SUBSTITUTE MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM DUNCAN, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER KNOBLOCK, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to amend the City Council minutes of January 18, 2022 to reflect Ms. Quintanilla's comments under Item A (Hospital and Health Care: Community Survey Results) to read as follows:

Amanda Quintanilla stated she left San Clemente Hospital after her contract expired because the hospital was understaffed and lacked capabilities; suggested that it would be difficult to recruit quality physicians and surgeons to a San Clemente Hospital, and the City cannot afford the expense.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM DUNCAN, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER KNOBLOCK, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to amend the action on Item 9C (Ballot Measures Concerning the Possibility of Transitioning the Offices of City Treasurer and City Clerk to Appointive Positions) to read as follows:

Council determined to not add ballot measures to the General Municipal Election ballot of November 8, 2022 or Special Municipal Election ballot of June 7, 2022 to question whether the offices of City Clerk and City Treasurer shall be appointive, and directed Staff to agendize a discussion about a potential policy that addresses whether or not a City employee under the City Manager's jurisdiction can also serve as an elected City official.

During the course of discussion, Council directed that future Council minutes include a more-succinct representation of public comments, basically identifying the topic of their remarks as opposed to the specifics of statements made.

6A(2). Special City Council Meeting Minutes of January 24, 2022

R. Martin, San Clemente, requested expansion of the Council meeting minutes of January 24, 2022.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM DUNCAN, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER KNOBLOCK, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to modify the Special Council Meeting minutes of January 24, 2022 to reflect that Ruth Martin's comments under Oral Communications are to read as follows:

Ruth Martin, San Clemente, raised concerns with Beaches, Parks and Recreation scheduling activities at San Gorgonio Park when those activities are going to exceed available parking, which causes overflow traffic to residential surrounding streets and causes families to walk in the middle of the street to get to the park; urged that activities be scheduled to ensure that parking demand can be accommodated at the park.

A. Billing for 2021 Weed Abatement Program

Public Hearing to consider objections or protests, if any, to the costs of the abatement of weeds, rubbish, refuse and dirt upon streets, sidewalks, parkways and private property within the City and to the assignment of these costs to the properties on which the abatement was completed.

Mayor James opened the Public Hearing.

<u>Mike (no last name provided)</u> spoke on the importance of proactive fire suppression efforts to reduce fire insurance rates.

There being no others desiring to speak, the Public Hearing was closed.

Deputy Community Development Director Atamian responded to Council inquiries.

Mayor Pro Tem Duncan, with the support of Mayor James and Councilmember Ward, agendized a Special Presentation by the Orange County Fire Authority concerning fire abatement efforts in City canyons and the potential impact on insurance rates for homeowners.

9. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. High Quality Transit Area Vision Plan

Presentation from the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) concerning the High Quality Transit Area Vision Plan.

Orlando Gonzalez, on behalf of SCAG, narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "San Clemente HQTA Vision Plan" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of Mr. Gonzalez's presentation is on file with the City Clerk.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER KNOBLOCK, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM DUNCAN, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to receive and file the Administrative Report, dated February 1, 2022, and on file with the City Clerk.

B. Feasibility of Annexing Planning Area 5 Agendized at the June 15, 2021 City Council meeting (and deferred from the September 7, 2021 Council meeting) by Mayor James, with the support of Councilmember Ward and Mayor Pro Tem Duncan; directed the City Manager and City Attorney to prepare a Staff report.

Report from the Assistant to the City Manager concerning the feasibility of annexing Rancho Mission Viejo Planning Area 5.

Assistant to the City Manager Savage advised that there is currently no opportunity to annex Planning Area 5.

Carolyn Emery, on behalf of LAFCO, responded to Council inquiries.

Council noted the importance of engaging in a dialogue with Rancho Mission Viejo with regard to its development plans for residences, amenities, etc.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM DUNCAN, SECOND BY MAYOR JAMES, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to receive and file the Administrative Report, dated February 1, 2022, which is on file with the City Clerk.

C. <u>Consideration of Expanding Smoking Ban</u> Agendized at the November 2, 2021 City Council meeting by Councilmember Duncan, with the support of Mayor James.

Rick Loeffler spoke in support of a smoking ban.

Hoiyin Ip spoke in support of a smoking ban.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM DUNCAN, SECOND BY MAYOR JAMES, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to direct Staff to work with Best, Best & Krieger to draft a Code amendment to enact a Citywide ban on smoking and vaping in public areas for Council consideration in May 2022. The draft Ordinance is to be considered by the Human Affairs Committee and Public Safety Committee before being submitted to Council. Council requested that a survey of smoking regulations in place in other cities be compiled.

D. <u>RFP for Legal Services</u> Agendized at the January 18, 2022 City Council meeting by Councilmember Knoblock, with the support of Councilmember Ferguson.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER WARD to take no action.

SUBSITUTE MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER KNOBLOCK, SECOND BY MAYOR JAMES, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to direct Staff to commence the City Attorney evaluation process in early March 2022 and that Council expedite its evaluations. Any potential subsequent steps will be discussed in Closed Session.

City Manager Sund reported that he executed the following contracts under his signature authority: 1) contract for \$49,500 with Mitra Automation for on-call electrical and control system engineering for the City's SCADA system; and 2) contract for \$16,000 with Theresa Dobbs for the ARP social services grant program.

Sewer Force Line Break at Cyprus Shores

<u>Legislative Update (Bill to Prohibit Insurance Companies from</u> Redlining Canyons in Urban Areas Where Fire Protection is High)

Council directed that the City's lobbyist (Aprea & Micheli) provide a report at its March 1, 2022 meeting relative to current legislation in which it currently advocates for the City's interests. A segment of that report is to address any existing bills, or possible new bill, to prohibit insurance companies from redlining canyons in urban areas where fire protection is high.

<u>Donna Vidrine</u> spoke on the need for compassion for the unsheltered. <u>Jenifer Massey</u>, San Clemente, commented on the need for a place for homeless persons to store their belongings.

<u>Judy Jones</u>, San Clemente, urged modifications to Ordinance No. 1722. <u>Darryl McFann</u>, San Clemente, spoke on the need to address shopping carts and mattresses.

<u>Stuart Anderson</u>, San Clemente, spoke on the need for designated safe spaces for storage of the belongings of the unhoused.

<u>Kent Doss</u> spoke on the importance of homeless persons retaining their belongings for basic survival.

Rona Henry spoke on the importance of dignity for homeless persons.

<u>Bill Kreutinger</u>, San Clemente, explained his belief that Ordinance No. 1722 goes too far.

<u>Kathy Esfahani</u> spoke on the need to make life easier for homeless people until affordable housing is built.

<u>Rick Loeffler</u> spoke in support of Ordinance No. 1722 to preserve quality of life.

Maura Mikulec spoke on the need for affordable housing and a local shelter.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER WARD. SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER KNOBLOCK, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER FERGUSON ABSENT), to adopt Ordinance No. 1722 entitled AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA AMENDING TITLES 8 AND 12 OF THE SAN CLEMENTE MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING SHOPPING CARTS, CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC **STORAGE** OF **PERSONAL** PROPERTY AND FINDING THE ORDINANCE NOT SUBJECT TO THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT.
