


Reference Guide

- Aquatic invertebrates: animals without a backbone that like underwater, like clams, crayfish and leeches.
- Cavity: nest inside a sheltered chamber.
- Forage: searching for food.
- Habitat: natural home of an animal, plant or other organism.

- Insects: bugs.
- Omnivore: eats both plants and animals or insects.
- Scrub/Shrub: bushes.
- Soaring: flying or rising high in the air.




Mourning Dove Zenaida macroura

Nesting: Shrub






Northern Mockingbird Mimus polyglottos

Nesting: Shrub






California Gull Larus californicus

Red Tailed Hawk Buteo jamaicensis


Habitat: Open woodlands
