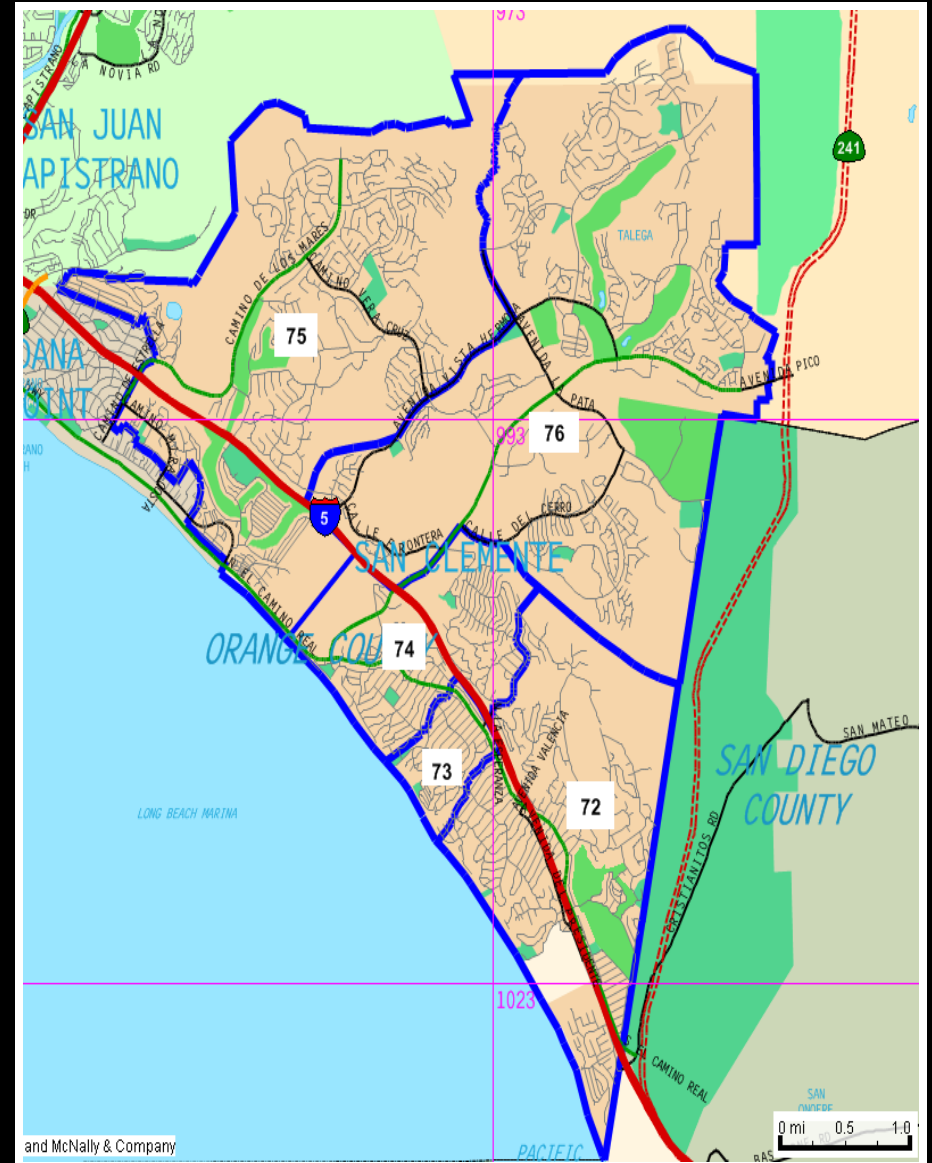
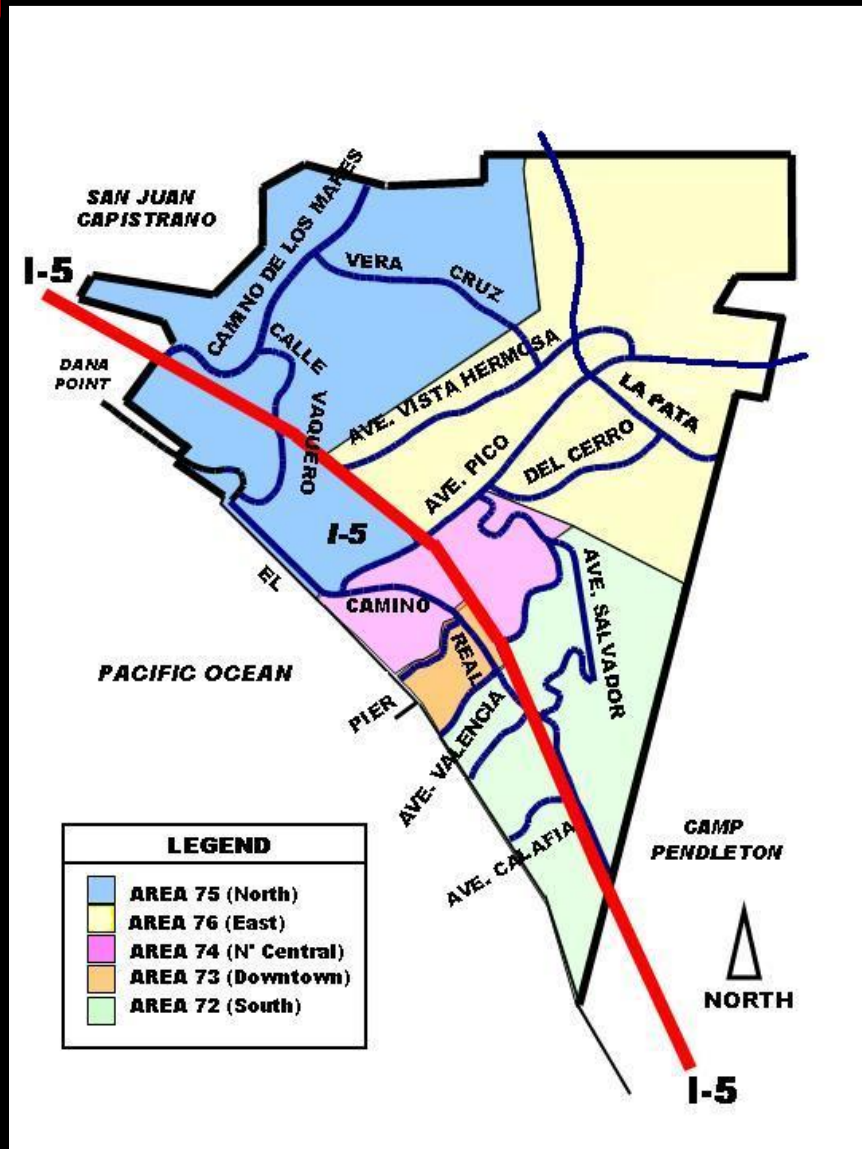
Volume of Calls



DISTRIBUTION OF CALLS ~ PATROL AREAS

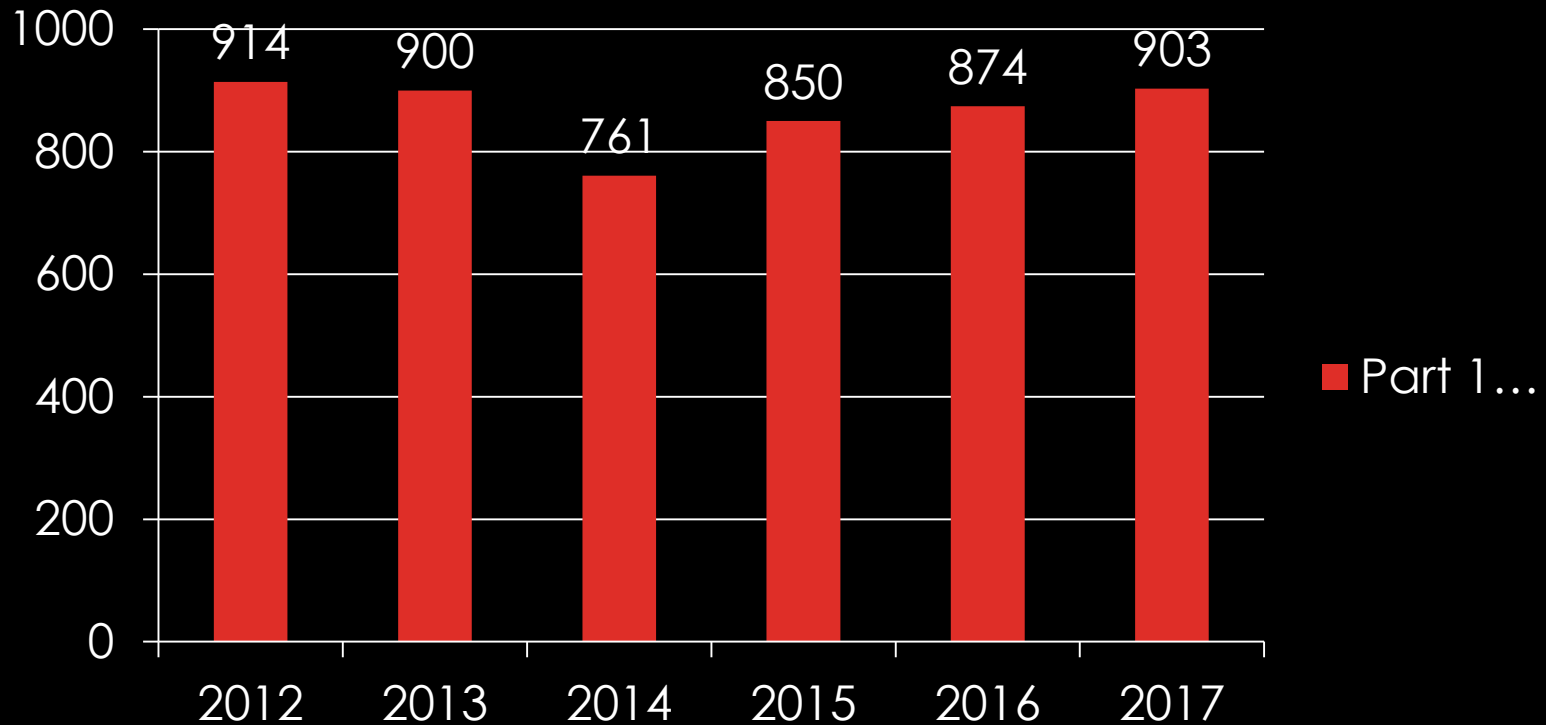

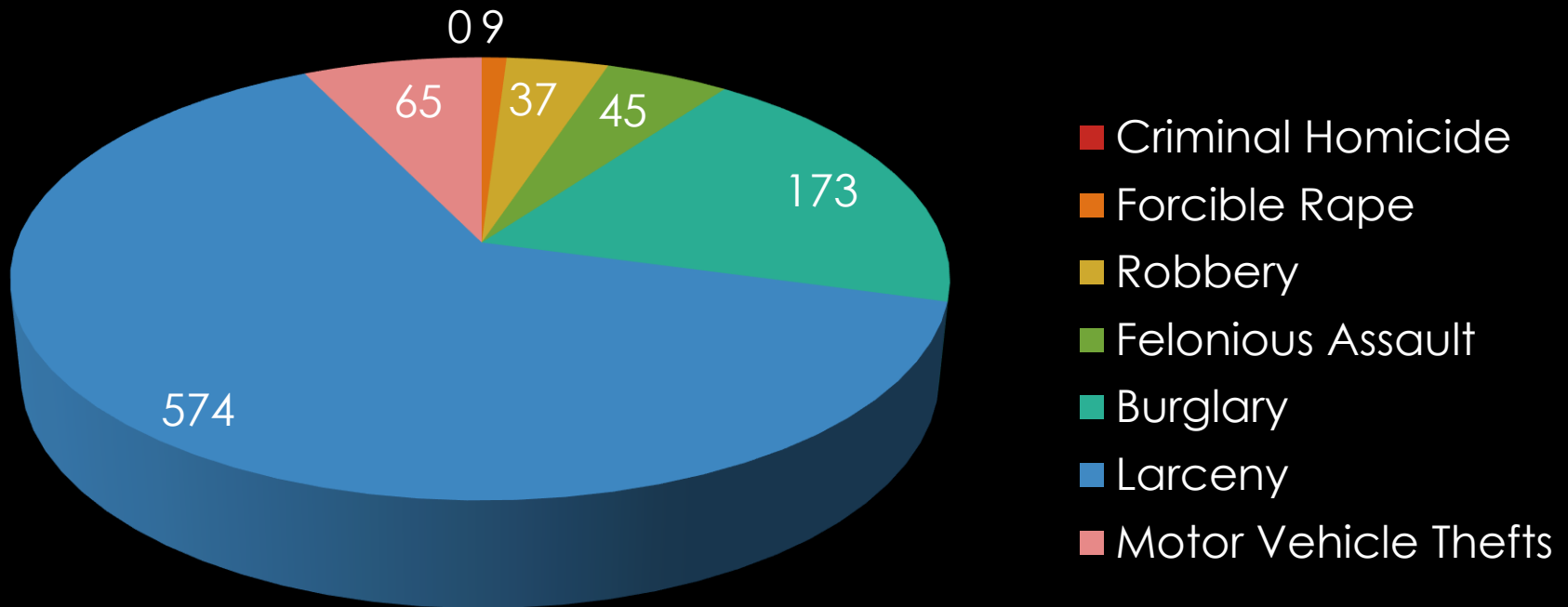

PART 1 CRIMES FOR 2017

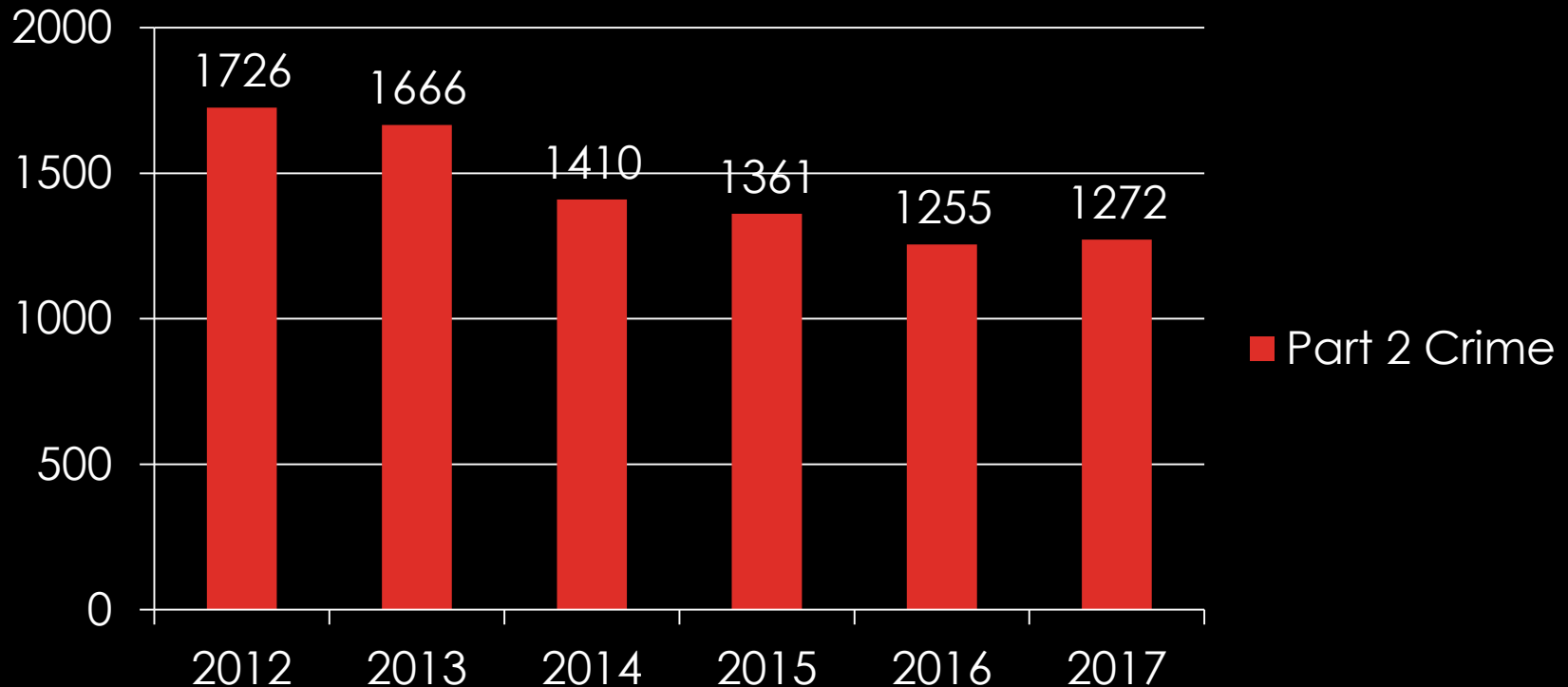

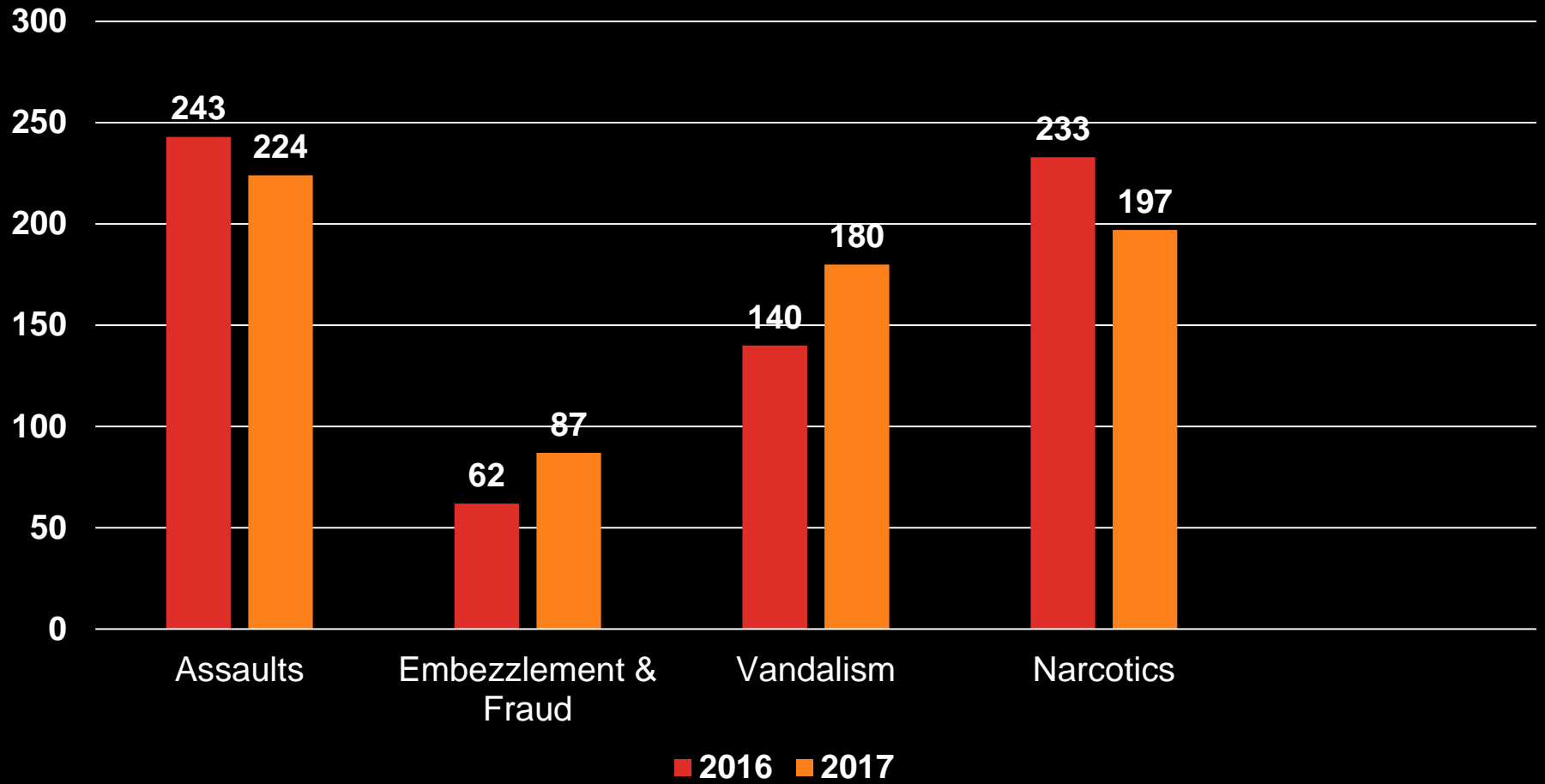

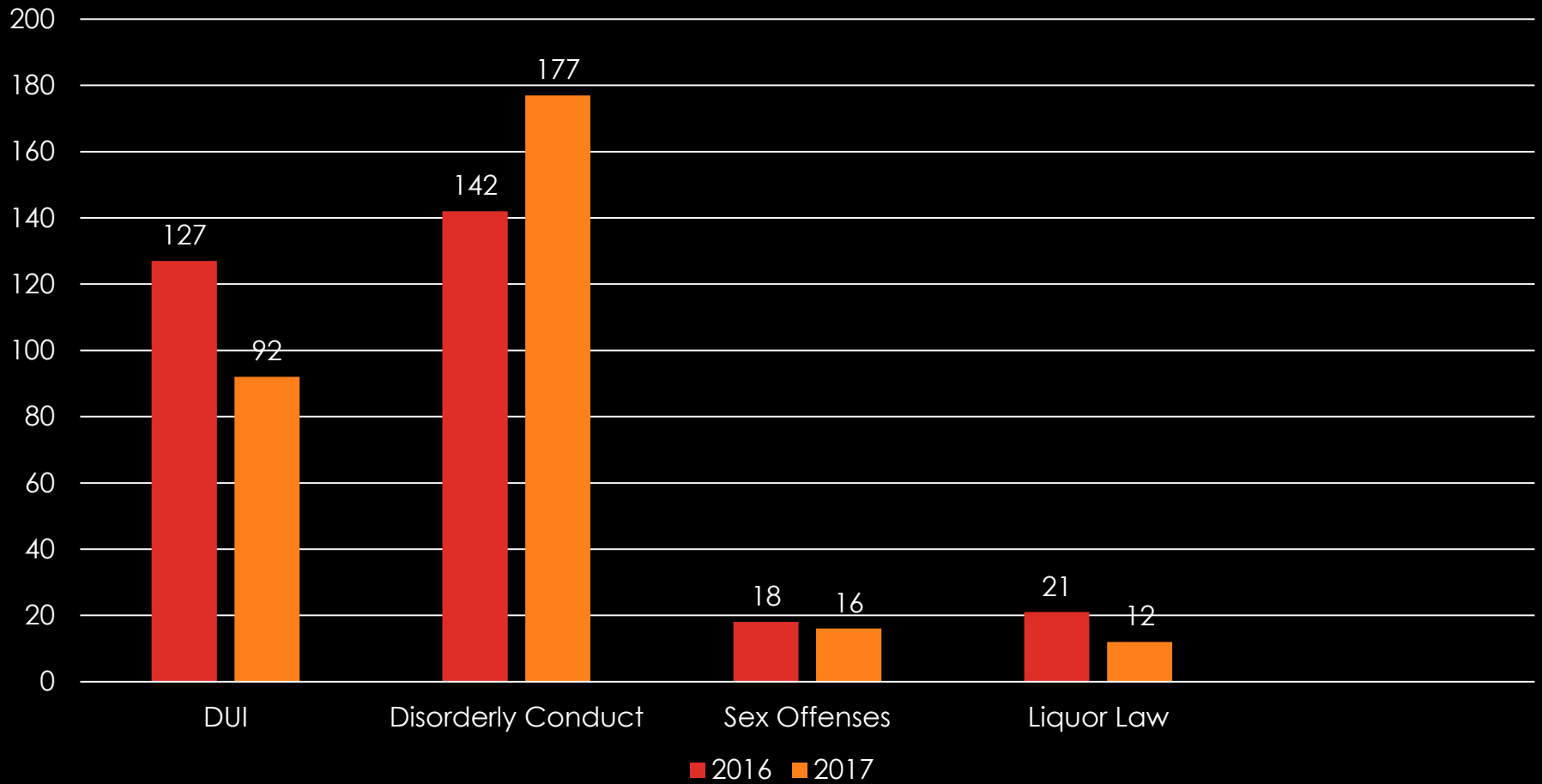

TALKING POINTS

- Of the total criminal incidents, 66 were violent crimes (664-187, 211, 245) 6% of total crimes. Comparison: 2016 had 27
- Residential burglaries: 98 (same as 2016). 28% of the residences had unlocked garages, doors or windows
- Vehicle Burglaries increased by approximately 54 more crimes than 2016. From 43 (2016) to 97 (2017)

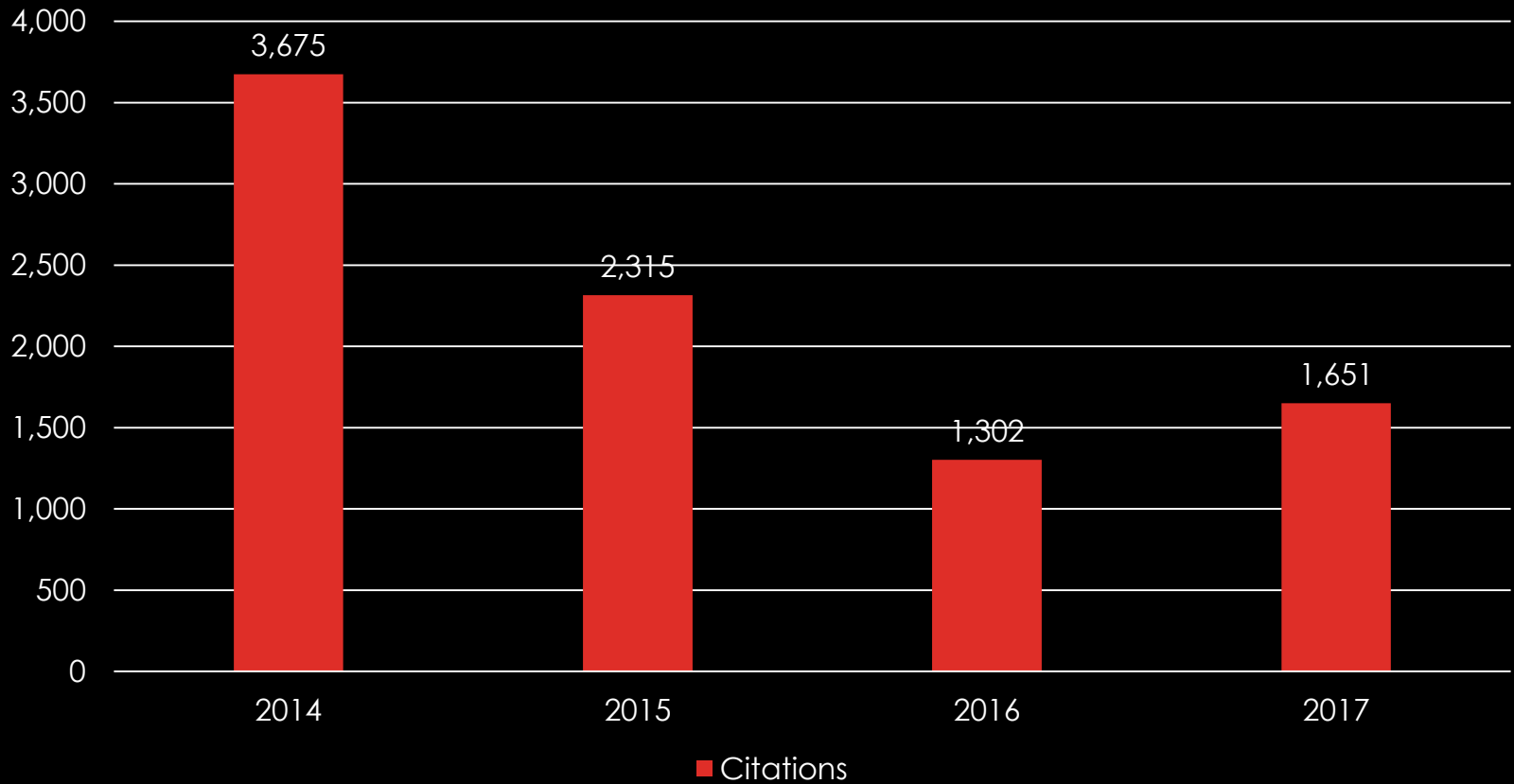

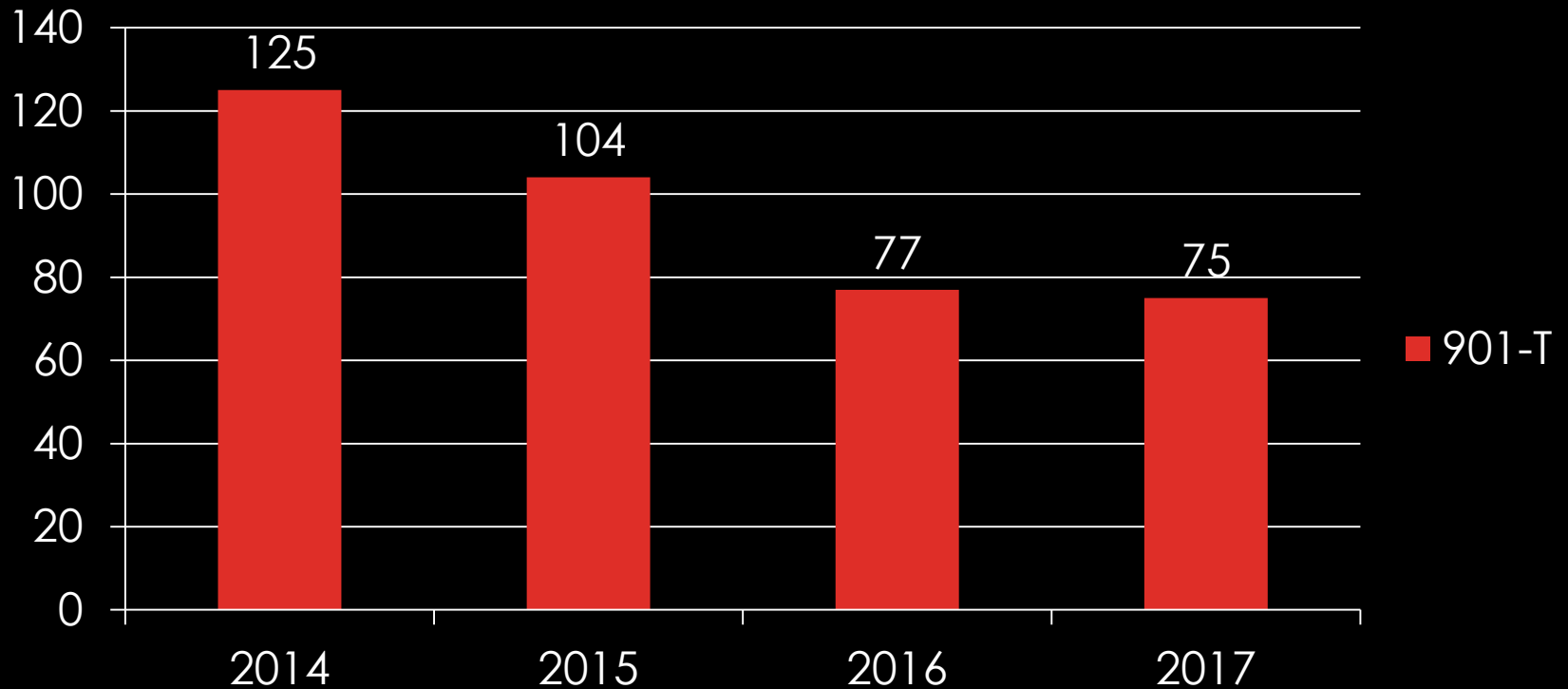

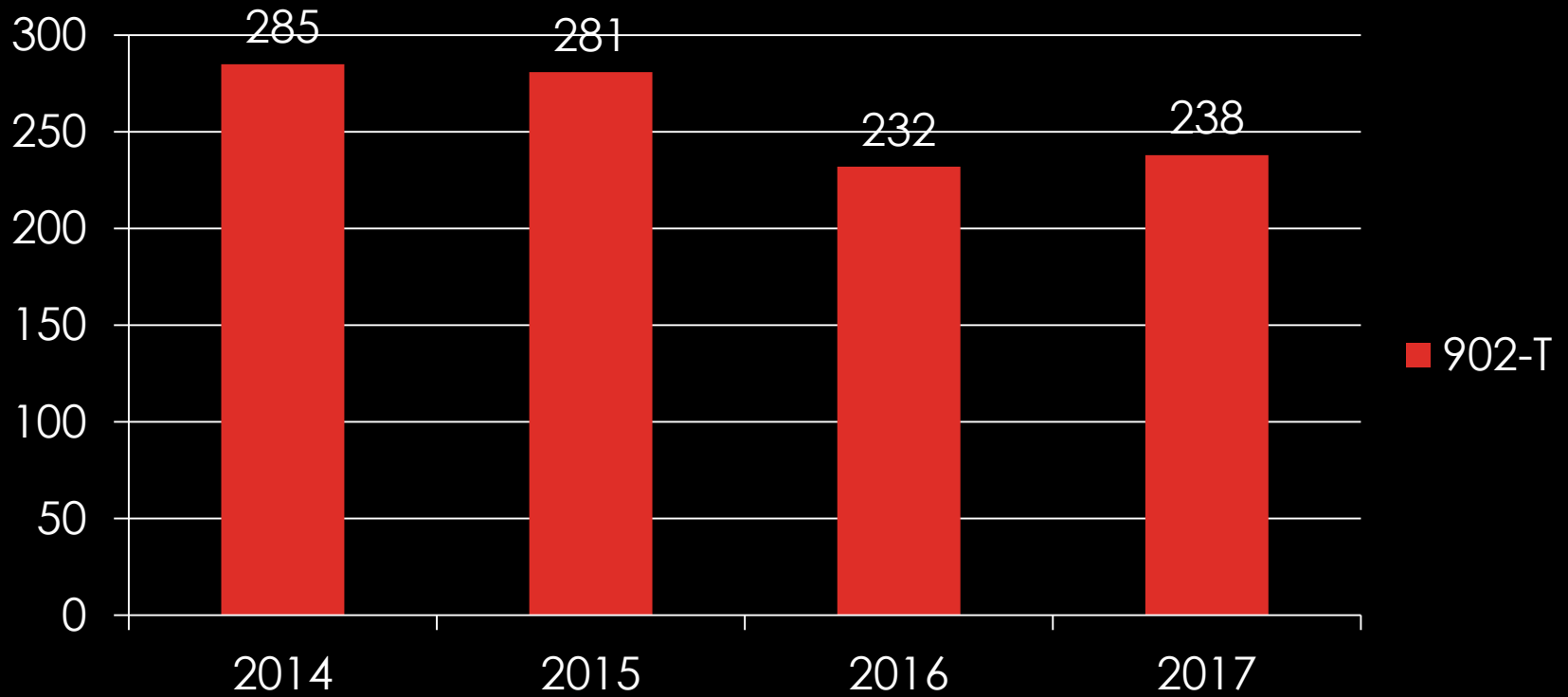
TRAFFIC ~ INJURY COLLISIONS

Injury Traffic Collisions



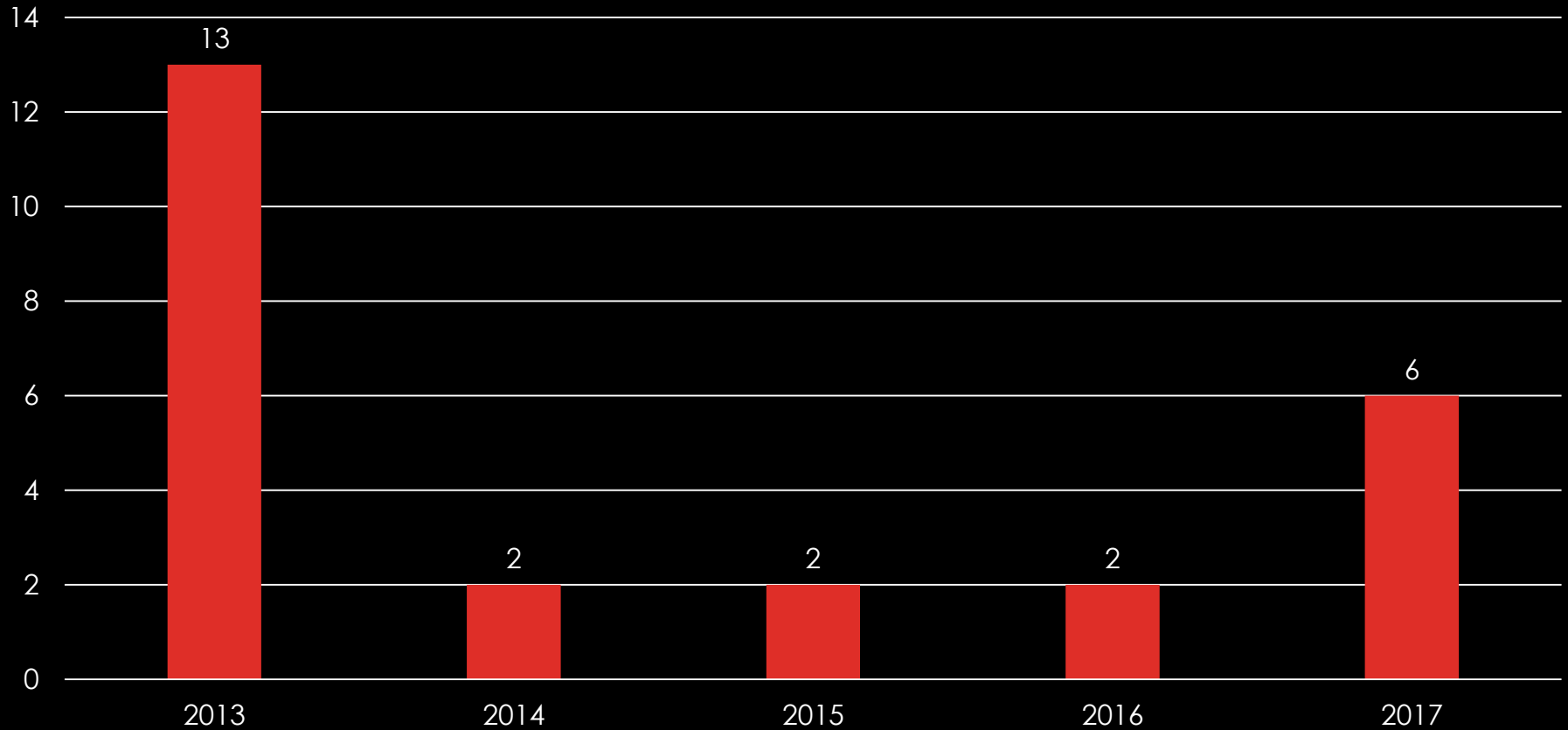
TRAFFIC ~ NON INJURY COLLISIONS

- Programs: Planned Parenthood, Character Counts, and GRIP,

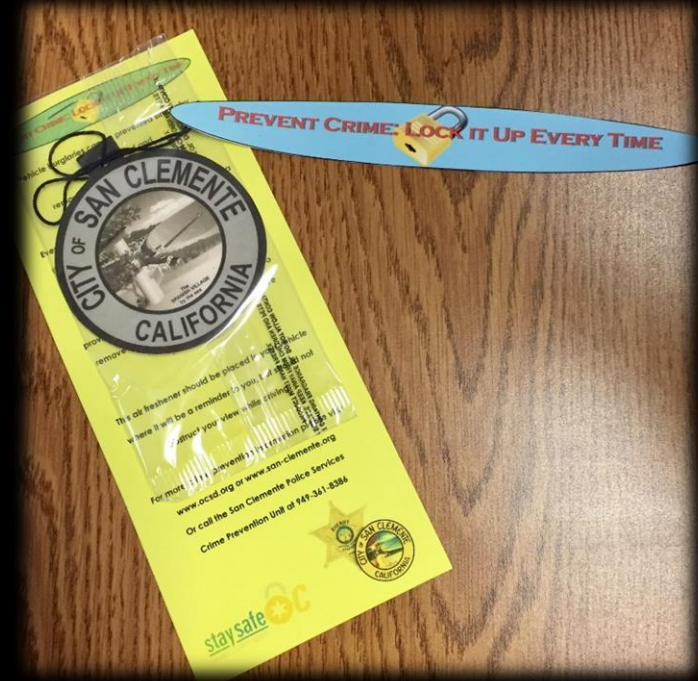

RETIRED SENIOR VOLUNTEER PROGRAM (RSVP)

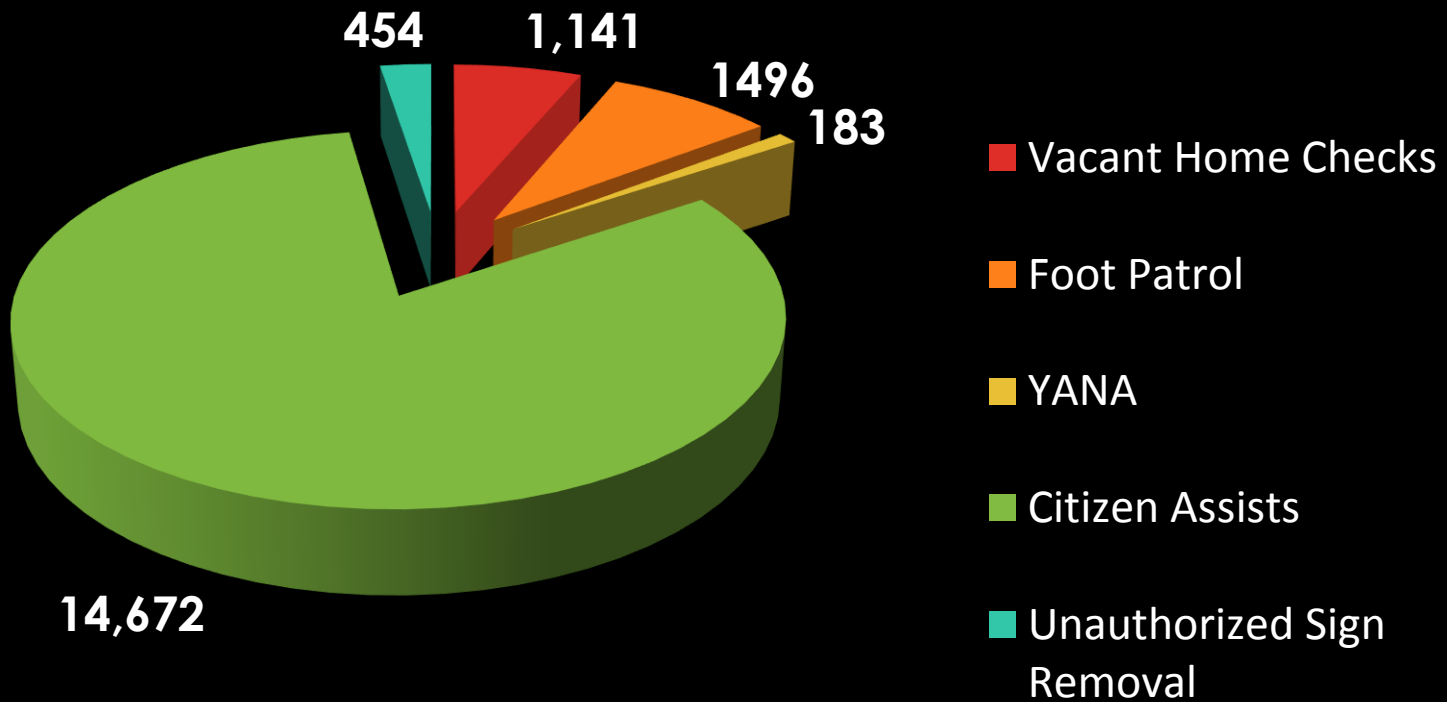
- Established 1985

- 847 hours assisting with special events in 2017

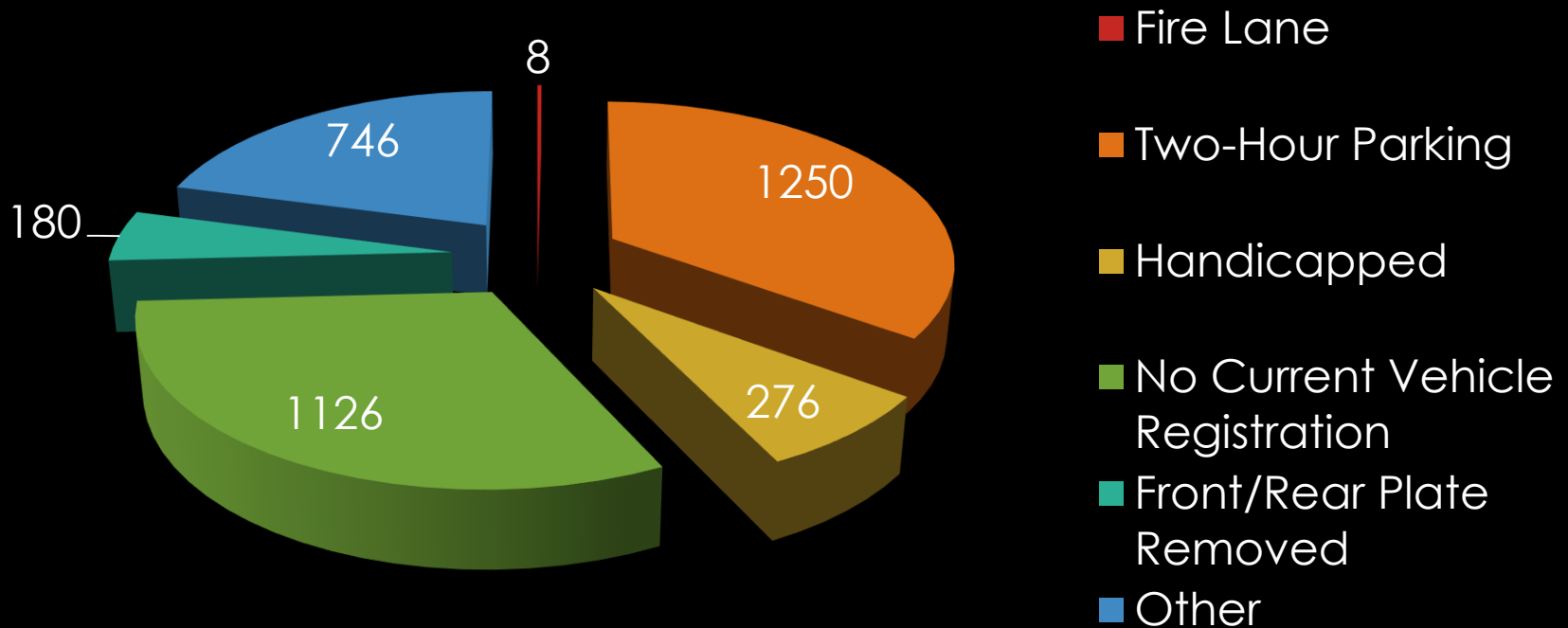
