Letter from the City Manager

At the City Council meeting on October 1st, Mike Petro, Battalion Chief with the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA), gave a presentation on the upcoming Fire Prevention Week. For those that did not see the presentation I wanted to ensure our community is aware of this awesome effort, and use this forum to discuss in detail Fire Prevention Week.

This year's Fire Prevention Week (FPW) is October 6th through 12th and the theme is, "Not Every Hero Wears a Cape. Plan and Practice Your Escape!" The FPW campaign works to educate everyone about the small but important actions they can take to keep themselves and others around them safe. In fact, did you know that in a typical home fire, you may only have as little as one to two minutes to escape safely from the time the smoke alarm sounds? Escape planning and practice is a great way you can help ensure you make the most of the time you have, giving everyone enough time to get out safely.

Fire safety education isn't just for kids in school. Teenagers, adults, and the elderly are also at risk in fires, making it important for every member of the community to take some time during the designated FPW to make sure they understand how to stay safe in case of a fire.

Since 1922, the National Fire Prevention Association has sponsored the public observance of FPW. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed FPW a national observance, making it the longest-running public health observance in the country! During FPW our Firefighters at OCFA, and others across the country, provide lifesaving public education in an effort to drastically decrease casualties caused by fires.
