Trace around your child's body frame then let them color, add clothes and jewelry



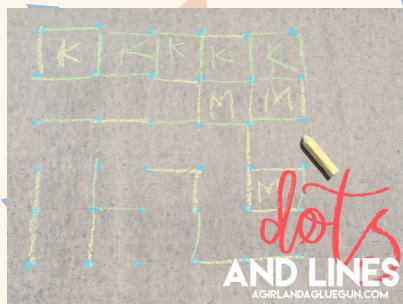
Checkers:

Draw out the checker board and grab rocks for your pieces. Use paint or chalk to mark one set to tell the difference.



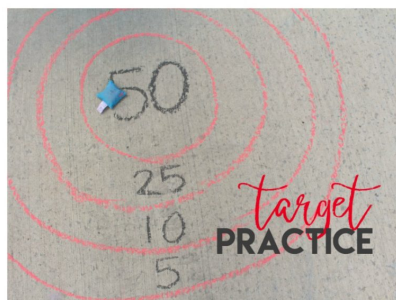
Dots & Lines

Starting with an empty grid of dots, two players take turns adding a single horizontal or vertical line between two unjoined adjacent dots. The player who completes the fourth side of a 1x1 box earns one point and takes another turn. (A point is typically recorded by placing a mark that identifies the player in the box, such as an initial). The game ends when no more lines can be placed. The winner is the player with the most points.



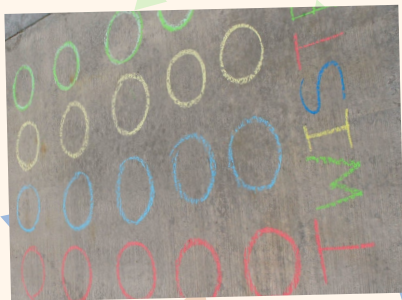
Target Practice
