A Regular Meeting of the Coastal Animal Services Authority was called to order by Chair Federico on December 5, 2022 at 8:07 a.m. at San Clemente City Hall, located at 910 Calle Negocio, San Clemente, in the Community Conference Room.

The CASA Meeting was called to order at 8:07 a.m. with all members present.

2. Approval of CASA Meeting Minutes

MOTION BY Federico to approve the Payroll Warrants and Registers for the period of 6/13/22-6/27/22 and 9/5/22-10/21/22, pending review by James.

4. ITEMS FROM THE STAFF

Fee Study

Jeff reviewed specifics of the Fee Study, which included staff time and material costs in comparison to our current fees, and what fee changes are proposed by staff, with the biggest changes being made to impound, boarding, vaccination and adoption fees.

Staff also recommends a new fee for our vicious/potentially dangerous dogs. Jeff states both municipal codes may need to be updated to reflect this change in fees. Staff is recommending the new fee schedule be adopted with a start date of July 1, 2023.

Federico would like our overhead costs to be taken into account, such as the utility bills, cost of ACO vehicles, etc. Federico requests staff go back and review, and include those costs in the next report.

James asked what the vaccinations actually cost us?

Jen states that PPF pays for the medical supply bills, so the cost is actually incurred by PPF. As an example a rabies vaccine costs \$3.80.

James asked if PPF was OK with the fees being charged?

Stephanie said she would need to look at the changes and take it to the PPF Board, however she said that PPF generally supports that the fees match what is realistic in today's market, and that we are cognizant of what other Shelters are charging.

Federico agreed that our adoption fees should be competitive, but we should also consider not just other shelters, but also the rescue groups.

Jill states that many private rescues are charging in the \$600 range for adoptions.

Jen states that our fees are competitive and in line with the local Shelters.

Federico would like confirmation that our costs would not be less or in any way impacted by the fact that PPF financially supports some of the medical expenses. Such as, if PPF were to ever stop paying for or reimbursing for those items, the cost of those items would not change?

Federico asked about the data on Attachment E *Licensing*. Is this the total of licenses we process per month?

Jeff states, yes, these are the totals per month over the last 20 months.

Federico states it was higher than he thought, however, we know that with 100,000 residents, 60,000 households we are missing a percentage.

Federico asked if there is a reason some months are far lower, such as the last 2 months' license numbers were low.

Jen said it tends to ebb and flow. Some years one month's licenses will be high and then the following year the same month it will take a large dip.

Jeff said it depends largely on the option to purchase a 1, 2 or 3 year license. Staff is proposing we only offer 1 year licensing.

James recommends we send reminders in our utility bills, or do an information campaign, on the advantages of licensing. Whether it is in our utility bills, websites, etc.

Jill said we do have some very nice postcards regarding licensing and the importance. We do hand them out and some of the vets will put them out to clients, but sometimes they don't want to push licensing to their clientele.

Jen states one of our big focuses in our change over to Chameleon Licensing will be getting the vet's to comply with the rabies reporting. PetData is supposed to be gathering that information, however, they don't put the effort into getting it from those vets that don't supply the required certificates.

James asked if we know the percentage of licensing in San Clemente vs Dana Point?

Jen states she does not know the percentage/compliance difference between the two cities, but overall we're about 50% based on the available online calculators, but she doesn't feel it is that high.

James was curious if there is a licensing discrepancy between the two cities?

Federico believes with increased licensing compliance and revenue we can look at covering additional staffing costs, etc.

Federico requests staff go back and take another look at the Fee Study, including overhead/utilities. Please work with PPF on any changes to adoption fees.

Staffing Report

Jeff reviewed options for staffing to keep part-time employees under 1,000/year in response to Cal-Pers.

No changes need to be made to admin positions.

We are averaging 2-3,000 hours per year in both the Animal Care and Animal Control areas.

At 2,000 hours/yr we are providing minimal services to the community.

3,000 hours/yr is more appropriate and what our communities expect.

Options for staffing levels include:

Option #1- Hire one FTE Animal Control Officer, keep one part-time under 1,000 and Hire one FTE Kennel Attendant, keep one part-time under 1,000.

Option #2- Hire one FTE Animal Control Officer, keep one part-time under 1,000 and have three part-time Kennel Attendants under 1,000 hours.

Option #3- Have two-three Animal Control Officers keeping them under 1,000 and three part-time Kennel Attendants under 1,000 hours.

Fiscal impact for a FTE Kennel Attendant is \$63,000 per year and an FTE Animal Control Officer is \$100,000.

Federico clarified the difference in cost of \$20,000, is for additional FTE hours and less part-time employee hours, plus full-time benefits.

Board to receive and file this report until a decision is made on Cal-Pers.

Kennel Attendant costs would need to be discussed with PPF. The kennel attendant hours impact the animals and PPF more so than the public.

Federico asked if quality employees can be hired for part-time hours? States his initial instinct is to hire additional part-time Kennel staff and seriously consider an FTE Animal Control Officer.

James agrees that an FTE Animal Control Officer makes sense to provide professionalism out in the public.

Federico wants to be able to retain employees. He would like to continue with the two FTE Kennel staff and hire another part-time Kennel Attendant to spread the work out.

Roofing

Roofing project is complete with an end cost of about \$75,000.

Jeff proposed four projects with the rest of the budget allotted to the roof replacement.

Power fans on the roof need replacement. Approximate cost \$12-15,000. Replacement of the windows in the kennels.

Painting the lobby, offices, cat room and kennels if needed.

Landscaping in the courtyard, donor walls and sight line walls. Staff is not proposing any work be done at this time, but that we have a landscape architect draw up plans. Cost \$5,000.

James met Joe from JRT Roofing and said he is very involved in the community and may be a good partner for PPF to reach out to.

Board approves Staff go ahead with projects.

Federico wants to be sure, donor walls and other PPF related projects aside, that CASA is taking on the fiscal responsibility of things like the ADA compliance and all items unrelated to PPF.

Municipal Code Update

Jill has spent time working with the attorney on red-lining a few items. However, staff requests more time to look at them and work with staff in both cities to put something together that makes more sense.

James would like the codes of each City to reflect one another.

Licensing Update

Staff is meeting with Chameleon IT to start getting our website together.

Jill has been working on getting our PetData files uploaded into Chameleon.

City of San Clemente IT Department has updated the Shelter lobby computers.

Chameleon anticipates a month or more until it is up and running.

Shelter Operations

Staff is looking to provide data reports at each meeting, so the Board can get an idea of what is happening at the Shelter.

5. **ITEMS FROM THE BOARD**

Federico announced that the labor agreement was signed with the employees. CASA is not asking PPF to reimburse for the extra hourly cost for the Kennel Attendant positions. So, Finance will need to separate the extra cost. Funding Agreement between CASA/PPF expires beginning of 2024.

James thanked the labor negotiating teams.

James requested we look at the possibility of leasing the trucks the next time they are due for replacement.

James requested an update on Cal-Pers at the next meeting.

6. **ITEMS FROM THE CITY**

None.

7. <u>ITEMS FROM PET PROJECT FOUNDATION (PPF)</u>

Stephanie Cocumelli with Pet Project Foundation provided the following updates:

Kennel Project

Will begin January 11, 2023. There are no price increase for the kennels themselves. There was an increase to flooring.

Fundraising around the project will be significant with a donor wall, kennel sponsorships and courtyard/landscaping would be central to fundraising.

James asked if there will be different levels of sponsorships?

Stephanie said there will be and PPF has a fundraising committee overseeing that.

We have currently raised \$40,000 toward the project. Half of which was from a local couple that did not want public recognition for it.

Strategic Planning

PPF will start planning in January, meeting date is TBD, and is open to any and all participants.

Three main points they are looking at are the Operating Contract, Fundraising and Costs Outpacing Fundraising. The higher costs are mainly medical expenses. Since 2020 PPF has seen an increase in veterinary and medicine costs of 57%.

James asked about the logistics of our medical care.

Jen said we regularly use 6-8 vets with varying degrees of free or discounted services. Over the past couple years we have seen the offers of those services dwindle with the changing marketplace and change in ownership of some our local hospitals.

James would like to offer the Board's assistance as needed.

Federico said this is related to our Strategic Planning. Can we contract with someone? Let's consider an RFP to the local vets.

James asked if there is any downside to contract with fewer vets?

Jen said we have seen less availability for appointments and we are having a hard time getting our spay/neuters scheduled in a timely manner.

One idea Jen and Stephanie have discussed is the possibility of building a surgery suite at the Shelter and contracting with a surgeon to come in. We could get our Shelter pets' surgeries done, but we could also open it up to the public as well, offering low cost services to our residents.

Jill said it would also have a positive impact on our Animal Control budget and availability, as reducing their vet runs would open up more time for patrols, better response time, etc.

Board states they support PPF and staff look further into that idea.
