# Special and Regular Meeting – December 15, 2020

A Special and Regular San Clemente City Council meeting was called to order on December 15, 2020 at 4:30 p.m. by Mayor Ward. The meeting was conducted via teleconference.

### **CLOSED SESSION**

City Clerk staff read the following communication, which is on file with the City Clerk:

In response to Councilmember Ferguson's comments, City Attorney Smith noted that Closed Session Item D was properly noticed inasmuch as it reflects the safe harbor language provisions contained in the Brown Act and the identity of the claimant was disclosed in advance of the meeting; stated that Interim City Manager Sund will recuse from participating in Closed Session Item A; advised that he does not have a financial interest in Closed Session Item A and can either participate in the item to advise Council on employment law or can recuse himself from participation, at Council's discretion.

In addition, City Attorney Smith announced that the Emergency Shelter Coalition (ESC) brought a lawsuit against the City which the City was able to end with a preliminary motion; noted, however, that ESC subsequently considered appealing that decision; stated that Council unanimously approved a settlement agreement, in Closed Session on November 17, 2020, which committed to cover ESC's cost for filing the suit (less than \$15,000) in exchange for a waiver of ESC's right to appeal; announced that the agreement is a public record and available for inspection.
