C. March Update on the Homeless Issue

Deputy Community Development Director Atamian narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Community Outreach & Engagement Monthly Report - March 2023" and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of the presentation is on file with the City Clerk.

Following discussion, Council requested future Community Outreach and Engagement monthly reports include the number of individuals placed in housing that return to being homeless and the number of individuals placed in housing that are no longer under case management by the City.

Nancy McIntyre, San Clemente, urged Council to work with organizations for permanent supportive housing and affordable housing in San Clemente.

<u>Stuart Anderson</u>, San Clemente, encouraged Council to pursue additional options such as shelters or alternative sleeping locations within San Clemente to address homelessness.

<u>Jacky Trani</u>, San Clemente, opined on the need for supportive housing and safe parking sites with mental health assistance for the homeless.

<u>Lucia Bonnaud</u>, San Clemente, urged leadership from Council to provide compassionate care and assistance for the homeless.

<u>Denise Fleury</u>, San Clemente, opined that San Clemente needs a comprehensive plan to provide housing and support services for the homeless.

<u>Kathy Esfahani</u>, San Clemente Housing Coalition, opined on solutions for homelessness and the need for additional resources for south Orange County.

<u>Donna Vidrine</u>, San Clemente, encouraged the City to come together and work towards a solution for a coordinated comprehensive plan concerning homelessness.

<u>Maura Mikulec</u> shared statistics regarding homelessness and housing in Orange County.

<u>Shelley Moore</u> commented on the homeless in San Clemente and liability to the City.

<u>Michelle Brooks</u> opined that the City needs assistance from the County and State to address homelessness; suggested Council needs to hear from all residents regarding the homeless.

<u>Jill Watson</u> spoke on arrest reports and crimes committed in San Clemente; opined that many homeless individuals are from out of area.

<u>Sara Martin</u> opined that the homeless and service resistant individuals need to be addressed; expressed safety concerns with activities at the beaches in San Clemente.

<u>Cord Bauer</u>, San Clemente, opined that the City is understaffed when it comes to sheriff deputies; voiced concern with the negative impacts to City staff and residents as a result of feeding the homeless.
