P3a. Description:

The property contains a two-story single family residence with a rectangular plan and wood-frame construction. Designed in the Spanish Colonial Revival style, it is capped with a low-pitch side-gable roof with clay tiles. The exterior walls are clad with original smooth stucco. The residence is symmetrically aligned. A one-story projecting shed-roof entrance with an original wood paneled door occupies the primary facade's central bay. Centered above the entrance to the residence is a decorative circular vent with two intersecting metal grills. Other elements of the Spanish Colonial Revival style include the residence's stucco chimney and exposed rafter tails. The fenestration consists of original wood divided-light casement windows throughout the residence, including a row of four casement windows vertically aligned on either bay of the upper story. A low stucco garden wall follows the perimeter of the front yard. The residence is in good condition. Its integrity is good.

It also appears eligible at the local level as a contributor to a potential historic district. It is recommended for retention on the Historic Structures List.


