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#### 1. **CALL TO ORDER**

The Joint Meeting was called to order by Mayor James at 6:03 p.m.

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance

Charlie Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 3. COMMISSION/COMMITTEE REPORTS

#### **Planning Commission**

Chair McKhann reported that the Planning Commission is evaluating permit streamlining opportunities, reviewing specific plan updates, continuing to update the Housing Element and continuing work on the Local Coastal Plan with the California Coastal Commission.

#### **Golf Course Committee**

Chair Divel reviewed the history of the municipal golf course and reported the municipal golf course has seen a 10% increase in rounds over the previous year; acknowledged the hard work of staff to maintain the facility.

#### **Investment Advisory Committee**

Committee Member Carter reported on the priorities of the Investment Advisory Committee and the long term planning to allow funds to be available for City projects. Additionally Committee Member Carter addressed the current economic inflation, how it has affected the City's investments and the removal of super national investments from the City's portfolio.

#### **Human Affairs Committee**

Chair Edone reported that the Human Affairs Committee is establishing priorities for the upcoming year and has started working on several new programs within the City that include: a trade program for students who are not college bound, homeless resource fair, and every 15 minutes and safe rides program for high school students.

#### Beaches, Parks and Recreation Commission

Commissioner Feuerstein reviewed the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Commission's accomplishments for the previous year which included updates on the site specific master plans, playground alternatives for San Gorgonio and Steed Parks, review of the recreation reservation system, and the review of mural placement. For the upcoming year, the Commission plans to work on the following projects: sand replenishment, fee study, process review for sports partnership, and site-specific plan for Steed Park.

#### **Public Safety Committee**

Committee Member Loeffler provided an overview of the Public Safety Committee's accomplishments for the previous year, which includes working with staff, Council and Public Safety (Orange County Sheriff's Department, Orange County Fire Authority, and Marine Safety) to address storage of private property on public property, removal of shopping carts, and maintenance of bicycles in public. Additionally, the committee has worked with the community and the I-5 Freedom Network to reduce human trafficking. For the upcoming year, the Committee will work on e-bike safety, emergency planning, and establishing citywide neighborhood watch programs.

### 5. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

<u>Concerned Citizen</u> commented on the integrity of staff and information provided to Council and Commission/Committees and equal quality of life.

<u>Warren Vidrine</u> commented in support of various projects within the City including sand replenishment, e-bike safety, desalination, energy alliance and voting by district.

<u>Donna Vidrine</u> commented on the Public Safety Committee and the need for action on emergency preparedness and neighborhood watch program.

Amanda Q commented on the town hall meeting concerning Max Berg Plaza Park and efforts to clean the area.
