<u>Greg Sanders</u>, Counsel for Memorial Care, commented on conversations he had with City Attorney Smith concerning legal challenges to the proposed senior housing and medical office project; noted he is available to respond to legal questions related to the senior housing and medical office project located at 654 Camino de los Mares.

<u>Aaron Washington</u> urged Council to oppose the proposed senior housing and medical office project due to the size and scope.

<u>Beverly Wiesen</u>, San Clemente, spoke in opposition to the project and on the organization of a referendum.

William Boezinger, San Clemente, urged Council to side with concerned citizens and oppose the proposed project.

<u>Kathy Esfahani</u>, Chair of the San Clemente Affordable Housing Coalition, spoke in support of the proposed project and spoke on comments made in support of the proposed project at the November 1, 2022 City Council Meeting.

<u>Denise Fleury</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of the proposed senior housing and medical office project.

Rona Henry spoke in support of the proposed project as it relates to potential impacts on the City and the 'builders remedy'.

<u>Stuart Anderson</u>, San Clemente, spoke in favor of the proposed project and potential impacts to the City if the project is denied.

<u>Jacky Trani</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of the proposed project.

Ken Rogers, San Clemente, spoke in opposition to the proposed project; the need for story polls and potential impacts to the City.

<u>Linda Rogers</u>, San Clemente, spoke in opposition to the proposed project due to size, scope and safety concerns.

James Watkins, San Clemente, spoke in support of the proposed project.

Grace Todd, San Clemente, spoke in support of the proposed project.

<u>Connor Medina</u>, Orange County Business Council, spoke in support of the proposed project and the need for additional housing in Orange County.

<u>Tom Leary</u>, Vice President of Memorial Care, spoke on the origins of the proposed project and the relationship with the City.

Wayne Eggleston, San Clemente, spoke in opposition of the proposed project and the perception of a conflict of interest; opined the proposed project needs additional study and suggested putting this project on the ballot.
