EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC):

The Orange County Operational Area Emergency Operations Center has been activated to a level 2 (moderate) as of Tuesday, July 14, 2020 in support of the continuing COVID-19 response. The OA EOC will operate 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM Monday through Thursday. The OA EOC can be contacted through the EOC Liaison desk at 714-628-7060 or at EOCLiaison@ocsd.org. The OA EOC Public Information Hotline operation continues to mirror the Orange County Health Care Agency's hotline hours of Monday-Friday 08:30 AM to 5:00 PM to assist in providing non-medical information related to Amended Orders and Strong Recommendations of the County of Orange Health Officer.

Please continue to assist community members at the local level and use the State and County webpages to address concerns and questions. Links to these pages are below.

The EOC is producing a weekly Situation Summary Report on Thursdays for distribution to Operational Area partners. If any significant events occur between the weekly reports, an intermediate Situation Summary Report will be issued.

The EOC facilitated an Operational Area Coordination Call today. This call provided briefings from the Health Care Agency, and other OA Partners, with a question and answer period for participants. 8/11/20: Item 10. Approved continuance of local health emergency and local emergency related to Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19); and set review to determine need for continuing local emergency for 9/1/20 9/15/20, 9:30 a.m. and every 30 days thereafter until terminated.

7/28/20: Item S26B. The ordinance grants outdoor business operations in unincorporated commercial and industrial areas to open in parking lots where physical distancing is possible. The zoning exception will last the duration of the County-declared emergency related to COVID-19, waiving all applicable parking requirements.

Issued 8/3/2020, Guidance on Youth Sports

The guidance for youth sports establishes a consistent set of rules that apply to all youth sports programs — including school-based, club, and recreational programs. Outdoor and indoor sporting events, assemblies, and other activities that require close contact or that would promote congregating, such as tournaments and competitions, are not permitted at this time. Youth sports and physical education are permitted only when physical distancing of at least six feet and a stable cohort of participants, such as a class, can be maintained. Issued 8/3/2020, Waiver Process for Elementary Schools to Resume In-Person Instruction

The California Department of Public Health has released the details to the waiver process. A district superintendent, private school principal or head of school, or executive director of a charter school may apply for a waiver from the local health officer to open an elementary school for in-person instruction in a county on the monitoring list. This waiver is applicable only for grades TK-6, even if the grade configuration at the school includes additional grades. The application for a waiver must include an

attestation that the applicant consulted with parent, labor, and community organizations at each school site for which an application is being submitted.

The application must also include confirmation that the elementary school reopening plans have been published on the website of the local educational agency (or private school). Reopening plans must address, at a minimum, plans for cleaning and disinfection, cohorting, movement within school, face coverings and protective equipment, health screenings, healthy hygiene practices, contact tracing, physical distancing, staff training and family education, testing, communication plans and triggers for switching to distance learning.

Issued 07/14/20, Updated COVID-19 Testing Guidance:

This guidance is an update to the interim COVID-19 testing guidance issued by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) on May 1, 2020. This updated guidance is intended to support public health officials, health care providers, and laboratories in determining who should be tested given the current context of the COVID-19 pandemic in California.

COVID-19 testing in California has rapidly expanded over the past three months and much has been learned about COVID-19 and which populations and communities it impacts disproportionately.

Guidance on Closure of Sectors in Response to COVID-19 Issued on 07/13/20:

Summary: COVID-19 transmission rates continue to rise across the state, including increasing numbers of cases in rural counties that had not previously experienced significant infection rates. Despite the closure of certain indoor sectors in counties on the County Monitoring list, those counties continue to demonstrate concerning levels of disease transmission that impact not only the general population but vulnerable populations in the community.

This guidance and the Statewide Public Health Officer Order, dated July 13, 2020:

- Closes, on a statewide basis, indoor operations for certain sectors, and both indoor and outdoor operations for bars and similar establishments, consistent with the June 28 and July 1 restrictions on counties on the County Monitoring List.

- Closes, for counties on the County Monitoring List for three or more consecutive days, indoor operations for additional sectors which promote the mixing of populations beyond households and make adherence to physical distancing with face coverings difficult. Within these sectors, and in the affected counties, those specified businesses that are not able to continue their business through outdoor operations must close that portion of their business effective immediately in order to further mitigate the spread of the virus.
- Closing, for counties on the Monitoring List for three or more consecutive days, additional indoor operations for certain sectors which promote the mixing of populations beyond households and make adherence to physical distancing with face coverings difficult. Within those sectors, those that are not able to continue their business through outdoor operations must close that portion of their business effective immediately in order to further mitigate the spread of the virus. This applies to the following sectors/events:
 - Gyms and Fitness Centers
 - Places of Worship
 - Indoor Protests
 - Offices for Non-Critical Infrastructure Sectors
 - Personal Care Services (including nail salons, massage parlors, and tattoo parlors)
 - Hair Salons and Barbershops
 - Malls

The COVID-19 Employer Playbook was revised on July 28, 2020 to require employers to contact the local health department in any jurisdiction where a COVID-19 employee resides when there is an outbreak in a workplace. An outbreak is defined as three or more laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 within a two-week period among employees who live in different households. Additionally, this update aligns the minimum criteria for return to work with CDC guidance. A new table was added for employers who are considering whether to temporarily suspend operations due to a COVID-19 infection. 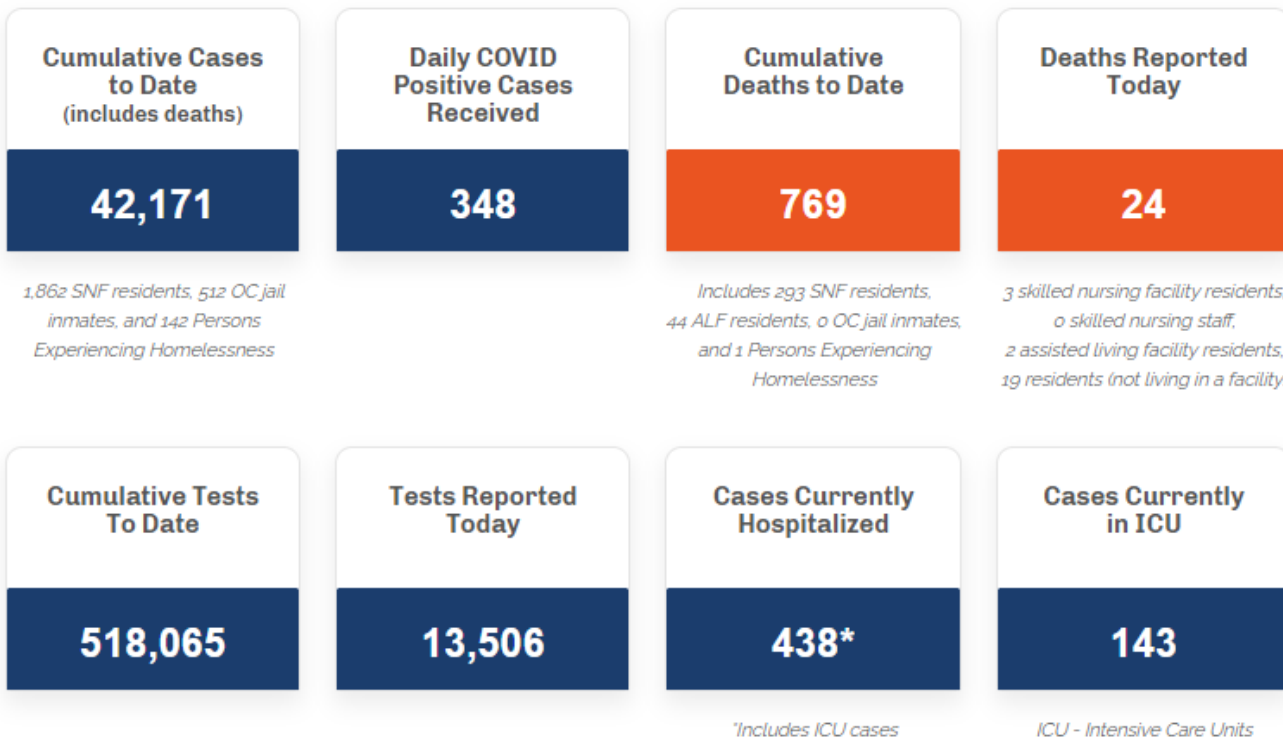

SITUATION SUMMARY REPORT

- Hospitalizations continue to trend downward with the most recent report being 438 COVID patients, down from 671 one month prior. Patients in the ICU is also trending down with 143 in ICU, down from 231 one month ago.
- Based on current available data, Orange County is seeing improved metrics according to State monitoring data, including;
 - Testing volume above the threshold of 150 test per day per 100,000, as of 8/12 at 190
 - AS of 8/12, 14 day case rate at 109 cases per 100,000 down from a high of 258 on July 10; the state target is <25 per 100,000
 - AS of 8/12, testing positivity rate at 7.7%, down from a high of 14.9% on July 13; the state target is below 8%
- The most important actions to prevent spread and reduce disease transmission are individual behaviors by the people of OC;
 - Stay home as much as possible, especially high risk persons (65 or older, or underlying health conditions)
 - Stay home when sick
 - Isolation of cases and quarantine of all contacts (within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more)
 - Practice social distancing at all times; 6 feet or more
 - Wear face coverings when unable to maintain social distancing; high compliance is critical given asymptomatic transmission
 - Wash hands frequently
 - Avoid touching face
 - Disinfect frequently touched surfaces often

The OC Coroner Division continues to monitor, assess, and prepare for impacts from the pandemic, including supporting and augmenting the OCHCA with decedent management. The Coroner Division has the capability and capacity to receive 1,100 decedents through its primary facility, three refrigeration trailers, and five outfitted storage units. As of **Monday, 10 August 2020**, the total storage capacity in use is 7.5%, with daily fluctuating caseloads ranging from 6.0% to 9.0% (note: these figures reflect all cases within the jurisdiction of the OC Coroner).

- County Beaches in South Laguna Beach (Aliso, Table Rock, West, Camel Point, and Treasure Island beaches): 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. daily. Thousand Steps Beach is open 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily.
- Capistrano and Poche Beaches: 6 a.m.-10 p.m. daily.
- Salt Creek and Strands Beaches: 5 a.m.-12 a.m. daily.

- Farmers Market has returned to Irvine Regional Park Tuesdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- Expiration dates on all existing OC Parks Annual Parking Passes that were valid as of March 18, 2020 will be automatically extended for an additional two months from the original date of expiration.
- Parking lots and restrooms are open at all County regional and wilderness parks. This includes: Carbon Canyon, Clark, Craig, Irvine, Laguna Niguel, Mason, Mile Square, O'Neill, Peters Canyon, Santiago Oaks, Tri-City, Wieder and Yorba regional parks, as well as Aliso and Wood Canyons, Caspers, Laguna Coast, Riley, Whiting Ranch wilderness parks and Upper Newport Bay Nature Preserve.
- Irvine Lake is open for fishing during its regular weekend hours.
- The grounds of Heritage Hill Historical Park are open. All buildings remain closed.

State:

State Parks is working with local officials on a phased and regionally-driven approach to increase access at park units where compliance with state and local public health ordinances can be achieved. The operations of the park system have been modified to reduce the risk of exposure to COVID-19 and modifications at each park may vary.

Economic and Business Recovery:

Operation:

CARES Act Small Business Relief Program: Program is designed to provide \$45 million of CARES Act funding to small businesses in Orange County who have been impacted by COVID. Districts 1, 4 and 5 provided grants up to \$10,000 to businesses in their districts. Funding was allocated directly to cities within Districts 2, 3 and some cities within District 4. Districts 4 and 5's programs ended on July 19th. District 1's program ended on July 31st. District 4 re-opened phase 2 of their program on August 3rd, just for the under scripted cities of Anaheim, La Habra and Fullerton and is scheduled to run through August 22nd.

WIOA COVID-19 Need Related Support Services: On April 24, 2020 EDD announced its intent to award Orange County with \$900,000.00 of the available \$10 million awarded to 42 local workforce development areas to support California workers impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding will provide up to \$800 per person for basic needs such as childcare, housing and utility assistance, and transportation costs. In addition, funding assistance for equipment needed for teleworking along with digital services for Wi-Fi access may be available for workers in some areas. Orange County received the largest single award. Staff has processed several applications however there are still ample funds available.

WIOA Lay-Off Aversion Support Fund: Orange County received \$700,000 in WIOA funding to support Orange County small businesses with unique solutions to avert layoffs. OC Small businesses had the opportunity to apply for up to \$10,000 in funding to create solutions that mitigate layoffs due to COVID. 170 applications were received and reviewed. A second application period opened on August 3, 2020 and 130 applications were received in 23 minutes. We anticipate awarding qualified applicants on August 31, 2020.

Back2Business Initiative: This initiative provides businesses in Orange County free access to assist with redesign support due to COVID-19 physical distancing requirements. Staff worked with a 2D and 3D software company to provide businesses quick access in creating efficient layouts and maximize space utilization to get their business re-opened and employees back to work in a safe and responsible manner. Additionally, the platform provides options for outdoor seating configuration will be available on August 14, 2020. Small businesses interested in using the software should contact (714) 480-6500.

To date, over 7295 clients (including 345 calls this past week) have been assisted through our Economic and Business Recovery Call Center providing personalized support and information on the CARES Act, community resources and other business recovery resources.

The One-Stop Centers have responded to 521 phone calls and emails, conducted 175 virtual, 24 on-site face to face appointments for job seekers and 7 virtual and 3 onsite face to face trainings to unemployed individuals

As of 8/12/2020, there are 981 Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notifications with over 68,401 Orange County workers dislocated from employment as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Great Plates Delivered: Over 4,300 individuals enrolled. 39 restaurants with 45 locations under contract. Emphasis on adding smaller “mom and pop” restaurants, particularly those who offer ethnic cuisine such as Vietnamese, Korean, Mexican, Chinese and Indian. Restaurants are successfully conducting their own outreach and the program has grown dramatically in June and July. FEMA authorized an extension through **September 9**.

SafeDineOC COVID-Safe Restaurant Campaign

The County of Orange today announced the launch of a new SafeDineOC COVID-Safe Restaurant Campaign to incentivize Orange County restaurants to follow California Department of Public Health (CDPH) guidance to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Restaurant owners may apply for a \$1,000 grant per Orange County restaurant location for taking steps to create a COVID-safe environment for their customers and employees. The grant will reimburse restaurants for purchases of personal protective equipment including face masks, cleaning products, employee training and costs for physical distancing of tables and chairs, as examples.
