In addition, appropriate \$40,000 from the General Fund unassigned fund balance, Account 001-000-23430, into Account 001-151-43890.

Staff Recommendation

Staff Recommendation

 Make a finding that an emergency exists due to the potential failure of an existing sewer pump station and storm drain system and that the situation requires immediate action to prevent or mitigate impairment to property and public services, which might otherwise occur if required to incur delays attributed to the typical engineering design and public competitive bidding process.

PRESENTATION OF WRITTEN MATERIALS TO COUNCIL
