BUSINESS MEETING

The Regular Business Meeting convened at 6:41 p.m., with all Councilmembers present.

A. **Employee Service Awards**

D RATIFICATION OF EMERGENCY CONTRACT - REPLACEMENT OF INDUSTRIAL DUTY DOOR AT WATER RECLAMATION PLANT

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER CABRAL, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM KNOBLOCK, CARRIED 4-0, to:

- Make a finding that an emergency existed due to the failure of the industrial duty rolling steel door and operator at the Water Reclamation Plant which required immediate action to protect public health and safety by maintaining permit compliance, that might have otherwise occurred if required to incur delays attributed to the typical engineering design and public competitive bidding process.
- 2. Declare that the public interest and necessity demanded the immediate expenditure of public funds to safeguard public health.

A. WEED ABATEMENT 2023 - ORDER TO ABATE NUISANCES BY HAVING WEEDS, RUBBISH, AND REFUSE, REMOVED FROM VACANT AND UNOCCUPIED, DEVELOPED PROPERTIES AND FINDING THE PROJECT CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) UNDER SECTIONS 15301, 15308, AND 15321 OF THE CEQA GUIDELINES

Public Hearing to consider all objections or protests, if any, to the proposed abatement of weeds, rubbish, refuse, and dirt upon the streets, sidewalks, parkways and private property within the City of San Clemente and a categorical exemption for the project under CEQA.

Deputy Community Development Director Atamian reviewed the contents of the Administrative Report and responded to Council inquiries.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM KNOBLOCK, SECOND COUNCILMEMBER ENMEIER, CARRIED 4-0, to adopt Resolution No. 23-23 entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, ORDERING THE DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO ABATE THE NUISANCES BY HAVING WEEDS, RUBBISH, REFUSE AND DIRT REMOVED FROM **PROPERTIES** AND UNOCCUPIED. DEVELOPED PROPERTIES WITHIN THE CITY, NOTIFYING THE STATE, COUNTY, OR ANY OTHER PUBLIC AGENCY AND FINDING THE PROJECT CATEGORICALLY **EXEMPT** FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) UNDER SECTIONS 15301, 15308, AND 15321 OF THE CEQA GUIDELINES (14 CCR § 15301(h), CLASS 1: EXISTING FACILITIES, 15308, CLASS 8: ACTIONS BY REGULATORY AGENCIES FOR PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT, AND 15321, CLASS 21: ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS BY REGULATORY AGENCIES).

Public Hearing concerning consideration of adopting a Local Vendor Preference Ordinance, which would establish a local vendor preference of seven percent for professional and other contractual services.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER CABRAL, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER ENMEIER, CARRIED 4-0, to introduce Ordinance No. 1750 entitled AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING AND REPLACING SAN CLEMENTE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 3 REVENUE AND FINANCE, CHAPTER 3.40, SECTION 3.40.030 RELATING TO A LOCAL VENDOR PREFERENCE.

C. RICHARD T. STEED MEMORIAL PARK/BARON VON WILLARD DOG PARK MASTER PLAN UPDATE, CERTIFICATION OF INITIAL STUDY AND ADOPTION OF MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND MITIGATION, MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM FOR THE PROJECT

Public Hearing to consider the adoption of a site-specific master plan update to Richard T. Steed Memorial Park, certification of the Initial Study and adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration, Monitoring and Reporting Program.

Beaches, Parks and Recreation Director Wylie narrated a PowerPoint presentation entitled Richard T. Steed Memorial Park/Baron Von Willard Master Plan Update and responded to Council inquiries. A hard copy of Ms. Wylie's presentation is on file with the City Clerk.

Mayor Duncan opened the Public Hearing.

<u>Vern West</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of pickleball; urged Council to adopt the Master Plan.

<u>David Browning</u>, Orange County Mountain Bike Association, spoke in support of the master plan and mountain bike hub.

<u>Steve Larson</u>; Orange County Mountain Bike Association spoke in support of the master plan and mountain bike hub.

<u>AQ</u> opined that there was no parking study associated with the environmental study on this project; voiced concern with the cost of the project.

<u>Linda Williams</u>, San Clemente, spoke in support of pickleball and the Steed Park Master Plan.

<u>Concerned Resident</u>, opined that the Beaches, Parks and Recreation Commission did not have the opportunity to review the CEQA findings for the Steed Park Master Plan until after the comment period expired.

There being no one else desiring to speak, the Public Hearing was closed.

- 1. Approve the update to the Richard T. Steed Memorial Park Master Plan with the modification that lights be considered at the pickleball courts in future development.
- Adopt Resolution No. 23-24 entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, CERTIFYING AN INITIAL STUDY, ADOPTING A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND ADOPTING A MITIGATION, MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM FOR THE RICHARD T. STEED MEMORIAL PARK/BARON VON WILLARD DOG PARK MASTER PLAN UPDATE.

- 1. Adopt Resolution No. 23-26 entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PREPARE AND EXECUTE THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE PROFESSIONAL CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN PRECISION CIVIL ENGINEERING, INC. AND THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE FOR PLANNING CONSULTING SERVICES TO IMPLEMENT THE HOUSING ELEMENT REZONING PROGRAM.
- Approve, and authorize the City Manager to execute, Amendment No. 1 to Contract No. AC-1099, by and between the City of San Clemente and Precision Civil Engineering, Inc., providing for the Housing Element Rezoning Program. This amendment increases the contract amount from \$50,000 to an amount not to exceed \$104,000 (an increase of \$54,000).

Marcus Vanneman, San Clemente, noted that he is one of the developers on the project; spoke in support of the lease.

<u>Andrew Street</u>, noted he is a developer for the project; urged Council to move forward with the lease.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM KNOBLOCK, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER CABRAL, CARRIED 4-0, to adopt Resolution No. 23-27 entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING EXCLUSIVE NEGOTIATIONS WITH SALTY TURF LLC FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND LEASE OF CITY PROPERTY AT 987 AVENIDA VISTA HERMOSA.

- Adopt Resolution No. 23-28 entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, DIRECTING CITY STAFF TO SEND A NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING PURSUANT TO PROPOSITION 218 AND SCHEDULING A PUBLIC HEARING ON SEWER RATES.

C. UPDATE ON COASTAL ADMINISTRATOR POSITION (Agendized at the April 4, 2023 City Council meeting by Councilmember Cabral, with the support of Council.)

City Manager Hall reported that he and Councilmember Cabral met with the Coastal Administrator in Oceanside to determine the model for the newly created position; noted that this position will be included in the upcoming budget.
