CONSIDERATION OF A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE CITY COUNCIL'S PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY REGARDING NOVEL

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

Fiscal Impact: This enactment is essential to the City's potential recovery of costs

associated with this crisis.

Background:

On March 4, 2020 California Governor Newsom declared a State of Emergency to make additional resources available, formalize emergency actions already underway across multiple state agencies and departments, and help the state prepare for broader spread of COVID-19. The Governor has since issued additional related Orders. The increase of reported cases and deaths associated with COVID-19 has also prompted the County of Orange to proclaim a local and public health emergency. The imminent and proximate threat of introduction of COVID-19 in the City of San Clemente threatens the safety and health of City residents. The City issued a similar Resolution Proclaiming a Local Emergency on March 17, 2020.

Discussion:

The City Council's March 17 Resolution delegates authority to the City Manager to take extraordinary steps to protect the public from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and to address the extraordinary demands on public facilities and services the pandemic presents. The Council Resolution requires that extraordinary steps taken by the City Manager in this regard be presented to the City Council for ratification and anticipates that the City Council may subsequently amend the Resolution to deal with emerging issues.

We request that the City Council adopt a resolution amending the previously approved resolution and to consider additional exigent steps the City must take in connection with reopening public facilities and services and the public health and safety.

This resolution seeks to ratify the interim steps of reopening public facilities within San Clemente and to document any additional steps or revisions the Council wishes to consider as amendments to its order of local emergency at this time. The reopening steps to date and any adjustments the Council wishes to incorporate at this meeting will be further detailed in the attached matrix.

#### Environmental

Review:

Adoption of the ordinance and resolution would not, in itself, in any way impact or alter the physical environment. Accordingly, this action is exempt from environmental review under State CEQA Guidelines sections 15061(b)(3) (the general-rule exemption).

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA AMENDING ITS PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY REGARDING NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, as empowered by California Government Code section 8630 and San Clemente Municipal Code chapter 8.12, the City Council adopted a Resolution No. 20-13 proclaiming a local emergency regarding novel coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 30 and April 21, the City Council supplemented its proclamation in Resolution Nos. 20-24 and 20-30 to further address the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deliberated and gave additional direction on adapting the City's normal operational procedures relating to the ownership, security, and operation of City facilities and programs in light of the extraordinary conditions presented by the local emergency, including Council direction given at its May 5 and May 19 City Council meetings and the interim steps taken by the City Manager as approved by the Council;

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes, with this resolution, to amend its proclamation to reflect, ratify, and/or amend the City Manager's and Council's efforts and current decisions to address the local emergency and approved and/or amended by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, this resolution will further assist in a coordinated public health response to reduce transmission and illness severity, provide assistance to health care providers, coordinate and mitigate public services that may be disrupted from this emergency, and mitigate any other effects of this emergency on the citizens of the City; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Clemente, California resolves as follows:

## Section 1. Duration

The local emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the City Council.

# Section 2. Ratification of Interim Steps

For the duration of this local emergency, the City Council facilities and programs set forth in the amended Matrix attached hereto, as ratified or amended in connection ehrewith by the City Council, shall be maintained, operated, and reopened as described therein.
