7. CONSENT CALENDAR

A. <u>Proposed Parking Prohibitions on N. El Camino Real and W. Avenida</u> Santiago (Farivar)

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that Planning Commission forward to the City Council a recommendation to approve parking prohibitions at the following locations:

- North El Camino Real, south side, east of Avenida Presidio for additional 40 feet;
- a) Avenida Santiago, on the west side of a property's driveway exit located at 1010 West Avenida Santiago for a distance of 10 feet; b) Avenida Santiago, from the southeast curb return of El Camino Real southerly 40 feet.

Deputy Director Atamian, Acting Deputy Director Ponsen, and Saeedeh Farivar, Senior Civil Engineer-Traffic were available for questions/clarifications.

Deputy Director Atamian read aloud letters from the public regarding proposed red-curb modifications at location number 2 of this item:

<u>Chris Garcia</u>, resident, opposed the proposed prohibition on the south side of North El Camino Real due to loss of parking; suggested visibility problems were the result of large palm trees.

<u>Emily Matthews</u>, resident, supported the proposed parking prohibitions as they will result in increase safety.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER COSGROVE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MCCAUGHAN, AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED TO FORWARD TO CITY COUNCIL A RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE THE PARKING PROHIBITIONS AS DETAILED IN THE STAFF REPORT.

9. NEW BUSINESS

A. <u>Draft Coastal Resiliency Plan Presentation</u> (Gallardo-Daly)

A presentation of the draft Coastal Resiliency Plan that builds upon the findings and recommendations in the 2019 Sea Level Rise Vulnerability Assessment. The Coastal Resiliency Plan is part of the ongoing Local Coastal Program work program. Comments on the Coastal Resiliency Plan will be reviewed and incorporated as appropriate for the City Council consideration.

Cecilia Gallardo-Daly, Community Development Director, Leslea Meyerhoff, Summit Environmental Group, Consultant, and Jake Thickman, Moffett and Nichols, Consultant, narrated a PowerPoint Presentation entitled, "Draft Coastal Resiliency Plan, San Clemente Planning Commission, dated November 3, 2021," and responded to questions and comments from the Commission. The Presentation is on file in Planning Division.

Consultant Meyerhoff advised that the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Commission has recommended the City explore creating a Shoreline Monitoring Program and/or Cobble Berm concept to retain sand on the beaches; noted the "Living Shoreline Project" is a nature-based project gaining traction for its potential to keep sand in place on beaches;

Director Gallardo-Daly referred to a letter on the dais from the Surfrider Foundation urging the City to support the nature-based solutions and relocation plans for existing elements harmful to the beach; described the Cypress Shore beach erosion conditions and Railroad response; advised intent is to research all available potential solutions, involve all stakeholders and craft resolutions to protect beaches for future generations.

Chair Crandell opened the public hearing.

<u>Susan Ambrose</u>, former Chair of the now disbanded Coastal Advisory Committee (CAC), described the CAC's past efforts to combat loss of sand and sea level rise; urged the City to be as proactive as possible, continue research into potential solutions, and continue the CAC's efforts to address this issue.

<u>Aaron Washington</u>, Beaches, Parks and Recreation Commissioner speaking as a private resident, encouraged the Commission to vigorously address beach erosion.

<u>Donna Vidrine</u>, resident, suggested the City appoint a 7-member committee to focus on coastal issues affecting the City.

Chair Crandell closed the public hearing.

Update received; Planning Commission to be kept updated as to the progress of the Draft Coastal Resiliency Plan.

Chair Crandell noted that the City is critically low on Planning staff; requested this issue be added to an upcoming agenda for full discussion.
