Sue Reese, Advisory Board Member, presented the Groundswell annual report.

B. Presentation of Commendation - Patricia Hurtado

Amanda Q recognized Patricia Hurtado for her heroic actions on May 26, 2023.

Mayor Duncan presented a commendation to Patricia Hurtado in recognition of her heroic act at the San Clemente Pier on May 26, 2023.

2. Oral Communications (Part 1)

<u>Cord Bauer</u>, San Clemente, spoke on the illegal activity at North Beach and the need for additional enforcement.

<u>Lisa Edone</u> commented on the City's mission statement as it relates to safety; spoke on safety concerns in the City.

<u>Decline</u>, San Clemente, requested that the City eliminate Coastal Commission oversight and assume responsibility for approvals as other neighboring cities have.

<u>Cameron Cosgrove</u>, San Clemente, recognized Council for hiring four additional deputies; opined that the City should utilize park rangers to address low priority safety issues at North Beach.

<u>Suzie Whitelaw</u>, Save our Beaches San Clemente, opined that the Coastal Zone Administrator position should not be tasked with overseeing the Local Coastal Program.

<u>Joe Janis</u>, San Clemente, spoke on the increase in crime in the T-Zone; opined that private security should be approved for a trial period.

Lois McNicoll expressed concern about the incident at the pier with the Marines and local youth on May 26, 2023; opined that the City needs to hire private

security to address safety concerns.

Wayne Eggleston, San Clemente, expressed concerns regarding the incident with Marines and local youth on May 26, 2023; opined that the incident has damaged the City's reputation and relationship with the Marines.

<u>Darryl McFann</u>, San Clemente, expressed concerns with the incident at the pier with Marines and local youth on May 26, 2023; opined that the City should utilize private security to address safety concerns.

<u>Clive Makinson-Sanders</u>, San Clemente, commented on juveniles congregating in Trafalgar Canyon and participating in illegal activity; noted the potential danger to the residents.

<u>Jill Watson</u>, San Clemente, commented on the incident between Marines and local youth at the Pier on May 26, 2023; opined that San Clemente needs to hire private security.

Amanda Q expressed concerns that witnesses to the incident at the pier between Marines and a large group of local kids, were not able to provide a statement to San Clemente Police Services due to English not being their primary language; opined that the City should hire a private security firm; suggested that the City consider hiring a lobbyist for sand replenishment in lieu of hiring a Coastal Zone Administrator.

<u>Concerned Resident</u> opined that Council's priorities should be safety for the residents as well as sand replenishment for San Clemente beaches.

<u>Tom Garrett</u> spoke in support of private security; voiced concern with the impact of crime to the residents.

<u>Angelo Pasciuti</u> commented on the incident on May 26, 2023 between Marines and local youth; opined that there should be a Marine liaison to work with the Marines and the community to repair division.

Place, access, operate, repair and maintain one solar powered cold storage unit, with dimensions of approximately 40' x 8' x 10' with solar panel extensions, to store ready-to-heat-and-eat meals ("Storage Container") as part of the Emergency Nutritious Food Management Program ("Program") on the City Property, for the purpose of providing meals to community members in times of disaster. Licensee will be solely responsible for managing and distributing the meals pursuant to its own policies and procedures, with City having no liability, or role in managing or maintaining the Storage Container or Program. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Licensee shall consult with City regarding its policies and procedures for managing and distributing the meals, which shall be subject to the City's approval.
