City Attorney Smith narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "San Clemente Habitat Protection Plan" and announced that Council, during Closed Session, approved a settlement agreement with the Save San Onofre Coalition; identified the major tenets of the settlement and advised that the vote to approve the agreement was made by Councilmember Knoblock, seconded by Mayor James and carried 4-1 (Councilmember Ferguson voting noe).

- 4. Authorize a related budget appropriation of \$329,535 to the CDBG fund for the amounts in the 2022-23 Action Plan.

## B. Weed Abatement Program 2022

Public Hearing to consider all objections or protests, if any, to the proposed abatement of weeds, rubbish, refuse and dirt upon streets, sidewalks, parkways and private property within the City of San Clemente.

Mayor James opened the Public Hearing.

Mike (no last name provided) opined that the goal of weed abatement should be fire safety as opposed to aesthetics.

There being no others desiring to speak to this issue, the Public Hearing was closed.

Economic Development Officer Lightfoot reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report and responded to Council inquiries.

#### **Downtown Area Parking**

Mayor James commented on the need for additional parking resources in the downtown area and to evaluate parking time restrictions in the downtown parking lots. City Manager Sund noted that the Senior Center parking lot will be available for parking on evenings and weekends; advised that Community Development will be able to evaluate the public parking lots and provide a recommendation to Council at a future meeting.

#### **National Police Week**

Councilmember Ferguson, with the support of Mayor Pro Tem Duncan, recognized San Clemente Police Services/OCSD for National Police Week and requested that information be placed on the City's social media pages.

#### **Desalination Project Support**

Mayor James proposed that the support letter for a desalination project, that was approved at the April 19, 2022 Council meeting, be agendized to enable Council to consider holding the letter in abeyance pending a community poll and consideration of rate implications. This item will not be agendized because the proposal failed to receive support by another Councilmember.

## Campaign Finance Transparency

Mayor James, with the support of Councilmember Knoblock, agendized the possibility of enacting improvements to the City's website to facilitate transparency of campaign finances. The possibility of making FPPC campaign finance forms searchable is to be specifically addressed.

## **Double Tracking**

Mayor James presented a PowerPoint from the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) entitled "San Diego Pathing Study, Final Report" and voiced concern that the report purports that double tracking is needed in San Clemente to alleviate a bottleneck situation. A hard copy of the presentation is on file with the City Clerk.

It was agreed that City Manager Sund will arrange meetings with subgroups of the City Council (not to exceed two Councilmembers per meeting) with SANDAG and/or OCTA with regard to the double-tracking issue. Council will determine if a Special Presentation is needed at a Council meeting following the conclusion of the sub-group meetings.

## Meeting with County Officials Concerning Vagrancy

Mayor James, with the support of Councilmember Ferguson and Councilmember Knoblock, requested the City Manager schedule a meeting with Sheriff Barnes, County Counsel, District Attorney Spitzer and Supervisor Bartlett to discuss the issue of vagrancy.
