#### **AGENDA**

A. <u>Review of City's Traffic Calming Policy and Speed Hump Policy</u> (Ponsen-Engineering)

Engineering Division staff Zak Ponsen (Assistant City Engineer) and Ryan Kim (Senior Traffic Engineer) will provided an overview of the City's Traffic Calming Policy & Resource Manual and the City's Speed Hump Policy, an explanation of the application process, staff's technical review parameters, and the Planning Commission/City Council Agenda process.

Zachary Ponsen, narrated a PowerPoint Presentation entitled, "Traffic Calming Study Session," dated November 16, 2022. A copy of the Presentation is on file in Planning Division. The Presentation included the Traffic Calming Policy and

Process, measures/tools and examples of traffic calming measures in practice on City streets.

## COMMISSION COMMENT/DISCUSSION

- Discussion regarding potential changes in fees for submission of Traffic Calming Measures applications from citizens and/or suggestion to increase minimum number of residents signing on at time of submission. The Commissioners largely rejected these suggestions because it is in the interest of public safety that the traffic calming measures were created and the existing minimum is adequate.
- Recommended staff update the construction cost estimates for the various measures for an accurate picture of what the expenses will be before extensive research is performed/measures are considered as potential solutions.
- Recommended staff update the flow chart/packet info for a clearer picture of the variety of speed calming measures that must be considered before speed cushions would be considered as a viable option.
- Established with staff that "speed cushions" is the specific variety of humps that have been approved for use by the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA), as they pose no decrease in response time for emergency vehicles.
