Chief Capobianco provided updates on several vegetation fires and the status of Truck 59, which will be in service in 1-2 weeks. He announced the Quick Response Force (QRF) program, a public/private partnership with Edison, will allow Edison's helicopter to be available for Orange County, including San Clemente and adjacent areas, that threaten Edison service areas in the event of a fire.

Chair Berkuta announced the City of San Clemente is currently accepting applications for Commissions and Committees, and current Public Safety Committee members would need to reapply.

Committee Member Loeffler praised City Manager Erik Sund for his quick action in replacing the wooden bench in front of the old San Clemente Hotel.

City staff announced the Public Safety Committee would have five voting members and three non-voting members, and reported the new City Council Chambers is in the design phase, but no additional information is available. Staff stated the Public Safety Committee's recommendation as it relates to shopping carts and the storage of personal items on public property was presented at the last City Council meeting. City Council directed staff to return to the August 17, 2021 City Council meeting with discreet options on how the removal of personal items would be handled. In efforts to eliminate recreational vehicle and long-term parking at Max Berg Park, the parking areas in the park will be closed from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. daily. The City will be installing signage of the allowed parking hours and sending letters to the area residents of the change. Parking enforcement will be provided by the Community Service Officers and City of San Clemente Park Rangers.
