1. CALL TO ORDER

Committee Chair Berkuta called the Regular Meeting of the Public Safety Committee of the City of San Clemente to order at 3:02p.m.

4. REGULAR ORDERS OF BUSINESS / REGULAR PRESENTATIONS

A. <u>Informational Presentation on Community Food Insecurity as a Result of a Major Disaster by Mike Learakos, Executive Director of Abound Food Care.</u>

Mike Learakos narrated a PowerPoint Presentation entitled, "The Emergency Meal Program." Mr. Learakos described his experience providing large scale emergency meals to the community during the L.A. Riots. Recently the State of California passed SB1383 requiring commercial food recycling. Abound Food Care provides options for food recycling by operating food repurposing kitchens at culinary schools. They process bulk food into individual prepackaged meals for local nonprofits, helping seniors, people with medical/special dietary needs, and local families displaced by apartment fires or other emergencies.

Mr. Learakos requested that the Committee consider, as part of disaster preparedness, the City provide potential locations for a storage unit that would hold emergency meals.

6. ORAL AND WRITTEN COMMUNICATION

Chair Berkuta reported Captain Capobianco had communicated he was unable to attend due to traveling out of state.

7. REVIEWS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

8. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. Communications and Disaster Preparedness Project Update

Committee Member Loeffler and Chair Berkuta agendized for the next meeting, consideration of disaster preparedness recommendation to City Council to utilize space at the City Yard for emergency food storage and coordinating with Abound Food Care.

B. <u>Homeless and Best Management Practices for Public Safety Personnel Project Update</u>

Committee Member Loeffler educated the Committee on recent ordinances passed by Los Angeles to address homelessness. They restricted camping on the sidewalk when too close to a fire hydrant, obstructs driveways or accessible passage required by the Americans with Disabilities Act, or interferes with lawfully permitted events.

C. Legislative Review Project Update

Committee Member Loeffler discussed a recent bill in California State Legislature (AB26), which requires police officers to intervene and report if another officer is using excessive force.

He also discussed Huntington Beach, Long Beach and Los Angeles passing ordinances against bicycle repair on public property as a way to address bicycle theft.

D. Neighborhood Watch Project Update

Deputy Director Atamian reported that the neighborhood watch website, the committee was working on, is now active. Staff will continue working on it.

E. Human Trafficking Project Update

Committee Member Loeffler noted that Priority One of this item had been completed with the recommendations sent to City Council for the May 25, 2022 meeting. The Committee will continue to work on and will make additional recommendations to the City Council on Priorities Two and Three.

F. Traffic and E-Bicycle Safety

Captain Mellott reported that the Marine Safety division had prepared an informational video promoting bicycle safety and notifying the public of the new E-Bike regulations. However, the Beaches/Parks/Recreation Department has not been able to finish signage causing enforcement of the E-Bike ordinance to possibly be delayed until signage was installed.

Captain Benfield reported that OCSD is sponsoring a Bike Safety Rodeo on Thursday, May 26 from 3:00-5:00pm to educate children and families on safely sharing the roads.

He also reported that OCSD has been using body cameras for several months and are working towards upgrading to synchronize them with the cameras in police vehicles. The camera data has caused additional costs for data maintenance and storage which is detailed in the City budget. He also described a disturbing new crime trend of mass theft of golf carts late at night by criminals using rented moving trucks.

Captain Mellott reported that Marine Safety has recently produced an educational video for National Beach Safety Week. They have also restarted the junior lifeguard program. There was so much interest that all spots are filled and 649 on the wait list. He also reported Marine Safety has performed 63 rescues in the last two months, mostly due to rip tides. Plus City staff is working on beach sand replenishment with funds from a federal grant.

Deputy Director Atamian reported that the City contract for license plate readers is in progress and has been routed for signatures. He also reported that the Committee-recommended Catalytic Converter Ordinance is going to Council for review at the June 21 meeting.

Public Works Director Kiel Koger reported that City staff has identified the Community Center as a mass care site for emergency planning. He is continuing to work with the Beaches, Parks, and Recreation Director to review other potential mass care sites such as the Vista Hermosa Sports Park and San Clemente High School.
