Subject: ***USE OF E-BIKES AND BICYCLES***

Fiscal Impact: None.

Summary: Staff recommends that the City Council approve an amendment to San Clemente Municipal Code ("SCMC") 12.32.130 to prohibit all bicycles and electric bicycles year-round on the municipal pier and review options for the use of electric bicycles on the beach and beach trail. Additionally, based on feedback received through the web portal, staff recommends the City Council provide direction on the use of e-bikes and bicycles on public sidewalks.

Background: At its February 2, 2021 meeting, the City Council reviewed an agenda report and recommendation from the Beaches, Parks & Recreation Commission related to the use of electric bicycles ("e-bikes") within parks, on inland trails, and the beach and beach trail. During its meeting, Council approved the Commission recommendation to prohibit all bicycles on all turf within city parks; amended SCMC 12.32.130 (Attachment 1) to ensure that the e-bikes were included in the use of bicycles when referenced in the municipal code section; and required that bicycles be walked on the Mariposa Bridge. No further changes were made to the use of e-bikes on inland trails or to the established speed limit of 10 MPH on the Beach Trail.

Council directed staff to:

1. Develop an "education blitz" concerning e-bike safety; and
2. Film an "Around Town" concerning e-bike safety; and
3. Establish a reporting hotline to enable the public to report e-bike incidents; and
4. Return to Council after six months of incident data collection.

Discussion: E-bike Web Portal/Hotline Data

In response to Council direction, staff established a reporting hotline located on the City's website that provided an anonymous space for residents to provide information on incidences or experiences that they may have encountered while using a city amenity or public space. The reporting portal was made available in March 2021 and the data included in this report is current through December 7, 2021. Results are detailed in Attachment 2.

A total of 367 comments were received, focused on six areas: (1) Beach; (2) Parks; (3) Sidewalks; (4) Streets; (5) Trails; and (6) Other. Out of the comments received,

13% were directed at beach activity, 34% were directed at trail activity, and 28% and 14% were directed at streets and sidewalks, respectively. Additionally, of the responses received for trails, 89% of the reports were directed towards the Beach and Beach Trail.

Public Outreach Efforts

In May 2021, staff developed and implemented a new bike safety event titled "Bike Safety Rodeo", in partnership with San Clemente Police Services, targeting youth 5-17 years of age. The event focused on the safe use of e-bikes and proper operations, as well as general bike safety while traversing city terrain and traffic.

An "Around Town" focused on e-bike safety was released in June 2021 featuring messaging from the Mayor, representatives from the Recreation Division, and the Marine Safety Division.

Additionally, signage was posted along the Beach Trail noticing users of the "walk bikes" requirements along the bridges, and the base of pier asphalt was marked with "Walk Bikes" signage in several areas. Park Ranger staff made a concerted effort to station a ranger at busier times along the base of the pier pathway to educate and inform riders of the City code and policies related to bicycle/e-bike usage while at the beach.

Bicycles and E-bikes on the Pier

Currently, SCMC subsection (a) of 12.32.130 prohibits the riding of bicycles and e-bikes on the pier; subsection (b) allows for them to be pushed or walked, and parked on the pier. Due to the increased use of bicycles and e-bicycles along the San Clemente Beach Trail, there has been a significant increase in the volume of bicycles and e-bicycles being walked, ridden, and parked on the San Clemente Pier. This increase has created a safety hazard for pedestrians, emergency vehicles, and lifeguard service response when accessing the pier.

As a result of this increase, staff recommends prohibiting all bicycle and e-bicycle access on the pier, including walking/pushing and parking. Furthermore, and to offset the impact related to the prohibition of parking bicycles on the pier, staff recommends increasing the number of bicycle racks for storage in the base of the pier area.

Based on the direction of the Council, staff is prepared to bring back an amended Ordinance further defining the use of e-bikes and bicycles on the pier, beach, and beach trail.

Recommended

Action: STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT the City Council

- 1.) Provide direction on the continued use of electric bicycles on the beach and Beach Trail; and
- 2.) Direct staff to bring back an amendment to SCMC 12.32.130(a) to reflect a prohibition of bicycle and e-bike walking/pushing and parking on the pier; and

- (3.) Direct staff to optimize and increase bicycle racks at the base of the pier; and
- (4.) Provide direction on the use of bicycles and electric bicycles on sidewalks within San Clemente.

12.32.130 Cycling, skateboarding and similar activities on pier, access road, beach, and beach trail.

- A. Prohibited Activities on Pier and Access Road. Except as provided below in subsection (B) of this section, no person shall ride or permit to be ridden, drive, or permit to be driven, any bicycle, electric bicycle, tricycle, skateboard, roller skates, or similar type device on the municipal pier, accesses to the pier, service roads, or beach access roads. In addition, no person shall throw any "frisbee" or other similar device on the municipal pier, accesses to the pier, service roads, or beach access roads.
- B. Use of Bicycles on Beach and Beach Trail. Riding of bicycles and electric bicycles is permitted on the beach and beach trail, including those portions that overlay the beach service road, subject to the restrictions of this subsection B. Riding of bicycles on the beach and beach trail is not permitted between the pier and the south end of the Trafalgar Canyon Bridge from June 15 through Labor Day. Riding of bicycles is not permitted on Riviera Beach Trail Bridge, Montalvo Beach Trail Bridge, Mariposa Bridge, or on the asphalt area extending north and south of the base of the pier at any time. Bicycle owners are permitted to walk their bicycles through restricted areas and at restricted times. Bicycles may be ridden at a maximum speed of ten mph on all portions of the beach and beach trail. Electric and non-electric bicycles must yield to pedestrians. Reckless riding of bicycles is prohibited, and no persons shall allow their bicycle to block or be left unattended on the beach and beach trail at any time.
- C. Modification. In the event of special circumstances so warranting, the City Council may by resolution modify the requirements established herein. Modifications by the City Council shall only be made if the City Council determines that such modification will not be contrary to the public health, safety or welfare.

There are many locations on the trail that are not wide enough for any bikes. Dogging handle bars that are wider than most people and then add on a side carry surfboard racks it is ridiculous to believe that bikes can co-exist on the same trail and people on foot when even pedal bikes travel faster than walkers. Yes runners also travel faster but require much less space than a bike to get through a small opening and also no handlebars and surf racks that can hurt if hit by them. Measure the width of the trail and the conclusion is simple, my mountain bike handlebars are 24" so add 5 or 6" for clearance on each side of the handlebar and a bike rider consumes 35" without a surf board rack, no way a person and bike get over bridge without walker turning sideways, experience for yourselves.</p>

We have to use e-bikes because we are over 65, with various physical impairments, and could not physically do this with regular bicycles anymore.</p> <p>We've seen the near-accident problem every week, both as pedestrians and as bike riders-- and the problem is not people like us. The problem is caused by a minority of bike riders: teen e-bike speedsters, and sometimes middle age men practicing for road bike races on regular bikes. Obnoxious pedestrians with earbuds in, not paying attention to their own dogs or kids, exacerbate the situation too.</p>
B-3	3/8/2021	8:41:30 AM	<p>This whole thing would not be a problem if the walkways/trails/bike paths had been designed according to recommended urban planning guidelines rather than the "mixed user" strategy.</p> <p>All the city restrictions on e-bike use are destroying our ability to get fresh air and exercise as our doctors recommend! Please consider the disaffected!</p>
B-4	3/8/2021	9:45:00 AM	<p>This is my experience as someone who bought an eBike within the past year. I live on Avenida Montalvo. I read the San Clemente municipal code on regular bikes, but was confused about which rules pertain to eBikes—Are eBikes legally considered “bikes” or are they “motor vehicles?” Often the rules and signage for those types of vehicles are contradictory....I chose to assume they were “bikes.” At low tide, riding slowly on the beach at sunset, is a joy. I would have to agree that 8-10mph is a good slow speed for the beach. I’ve been surprised to rarely see other bikes on the sand, though I see trail tire marks. My initial opinion is that eBikes should be riding 8-10mph on the sand but in crowded areas be subjected to a type of “blackball” where the lifeguards manually put up signs each time a section of the beach is crowded. These signs should require walking your bike, not banning bikes. And the penalty for riding your bike should be being asked to stop, not a ticket. Too often is the full force of the law used against people who are just trying to enjoy the beach, sometimes by law enforcement personnel who are simultaneously apologizing for having to enforce it.</p>

I’ve been a spear fisherman for many years and much of the laws and boundaries are blurry to me because of how poorly they are articulated. Either way, it’s definitely not helping people navigate life in one of the most regulated states in the country.</p>

Regular bike riders (not e-bikes) tend to be more careful, and don't ride as fast.</p> <p>I am on Beach trail 3-4 times a week as a runner and walking my dog. They should be walked on the bridges and prohibited from speeds greater than 10mph and with substantial penalty if exceeded. Thank you.</p>

The only indication I received from the 2 or 3 families I saw was the noise from the bike as they raced past me on my left side, which is the side that my small dog is on. Please note that this bad example of common courtesy were families with both parents present, not unsupervised children. I heard them but this is only because my hearing is good. If a person is hard of hearing or is wearing earbuds they will not hear the bike approaching. I definitely think there should be a speed limit enforced and that people should not ride bikes on bridges. Bike riders need to be on the look out for pedestrians not the other way around. I fully support not having bikes on the trail. Why should we wait for the "data" of a serious accident to a person or pet before using common sense that motorized vehicles belong on the streets. Good morning... On Tuesday, July 6, 2021 as I was walking on the beach trail, there were numerous SC junior lifeguards riding their e-bikes at 8:45AM TO 9:15AM. There were 15 e-bikes parked on the access road... It's getting worse. Thank you!

There are kids on their e-bikes in "no bike" zones driving quite fast among several walkers.

Electric bikes should not be allowed on the beach, sand and there should be a system in place to monitor this so people will be discouraged from riding there. It is an accident ready to happen. It's scary to walk on the path with speeding bikes streaking up on you with no notice.

I am a RSVP volunteer and I had a couple come to me and say that they have had numerous bad experiences with teens on e-bikes going over the bridge between North Beach and the pier area. Apparently, the bikers ride their e-bikes very fast in that area with no regard for pedestrians. I was almost hit by an e-bike (just grazed) driven by a kid going maybe 20 mph. I walk my dog on the trail every day. I always see e-bikes at high speeds on the Mariposa bridge, and south of the pier bowl where its narrow and there are large groups of pedestrians. The e-bikers know this, so they do what they want. There will be people seriously hurt or even killed if there is no enforcement, fines, etc.

I walk my dog daily and it's getting worse with the e-bikes. They're driving waaaaay to fast. Something needs to be done here. It's a public safety issue. This should be a comfortable beach walk, with no need to constantly be worried about getting hit or flipped off.

Another issue. E-Bikers go too fast and weigh too much with 60-80 lbs bikes, so potential collisions are more dangerous. What does it take for the city to act? This isn't the City of Congress - so we SHOULD be able to get something done here. E-bike riders go way to fast and do not walk bikes ever. The teens go so fast but we seen a lot of adults go fast as well. The bridge going to north beach is marked walk bike but never happens and it's so dangerous. Putting up signs that say walk/bikes is not the solution there needs to be fines and possibly no bikes allowed on path.

Please do something about the safety of your community who pays to live here. Not only is the Capo Beach a mess still, but the e-bikes on the San Clemente beach trail all the way down to Doherty are Dangerous. I have almost been hit several times and so has my dog. These are young kids and grown adults riding way too fast. Please do something about this before someone gets seriously injured or killed.

I walk the North Beach Trail 3-4 times a week. I am a resident and business owner here in San Clemente. I am documenting all the conversations about the E-bikes' high speeds along with my own experiences. Each week I get buzzed from behind by one or two E-bikes. It's like a game to them, how close and how fast can they come to the pedestrians to scare them. Our city officials stand by and do nothing. Why? The city writes tickets for citations on the beach, expired parking, events with no permit. None of these threaten human life. E-bikes do threaten human life. The city will be as safe why they turned a blind eye to the E-bikes' high speeds on the North Beach Trail because someone will be crippled or killed soon. I suggest the city periodically and cleverly run a speed trap in multiple locations on the North Beach Trail. Write ticket for \$250 and impound the bike for 2 weeks at a cost of \$250. Run this program for two months and the problem will be solved and the City will be protected.

Walking the beach trail with my wife on 9/5/21 from California to the pier and had multiple near misses, with handle bars of e-bikes grazing my rib cage, multiple times. This is an accident waiting to happen, & higher probability of an injury/collision occurring on the narrower sections of the trail. I ask that the city council members simply walk the trail and see for themselves that we have a major problem that needs to be addressed. Before e-bikes we walked the beach trail 3 or 4 times each week. I no longer consider it safe with the kids & adults using it as a road with no restrictions of speed. These should never have been allowed on our walking trail. I mourn my beautiful morning walks. Please remove electric bikes from our beautiful walking trail.

People on bikes driving way to fast almost hitting pedestrians like me. Needed to date them several times. Took away from my tranquil walk time. It became stressful walking with their lack of consideration. Please make them stop so pedestrians can enjoy their walks and not fear their safety! Recently using the beach hiking paths while trying to enjoy our walk, hike and the beautiful ocean view near San Clemente we found ourselves overwhelmed with keeping out of the way of E-bikers. These beautiful paths once enjoyable to walk and hike have now become a race track for thereckless. Inconsiderate e-bikes. It is beyond me how anyone would think this is a safe mixture. What does it look like for a toddler to be run over by a moving object at 20 miles an hour. Has anyone on city council giving thought to the danger that exist not to mention the amount of wear and tear going on. I am at a loss of words except disappointment for grown ups to allow e-bikers with no ENFORCED rules or regulations in place or to even be allowed at all. Just can't understand the thinking process at all.

PARK

Three teenagers hours were riding bikes too fast where kids were by. Multiple kids riding bikes on the soccer field and laughing. Teenage idiots female riding e-bikes down the grass of soccer field absolutely unacceptable will tear up the turf ☺ she had no helmet and did it multiple times last Friday 5/8 3:30pm. There were also two boys doing the same but with helmets. Either the teens or parents need to be cited this will destroy our parks. I've also seen them on the walking paths near the baseball diamonds and almost take pedestrians out. These e-bikes need to be banned in the parks as they teens will destroy the parts its not ok. Parents need to be fined and held liable too to drive this home. Please coordinate or work on an ordinance on law. This will also save lives as the e-bikes are too much for teens.

PLEASE address the situation in San G Park E-bikes on the walking paths and all over the courts and parking for whom no regards for anyone one else! I am there every day twice walking my dog and have noticed a HUGE increase in this!! I am having to yell at the kids and adults to get off the path and away from us. They are riding at 25miles per hour. Is there not a city ordinance that does NOT allow motorized bikes or walking paths inside parks?? Please consider putting up signs or outlaw e-bikes in city parks!! I no longer walk the beach trail that I helped design because of the e-bike situation....I served on the SC Parks and Recreation Commission from 1988-2000 when I first moved to SC. I would be happy to volunteer my time to help with the biking problem. I am not against E-bikes and have ridden many times but always in the designated bike lanes on the ROADS.... This is an accident waiting to happen and a LAW SUIT FOR SURE for the city!

E-bikes can zip by at very high speeds on walking trails. It always feels like they are about to run over my kids or my dog. The park rules state "no motorized vehicles allowed" well, aren't e-bikes motorized? They move quickly, therefore appear unexpectedly. They should not be allowed in the park, or go within certain speed limits.

I would just like to voice my opinion that E-bikes should be allowed (per state law) on sidewalks in most cases. In many places in this city there are no bike lanes. For example, I live in Tafoga and during the summer it is virtually impossible for me to find vehicle parking near the beach. I can ride my E-bike part of the way down to the beach using bike lanes. However, once I reach EC-R, it is very dangerous to remain on the highway, have tried it and on multiple occasions, had someone open their vehicle door into the street, forcing me further into the traffic lane (there are no bike lanes available on much of EC-R). I understand and disallowing E-bikes on Del Mar, as it would be dangerous for people exiting businesses or just walking, as they could be mowed down by an E-bike rider. There must be a sensible solution where E-bikes are allowed on sidewalks where there are no bike lanes available and prohibited in areas where there is dense pedestrian activity.

Kids on e-bikes on the sidewalks going fast and coming up behind pedestrians with no warning. You have to constantly look behind while walking. Used to enjoy walking my dog. E-bikers come down the very steep East San Juan going way way to fast. Someone will get seriously injured or killed only a matter of time. It is Out of Control!!!

It appears that electric bicycle riders don't know rules of the road... particularly kids, although in this situation it was an adult. I had parked in the lot next to Bonded Cleaners and there is no clear view of the sidewalk or the building. I was literally an inch from being crashed into by a bicycle rider who had to be going 25-30 miles an hour. So close . . . and it could have had a very bad outcome. There was not even an apology. They should never be riding bikes on the sidewalks in the first place.

My husband and I were walking on the sidewalk towards Rosa...thinking it would be safer than walking on th street because so many were driving crazy and e-bikes were on sidewalks going at least 15 to 20 miles an hour speed....suddenly a kid on a e-bike came up beside me and brushed by arm....almost knocking me down. Just as I was turning around 2 of the guy's friends were behind us, going just as fast...no alert...no sorry no slowing down. We walk daily and are in our 70's....When is this city going to demand protocol with itsresponsible, licensing and helmets. When are riders on e-bikes going to be ticketed for riding on sidewalk, going against traffic and endangering our citizens. 6 young girls followed riding dangerously on the sidewalk again, doing at ridiculous speeds. The city needs to step up and get these motorized vehicles off the walkways that are for pedestrians. One year I saw about 3 e-bikes on sidewalk with surfboard attached to road side of bike. I had to jump off the sidewalk into the road to avoid being run down and/or sliced by their surfboard fins. They said nothing and continued to speed along. We need legislation to keep level 3 e-bikes off the sidewalks and out of the hands of kids younger than 16. 28 mph is too fast to ride on a sidewalk.

They should have to follow the rules of the road. Drive on right side of street, in the bike lane where allowed. With little or no regulation or adult supervision, very young individuals are driving their e-bikes on the sidewalks, on the streets, on the trails causing pedestrians and motor vehicles to avoid their recklessness. There is no requirement for proper training, understanding the rules of the road, overloading the bike (3 or 4 kids on one bike), helmet use, etc. It is unpleasant and dangerous to walk on the greenbelt, sidewalk while backs of kids race by at 25 mph, narrowly missing pedestrians. We often find them driving on the wrong side of the road, running stoplights and stop signs. Parents that are so worried that they won't let their kids walk home from school give their 10 year old kid an e-bike with a 30 mile range and then let them ride anywhere without intelligent adult supervision. I have almost ran over multiple kids/cadets on their e-bikes at this intersection. They have no regard for the stop signs or any rule of law on the road at all. They blaze by at 30 mph on the wrong side of the road some times and never stop when they should. The city needs to put a cop on the street and start ticketing the electric bikes for running stop signs, because somebody is going to get seriously hurt or injured on that road. I'm not against e-bikes, I am against them totally disregarding the rule of law on the road, especially when they do 30+ MPH! They need to follow the law, full stop.

I was setting off the freeway at Pelizada the other evening as most of the cars are getting off, running right in full traffic, all of a sudden 5 kids on E-bikes were coming up the hill against traffic, on the wrong side of the road, did not stop at the light/crosswalk, but all of them were flying up in front of the cars exiting off the freeway, cutting them off, and the other two almost lost their lives!

Tell the parents to educate their brats on road courtesy. Almost ran over 5 teens who were playing chicken on the road with other motorists.

E-bikes riding on sidewalks, doing fast, wrong side of rode, pulling in front of traffic, not yielding to pedestrians.

There are so many children on these e-bikes. 2-3 kids without helmets or shades riding one bike going all different ways in the street, some are riding the wrong way into oncoming traffic. As a parent of 12 & 13 year olds, I have gotten my kids' pedal assist bikes. However, before they were able to get them, they had to show me that they were respectful and courteous and knew the rules of the road for bikers. They are not allowed to just cruise the neighborhood or city on their bikes either. They are to be used for transportation to and from a friends, the grocery store, etc. My point is sharing all this is that we cannot control parents from getting their kids these bikes but I do think that anyone riding these should have to get some sort of bike license and go through training, just like any other motorized vehicle. When I was in middle school, we had to complete a bike training course before we were allowed to ride our bike to school, think we could implement something like this

Children and teenagers crossing several lanes at a time and in front of traffic.

I support the use of e-bikes and encourage the city to add bike lanes wherever possible. E-bikes allow seniors to remain active and to enjoy the coast. To whom it may concern. Everyone you don't take personal safety seriously. ABSOLUTELY NOT! E-bikes are not for everyone. They are not for our town about all of the bikes and electric bikes that are constantly running stop signs and red lights. I would say I see at the very least 5 per day if not more commit this crime and almost get hit. This shows me they have no respect for us as drivers and certainly not for you as a city official. It's a slap in the face. And these are kids and grown ass adults that know better, and they don't wear helmets either. I'm in this close to starting petition to ban them or at least make it if they want to be treated like a car that weighs 4500 lbs then they have to abide by the laws. - Yearly - 1. Insurance 2. Lights Same thing goes for golf carts these 12 year olds are driving around, laughing thinking it's funny and cute running stop signs. Uhm, they should be fined

Kids not observing rules of the road, riding against traffic and blowing through a four way stop when a pedestrian was crossing. The city needs to get on this! Every day, complaints on new door about e-bikes on sidewalks, riding against traffic, near misses and actual collisions. Someone is going to get killed while you do nothing to ensure the safety of our community!

Kids and adults going the wrong way at speeds in excess of what a manual bike travels. Sometimes these things come at you so fast that you can't calculate your moves based on a bicycle going up hill at pedaling speeds. Sometimes these things come at you so fast that you almost collide. If a bike is traveling at the correct direction 2) stop at stop signs. 3) have front or side lights. 4) stay off of sidewalks if any motor is present.

Kids too young to even have licenses driving in the middle of the street going the wrong way straight into traffic. So scary! Kids on e-bikes texting and driving in the bike lane wrong way from target. Downhill 20 mph almost if my car when making a legal u-turn two young girls were riding double on an e-bike going north on La Pata near Pico, but the rider on back did not. After I exited Courtyards at northbound La Pata, I was waiting at the turnout for Via Onda. After southbound traffic cleared, I started my U-turn, and after almost completing it, at the last second I noticed the two girls riding fast northbound on the side of the southbound lanes. I had to hit my brakes as they zipped by in front of me. I looked in my rearview mirror after making the U-turn, and noticed them cutting through the Via Onda turnout to get to the northbound side of La Pata. I've seen many young kids recklessly riding their e-bikes in traffic, riding double on my brakes, blowing stop signs, riding without helmets, or riding with helmets that are not strapped around their chins.

Last summer (August 2020), a 9-10 year old boy came out of Vía Diego on an e-bike without looking and crossed Camino Tierra Grande. I was driving up on Camino Tierra Grande and slammed on my brakes to avoid hitting the boy. It was a very scary situation. Thank God I did not hit him. A young female (12-13 years old) was riding down Vía Cristóbal on an e-bike and shot out into Camino Tierra Grande without looking or slowing down. I almost hit her with my car. I slammed on my brakes and barely missed her.

Two juveniles riding double on a throttle e-bike. 7am 9/2/21

This is quoted from neighbor who happened several days ago. the woman who wrote it watched as a deputy attempted to talk with the three teens riding on one e-bike. They sped off and yelled expletives at the officer. "I did pull over and talk to the police officer out of concern for the girls' safety. I was also shocked that these girls would run off and disobey a police officer like that and with nude consent. I spoke to the officer I asked him "are you going to get after them this is so unsafe for them to be riding like that in traffic with no helmets" he said "no be it would be putting them more at risk for crashing now because these kids are kids and make stupid decisions and they are already putting themselves in such a vulnerable situation of debt, I see this too many times a day and I just hope that these kids start using helmets and being more safe"

A large number of students and generally, young teens, noning their bikes to school or around town seem to not be trained in traffic rules and safety. I see kids every day on my way to work who will use the sidewalk to ride on and then when they get to an intersection, maneuver over to the traffic lane to catch the green light to cross. Or, they cross in the pedestrian lane without stopping and while the red stop hand flashes. A gang of kids are also congregating in the green belt, concealed by bushes at Forster Ranch after school. Riding their bikes on the green land in the walkway. Most annoying is when entire families ride together and parents seem oblivious to their kids cross crossing between riding on the sidewalk and then merging into traffic. I am very afraid that someone is going to get seriously hurt before there are some sorts of bike safety training, licensing and consequences for those who break the traffic laws.

The speed at which these bikes travel in the morning around 7:35 am is horrific as well as the fact they are in middle of the street and ignoring all stop signs while trying to get to school on time. I fear someone will be hurt.

Or maybe all bikes should be required to have a bell, and a sticker could be put on the handlebar beside the bell that reminds them to use it? Not all bikes come with a bell. I would think it would be in the best interest of the sellers to make sure that e-bikes don't become restricted on trails. I hope you can find a solution that will accommodate all people using the trails.

In the last couple years since the proliferation of e-bikes on the trail, the pedestrians have had their safety put at risk. This is especially true on the long Mariposa Bridge where the e-bikers speed along with little regard for the safety of the walkers.
T-19	3/11/2021	4:00:00 PM	If the city staff or city council members are concerned about this issue, I suggest they walk the beach trail for a few mornings. They will find out how dangerous the e-bike situation is.

The worst always seems to be young teens from California to the pier. I realize paying someone for enforcement on bikes presents a financial issue but these bikes are usually out of control! someone is going to get hurt. It annoys me also when people don't listen to the posted signs and ride normal bikes during the summer too, but there is a big difference being hit by a bicycle going 5mph and an e-bike (which weighs significantly more) going 20mph+. Also, most kids on e-bikes have no helmets. Not trying to be an old stick-in-the-mud (I actually WANT an e-bike!) but I just don't think the beach trail is an appropriate place for them to be ridden, especially since most people do so at top speed.
T-21	3/12/2021	10:01:00 AM	I'm a 50 year old female and I walk my dog and jog the beach trail 3-4 days a week from State Park to North Beach at various times on the day and have never once had an e-bike incident. I've never seen an e-bike incident while I've been there and I haven't heard of any incidents among my friends who use the trail. I think that posting the rules at various points will solve any issues. It's everyone's beach trail.
T-22	3/13/2021	6:50:00 AM	I am adamantly opposed to allowing e-bikes on the trail. I recently wrote to the Council and detailed how my wife and I as well as several other people were almost hit by two young boys riding on the Mariposa Bridge going at least 20 miles per hour. Despite a number of us yelling at them, they did not slow down or acknowledge what they did. I walk the trail 6 days a week and have had countless close calls. The trail is too narrow to allow such fast, powerful vehicles on them. It is impossible to patrol and a 10 year old child does not have the mental maturity to ride such a vehicle at 10 miles per hour. As to the City's educational program, if they do not know how to ride them in a careful, safe manner before they get on them they certainly will not learn how through a formal educational program. Please ban them on our beloved trail permanently.
T-23	3/13/2021	12:11:00 PM	My husband and I were riding our bikes on the trail going north from the pier. It was not a high traffic day and if we were around people we walk our bikes. Three young girls came on e-bikes going south very fast. I slowed down, and was thinking that she would too but she zoomed past me causing me to ram into the fence. My husband ran into the back of me the handlebars hit him in the stomach so he got the worst of it with other injuries. The other girls did slow down and said they were sorry. I have noticed it's mostly younger kids that have no regard for anyone else on the trail sidewalk or streets.

It's just a matter of time (if it hasn't already occurred) until a speeding e-bike hits a pedestrian on the beach trail. It happened to my friend (walking) ^{ATTACHMENT 2}

Huntington's beach trail, and it put him in the hospital with a concussion and pretty severe facial injuries requiring multiple stitches. You can't hear the bikes coming since they don't have noisy motors, and they are FAST. Motorcyclists are required to wear helmets but not e-bike riders? I used to regularly walk my dog in the mornings and evenings on the Beach Trail, typically starting in North Beach and heading south. Now I rarely enjoy the trail because I've experienced so many close calls with heavy electric bikes ridden way too fast by inexperienced bike riders or people (young and old) who are oblivious to anyone else on the trail. Forget the weekends. If I do walk, I go during the week and walk against traffic so that it's less likely that bikes will come up suddenly behind me. I've also tried leaving my dog at home and walking on the beach to escape the bikes, but that's not a solution either because the e-bikes are on the beach too. It's my opinion that for the safety of pedestrians, electric bikes should be banned from the Beach Trail, the beach, other city trails, and sidewalks. These fast and heavy electric powered bikes belong on the street alongside other motorized vehicles. Thank you.

I walk my dog along the main canyon trail at least once a week. There is a large slope that runs along the north side of the canyon below the new homes. This area used to be irrigated, but since last summer the irrigation lines were removed from the slopes. Since that occurred, I've seen young men on electric bikes ride their bikes up high onto the slopes, down to the trail, and up again. This activity is damaging to the slopes. Today while walking on the beach trail multiple bikes/Engines were weaving in and out of pedestrians. Not giving way and causing pedestrians to get out of the way. When is signage going up to indicate that cycles are not to be ridden over the bridge. Electric bikes are motorized vehicles. They generally travel at a much faster speed than the rider realizes. As they are frictionized vehicles, they should stay in bike lanes on the street. Regular bikes and electric bikes all tend to ride much to fast to provide a safe environment for people on the beach trail.

For safety reasons, I would recommend no bikes of any kind on the beach trail. Thank you. Under no circumstances should electric bikes be allowed on the beach trail. It is an accident waiting to happen, and costly lawsuits against the City for allowing dangerous access.

Electric bikes are just like motorcycles or other motorized vehicles. They do not mix with people. E-bikes are motorized vehicles. They should not be allowed on the beach trail.

I am a current and past road, se, and mountain bike rider. I see e-bikes as motorized vehicles which should not be allowed on the beach trail. It is too crowded with walkers, runners, strollers and dogs. Bike riders in general do not give way to walkers and do not follow speed limits. Bridges become very hazardous during peak use hours. E-bikes should not be allowed on beach trail. And human powered bikes should be allowed on all bridges. WHEN THE BEACH TRAIL WAS PLANNED IT INCLUDED BICYCLES BEFORE THERE WERE ELECTRIC BIKES. E BIKES ARE MOTOR CYCLES AND SHOULD STAY ON ROADS NOT RIDDEN ON THE BEACH TRAIL.

E-Bike riders are riding too fast and taking dangerous risks. They should have to have a license and pass a test. For example, pedestrians and dogs cannot hear them coming. They need to alert us when they are near. It's common biker rider courtesy but isn't happening. These guys and gals can do alot of damage!

E-bikes should be allowed, however, they need to operate under a certain MPH on this type of path. Two young Ebike Riders travelling too fast, whothers around.

I am an older woman, and was walking my small dog along the trail. At one point a young woman buzzed by on an ebike very quickly, and I had to get myself and my dog out of her way. Ten minutes later she came buzzing by the other way, again very fast. I put my hand up and said "you need to slow down". Well...she went on just a bit then stopped and started yelling at me to mind my own fr. business. I went up to her and said that she had been going too fast on a walking trail and there was a 10mph speed limit. She continued to yell at me and my little dog too. Her last words to me were "I'm going to fuck you up bitch" I was trembling and very nervous had to keep looking back as I walked home. At home I told my husband that I needed help, spray, and stayed away from the trail for months. I'm a big fan of vehicles; however, I don't think they should be allowed on the beach trail. It's not safe considering the number of people who use it for walking running and bring dogs and strollers.

I see AGAIN. Two parents letting their small children riding electric bikes (Fazor Brand) very fast and not watching them. I slowed several times and had to pull my dogs closely and finally decided to stop and wait for them to get way ahead of me. As I stopped and they collided. Parents finally paid attention and stopped to help them. Me, just lucky they didn't crash right next to me and hurt me and my dogs. I witness so many people going too fast, looking at their phones while riding, no helmets and riding the trail. This must stop before anyone gets seriously hurt or is the City just waiting for this to happen before e-bikes are not allowed?

If you're going to ride an e-bike please follow trail etiquette. The electric bikes go way more than the posted 10 mph. The speeds are excessive, the numbers of e-bikes are increasing, the beach trail is way too narrow for dogs, strollers, joggers, children and seniors trying to walk safely. The e-bikes are often loaded with footers and surfboards. They pose potential hazards. An accident is waiting to happen. Why do we need to wait until someone is seriously injured before we say "NO BIKES" on the trail. How / who is monitoring the posted speed limit? I walk almost every day on the trail. I see the activity. It's busy. The trail is not designed for bikes. Thank you.

Today we were nearly struck by a young man on an ebike weaving in and out of pedestrians at an unsafe speed. We also had to move over for at least a dozen other bikes/bikes being ridden on the bridge. When are the signs going up to stay they must walk them?

Ebikes belong on trails until the city can provide safe infrastructure on the street trail is separated or protected from cars. They should be banned from the trail.

Kid riding WAY to fast and way too close coming up from behind the unsuspecting walkers. His speed brought dust up from the trail. Note how those his board is to them. March 30, 2021. 4:15pm Near 333 West Paseo de Cristobal on Beach Trail.

My concern is specifically in regards to young people on e-bikes. The kids that can't even drive yet without any knowledge of road laws, speed, etc. We have noticed kids on their e-bikes around town on the beach trail while looking and talking on their phones. My husband recently had 2 teenage girls cut him off because they were not paying attention and were on their phones. Extremely concerning and dangerous.

Also, kids riding WAY TOO FAST with heavy "fat" tires on the beach trail with no regard to others.

The beach trail was planned for NO motorized vehicles. This is on the RCSEP that planned the trail. It was not designed for any motorized traffic. If yes, then it is not safe for children to ride. The trail is too narrow and to crowded for the speed of e-bike

E-bikes are UNSAFE for the trail. I was walking with my small children and a pack of teens on e-bikes FLEW by us, no warning, almost hitting my 6 year old daughter. It was terrifying - and these kids didn't even look back or even care. They are unsafe, dangerous, and someone is going to get killed. What would have happened if they crashed into my daughter? Is the city going to be liable when someone gets KILLED? It's TERRIFYING that the city hasn't stepped up to mitigate the dangerous conditions of these bikes on our trails. Trails should be safe. SHAME on you city council and city management for not putting an end to the ridiculous dangers of e-bikes on our trails. NO EBIKES ON THE TRAILS. ENFORCE IT. Enough is enough.

2 boys on electric bikes whizzing by (pedestrians and almost hitting a dog)! These bikes should be banned from the trail.

We don't mind the bikes, we mind the speed and lack of courtesy. It's usually the kids riding like crazy. Would it be possible to require the use of pedal power when sharing the road with pedestrians?

6 teenage boys almost hit several people, kids and dogs included. They were going fast and single file laughing when people said slow down. These are not bikes, they are motorcycles. They should not be allowed on the beach trails.

Three Ebikes raced by people walking on the beach trail bridge at Mariposa point. They were moving at least 20mph

Absolutely no place for a heavy chunk of metal going 30 mph with hands off the handlebars. Has turned the trail into another dangerous freeway. Zero care for walker (partic elderly) and no real reason to be there... can always get to the same place using the roads as clearly not on the trail to enjoy the fabulous views... has completely ruined the ambience of that special beach trail.... bikes get bigger and faster every day...

Tried to upload 4 photos. This site only uploads one.

SAFETY ISSUE: I'm contacting you about a serious safety issue. The public access trail that feeds uppers and lowers trestles beach has signage that states NO MOTORIZED Vehicles. HOWEVER Everyday 100s of electric bicycles zoom down the narrow trail at dangerously hi speeds making it VERY dangerous for the pedestrians and slower pedal bikes with surf racks. "Stealth Killers" - Pedestrians and pedal bicycles do not hear or expect a SILENT electric bike to zoom inches away from them at speeds of 20 to 30 miles per hour (or more). The speeds are increasing as technology of the Ebike continues advance. Families with small children walk the trail to the beach every day and we already seen close calls with Ebikes hitting small children and many other pedestrians. The lack of enforcing the "No Motorized Vehicles" Law on the trails to uppers trestles and lowers trestles beaches is going to lead to serious injuries and/or worse a death of someone on the trestles trail.

Common sense tells you the only safe solution is to eliminate all motorized vehicles on the trails to the trestles beach areas including ALL Ebikes, electric skate boards, scooter etc etc all motorized vehicles. Common sense tells you its only a matter of time before we have a major tragedy on the trail due to the increase of Ebike traffic and the popularity of the trestles breakers. A death on the trail will be very costly to everyone and is preventable. Why other alternatives do not work. "Make a speed limit" - we all know that will be VERY difficult and costly to enforce. And many surfers will not follow the speed limit rules. "Put in speed bumps andчикanes to slow the traffic" , the dangerous frictionized vehicles will only go slow in those areas. This also will slow down the access for the fire and life guard vehicles that need to quickly access the area. "Allowing class 1 bikes" - this is almost impossible to enforce and the reality is All

On Saturday June 12 at approximately 5:30pm, I was walking northbound on the trail with my husband. We were on the bridge just north of access point when a rider came up behind us and chose to run us down rather than wait until he had room to pass. An altercation ensued, which we reported to Sheriff's deputy at the pier. He did not take a written report. This man was extremely aggressive. He ran into my husband, rolling over his foot, and then into me. He then yelled and tried to hit my husband as he pushed him away from me. Two females (mother daughter) trail riders saw it from a distance and later asked if we were ok. This is completely unacceptable. We are longtime residents, and the trail is being completely overwhelmed with ebikes. At least 50 passed us as we walked from Linda Lane to California and back. The Sheriff said they should all be walking bikes, but only 2 were. More signs are needed, and better enforcement. The photo is of our attacker. Male, grey ing beard, 40s?

A motorized cycle (Gas or Electric) was never envisioned for the trail system in my 12 years on the County Trails commission. Walking my dogs at sunset. Multiple Ebikes operating at high speeds without any lighting or sound. Almost ran us over. All drivers were young 10-12 years old. Ebikes should have to follow the same codes as Low Speed Vehicle or NEVs. California Vehicle Code § 21250 governs the use of low-speed vehicles on California streets. These e-bikes have top speeds between 20-33 MPH, just not safe in pedestrian environments. They should have to be registered with DMV, Proof of Insurance, Driver's license, and helmets mandatory. If I rode a 1 HP mini bike (picture attached) on the trail, I would get a ticket in a heartbeat.

Motorcycles, Motor Driven Cycles, and Motorized Bicycles fall under M1 or M2 endorsement on a drivers license) all in violation of CVC e-bike classification ridden at high speeds, often by minors too young to obtain a CADL. Last night the trail was busy with pedestrians waiting for sunset. Several e-bikes and regular bicycles ignored the signs and rode through the crowd of people causing people to step aside.

Sunday 8am. Saw at least 10 people riding on beach trail even though we saw 1 sign at entry just past pier that said no bikes on trail. Not enough signs at entry points. A grown man going very fast on his Ebike across the entire WALK BIKES area around the base of the pier. One second later I moved to cross the RR tracks. That one second saved me from going to the hospital or the morgue. If he had had a license plate I could have reported him. I have seen E-bikes, ridden by adults, on sidewalks in town. Many E Bike riders are not wearing helmets and not respecting STOP signs. E Bikes are Motor Cycles. Should the city permit all motorized vehicles on the Beach Trail or should the City Council ban all motorized vehicles from the Beach Trail? Please make all vehicles, bikes included, wear license plates. Thank you City Council.

I love my bike. But ride responsibly. I see people causing danger to the public every day on the beach Trail. Today near T Street a rider that I would guess is 12 years old almost crashed into an elderly couple. Someone is going to get killed if the city does not figure out how to regulate the use of the trail or at the very last actually enforce a speed limit. On June 25th on the bridge between NB and the pier. I have a picture.

On three different occasions on June 28th. Someone's going to get hurt.3 ebikes on the same bridge between NB and the pier at the same time. My husband walked the beach trail at about 8:30-9:30 am yesterday/Wednesday the 30th. He said he saw at least 40 ebike riders going full speed. All were young kids in groups of 7 or 8. There was a near collision on one of the bridges when he was crossing and they all tried to pass him on the NARROW passage. It was a very close call for everyone. So much for putting signs up that says no bikes! It's not working! Help!! Yesterday I was walking the beach trail and was almost in multiple times by bikes on the trail. I saw a bike coming at me way to fast, almost hit my shoulder and proceeded to run over a little 4 year old boy right behind me. told the lady to slow down and her response was to tell the dad he should keep his child under control. I was appalled and assessed the little boy for injuries. The lady's bike knocked him down and ran over his arm and shoulder. He sustained abrasions and one deeper cut to the shoulder. I am a Pediatric ICU nurse and I advised the dad to go get X-rays. I am very upset that bikes are even allowed on the trail. It is VERY DANGEROUS and BIKE NEED TO BE BANNED. Parts of the trail are very skinny but the bikers don't seem to care and fly by the pedestrians. With the increase popularity of Ebikes the trail is overrun. The hospital is seeing a huge increase in Ebike accidents. Please make the trail pedestrian ONLY!

7-1-2021 -Walking with my 2 year old grandson, e-bike riders going too fast weaving around pedestrians, it's not safe to walk on the trails anymore. They do not walk their bikes on the bridge either. Not related to e-bikes, an older man with a grey ponytail and white hat on a 10 speed again going way to fast almost hit myself and grandson. On his way back by us I asked him to slow down, he spit on my 78 year old mother. I hope to see him again, I will take a photo and report it to the police. I'm sure this isn't the first time this person has behaved this way.

3 Separate incidents on June 19, 2021 - An older man riding out of control & almost dumping his bike near the State Beach, a young man coming around a bend on the wrong side of the trail so he could go over a "lump" & nearly ran into me, and another man riding very fast coming up from behind nearly clipping me. I only was able to get a photo of the last one after he went past me. I walk the trail often and the bike riders are getting worse and disregard safety of others and any rules. It seems clear bikes do not belong on the trail with pedestrians, kids, dogs, & joggers. I never have any problems these other users of the trail.

I walk the trail several times per week and the dog joins me much of the time. Nowadays, it's a rare occasion that I do not witness an E-bike racing along the trail at a high speed without any regard to pedestrians or dogs. The rule of the rule is pedestrians yield to E-Bikes. I guarantee if the City do not outlaw motorized vehicles on the trail, someone will be killed or crippled. Either outlaw e-bikes or outlaw pedestrians, cause both cannot safely co-exist.

My family was in town and we were all walking on the beach trail, returning home from a quick day in the sand for their less than two year old. The child was in a stroller and we were clearly on one side of the path. The next thing we knew two young teenage girls on e-bikes came zooming past. One almost caught his little leg and lifted the child OUT of his stroller while his dad was pushing it. Everything happened so fast as they were riding e-bikes in a crowded area at sunset and literally pushing people who noticed them off the road. I was shocked and embarrassed at having suggested this fun family event and then nearly having my nephew in a terrible accident. Something has to be done. Someone innocent is going to get really hurt someday. I am asking that there is some enforcement of the rules. Surely e-bikes are not allowed on this stretch of the bike trail? Let's make the beach trail a safe place for everyone.

Please don't punish all ebike riders because of the few clowns. vast majority of ride riders are the very young. As adults 71 yrs olds my wife and I would be punished from bike riding if all ebikes were banned. Perhaps if restrictions must be imposed try age restriction. Must be over 21(?) , 35(?)

I feel like it is just a matter of time before somebody gets seriously injured by an electric bike rider driving way too fast. No electric bikes on beach trail

Follow the lead of Mission Beach, Ca. that in the pursuit of resident and visitor safety has eliminated all electronics on the beach boardwalk.

As I was jogging on the trail (north) I got onto the bridge and 5 e-bikes drove by young adults (maybe 18-21?) came onto the bridge (going south) going very fast, not slowing down at all when they saw me. They rode right in the middle of the bridge forcing me to stop and lean again the bridge railing, nearly missed clipping me. Not the first time I've been nearly hit by an e-bike while jogging on the beach path, but definitely the scariest and most aggressive.

My 9 year old son had a horrific e-bike accident and we spent 50 days in ICU, 4 surgeries for dripping cerebral spinal fluid from his fractured skull, shunuses, face... the journey is attached. <https://getfound.us/0822867C>

My wife and I are both retired seniors and we have Pedego e-bikes. Rather than restrict the use of e-bikes on trails, I think they should be allowed but be restricted to the same speed limits as un-motorized bikes. More and more seniors are turning to e-bikes and I don't think they should be singled out from regular bikes which by the way can go much faster than the maximum speed of a class 2 e-bike of 20 miles per hour. Thank you.

We encountered at least 10 e-bikes being ridden on the Mariposa Bridge on Sunday PM. None gave way to pedestrians and we had to move out the way for most

This afternoon 3 adult males riding ebikes narrowly missed a young boy. He was running from side to side when 3 ebikes riding on the Mariposa Bridge nearly ran him over, stopping inches from him. This was right in front of me. told the first biker that he should be walking his bikes. His reply was "you keep walking and I will keep riding". I did see the sheriff stepping several bikes. 2 of them remounted as soon as he was out of sight. During late afternoon walks we often see the same teenagers boys riding ebikes at high speed over the Mariposa bridge, expecting pedestrians to move aside to let them go by. I will sometimes say "please slow down", and the response is typically for them to speed up as they pass and say "What? what?" understand the teenage element is at play here, but it's a matter of time before someone gets hurt. Is there some sort of "speed bump" or an obstacle that would allow walking through but require a bicyclist to dismount to get on the bridge? Or a camera to monitor bicycle speed? I will attempt to take a photo of the e-bikers in the future, and submit to this site.

I was passed 8 times on one walk what appeared to be a group of 3-5 years old riding Ebikes in excess of 25 miles an hour with absolutely no regard to the walkers, elderly or mothers with strollers just absolutely complete disregard and if he had lost control he would've killed somebody (spoken by an experienced rider) Along with the TOTAL DISREGARD he had a helmet on which was not strapped on PLEASE GET THIS TO STOP it has taken the fun and relaxing from walking on the trail

				You don't really think that any e-bike is going 10 miles an hour on the bike trail, do you? I live right above the bike trail. I've witnessed near misses many times. It's pretty frequent that the teenagers with their surfboards on the side are traveling at least 20 miles an hour, some faster. I normally walk on the beach trail. Now I find it easier to just walk along the sand by the water, rather than occasionally dodging e-bikes. I don't believe the beach trail was ever meant for motorized vehicles. Even though I have an e-bike, I would never think to ride it on such a narrow trail with people, dogs and strollers on the pathway. The city should be more concerned about the safety of the community. Since you can't enforce any type of speed limit with these bikes, isn't it time to ban them from the trail?

Why is this law not being enforced in San Clemente? Electric bikes are clearly "motorized vehicles" and drivers of these bikes who appear to be underage or are violating the vehicle and safety traffic laws should be subject to the same penalties as adult drivers. Childrens for unsafe driving, lack of insurance, proper registration of their "vehicles," etc. Moreover, I feel these underage drivers' PARENTS should be held responsible for allowing their kids to possess and drive these bikes on City streets
