Councilmember Hamm requested that the possibility of sending a letter to Governor Newsom with regard to reopening San Clemente Hospital be added to the agenda for this evening's Council meeting; noted that the need to take action arose after the posting of the agenda and action needs to take place prior to the May 5, 2020 Council meeting. MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER HAMM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER WARD, CARRIED 4-0-1 (MAYOR BANE RECUSING*), to add to the agenda the possibility of sending a letter to Governor Newsom concerning re-opening San Clemente Hospital during the COVID-19 crisis. *Mayor Bane recused himself from this item because his employer, Sheppard Mullen, represents Memorial Care.

Dane Bane, speaking as a member of the public, questioned and received clarification that the re-opening of San Clemente Hospital would be to serve non-COVID-19 patients.

Following discussion, MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER HAMM, SECOND BY MAYOR BANE, CARRIED 5-0, to revise Section 4 of Resolution No. 20-30 as follows:

1. Section 4 of the Resolution shall be modified to read in its entirety as follows:

"Section 4. Beach and Coastal Trails

All beaches and related parking within the City, and all trails west of Interstate 5, including the San Clemente Beach Trail and Sea Summit trails, shall be closed, but reopened as safely practicable in accordance with the Beach/Beach Trail Re-Opening Details described in Attachment 1. When reopened, the use of the beach shall be restricted to limited-term active recreation following social distancing guidelines, and passive recreation shall be prohibited."

2) An Attachment 1 is to be added to Resolution No. 20-30 to read in its entirety as follows:

"Beach/Beach Trail Re-Opening Details Per April 21 City Council Direction

Following summarizes direction provided by Council re: beach opening. Following become effective Saturday, April 25.

Poche: close metered parking on Camino Capistrano.

North Beach:

- Keep current closed parking closed
- Close all parking on Calle Deshecha, includes section between Miramar and Casino Buildings.
- Close parking along Boca de La Playa cul-de-sac, Ole Hanson Beach Club side.
- Close parking both sides of West Ave. Pico (El Camino Realto Boca de la Playa).
- Keep North Beach trail and beach accesses closed.
- Path from Boca de la Playa cul-de-sac to North beach lot stays closed.

Dije access: open it

El Portal access: open it

Note: both stairways from Beach Trail to beach have large drop offs and are therefore closed. Public can access beach via the train trestle underpass just south of El Portal.

Mariposa:

- Open this access
- Close parking up ocean side Mariposa to La Paloma.

Linda Lane:

- · Open access to trail and beach.
- Keep current closed parking closed
- Close rest of Linda Lane parking lot (upper area), and all the way to Encino Lane.

Corto Lane access: keep closed.

Pier Bowl:

- Keep current closed parking areas closed. Fencing installed around upper and lower parking lots.
- Close additional parking: Del Mar from Seville to Pier both sides.
- · Close Community Center parking.
- Close Victoria on-street parking to Pasadena Ct.
- Open Pier tunnel and at-grade crossing access.

T-Street:

- Keep current closed parking areas closed
- Close parking on Cristobal / Esplanade up to La Rambla.
- Open T-Street access

Boca Del Canon access points: open both

Lost Winds access: keep closed.

Riviera:

- Open the access
- Close all street parking in Riviera district. Parking prohibited from 7AM to 9PM in this neighborhood.

Calafia: Close all on-street parking both sides from Del Presidente to Calafia State Beach entrance.

Municipal Pier: stays closed.

Beach restrooms: re-open Saturday per prior normal daily open/close schedule.

Beach Trail: open, except Mariposa boardwalk (still closed due to damage), and certain access points closed as noted above.

City Beach and Ocean Waters: Open for active, not passive, use.

Rules for beach conduct:

- Open the water and beach for active use such as surfing, running, walking. Prohibit stationary activities to reduce the potential for crowding and social distancing issues.
- Keep playground/swings closed. Close off picnic tables/pavillons, BBQs, fire pits.

Keep beach and base of Pier restrooms closed.

Keep volleyball courts closed.

- Prohibit sitting in place, picnics, setting up chairs, placing beach towels, blankets etc. for sitting in place, loitering.
- Prohibit large groups (e.g. 10 or more).
- Enforceable under SCMC 8.12.090"
- 3. Agendize for the May 5, 2020 Council meeting consideration of reopening all other facilities that are closed.
- 4. Draft letter to California State Parks to inform them of Council's motion to reopen active use of beaches and beach trails in the city and coordinate a future date to reopen passive use of facilities.

All golf courses and their ancillary use areas, which include but are not limited to parking areas, clubhouses, and any indoor or outdoor food and beverage service areas, in the City of San Clemente shall be closed, but reopened as soon as safely practicable, pursuant to the guidelines issued by the County, the Southern California Golf Association, and the California Department of Health Services. Driving ranges and practice putting greens shall remain closed until further notice in order to maintain social distancing measures."
