- 1. Which was the United States' first National Park?
- a. Yellowstone

The U.S. Congress made Yellowstone America's first National Park in 1872.

- 2. Which is the largest National Park?
- d. Wrangell-St Elias

With 13.2 million acres to explore, Wrangell-St. Elias is roughly 6 times larger than Yellowstone and over 17 times larger than Yosemite National Park.

- 3. Where is Everglades National Park located?
- c. Florida

Everglades National Park is one of Florida's 3 National Parks. It is the home of 13 endangered species, including the Florida Panther, American Crocodile, and West Indian Manatee.

- 4. Which of these National Parks contain a feature formed by the Colorado River?
- a. **Grand Canyon**

At its widest point the Grand Canyon stretches 18 miles across. The Colorado River runs through the Grand Canyon, it has been eroding its steep sides for millions of years.

- 5. Which of these National Parks is sometimes called the 'salamander capital of the world'?
- **b. Great Smoky Mountains**

30 species of salamanders can be found in and around the creeks in the park. Some species can only be found in the Smokies.

Glacier National Park is a 1,583-sq. mile wilderness area in Montana's Rocky Mountains, with glacier-carved peaks and valleys running to the Canadian border.

- 9. Bryce Canyon National Park is famous for which type of strange rock formations?

Hoodoos typically consist of relatively soft rocks topped by harder, less easily eroded stone that protects each column from the elements.

- 10. What park has the largest tree by volume in it?
- b. Sequoia

General Sherman is a giant sequoia tree located in the Griant Forest of Sequoia National Park. By volume, it is the largest known living single-sten tree on Earth.
