ORDINANCE NO. 1758

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SECTION 2.29.015 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE REGARDING THE COASTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE'S MISSION STATEMENT

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2023, the San Clemente City Council adopted Ordinance No. 1753, which created a Coastal Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the mission statement of the newly formed Coastal Advisory Committee should be modified.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of San Clemente, California, hereby ordains as follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> Section 2.42.010 of the San Clemente Municipal Code, relating to the Coastal Advisory Committee, is hereby modified to read in its entirety as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto (<u>underlines</u> reflect additions and strikeouts reflect deletions).

Section 2: If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase added by this Ordinance, or any part thereof, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases are declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

<u>Section 3.</u> The revision to Code Chapter 2.29 as set forth in Exhibit A of this Ordinance shall become effective on October 5, 2023.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause it, or a summary thereof, to be published once within fifteen (15) days of adoption in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published within the City of San Clemente, and shall post a certified copy of this ordinance, including the vote for and against the same, in the Office of the City Clerk in accordance with California Government Code Section 36933.

EXHIBIT A

2.29.015 - Mission

The Coastal Advisory Committee exists to address coastal concerns on San Clemente Beaches with its primary mission being sand replenishment and retention. The Coastal Advisory Committee will seek to further the enhancement and enjoyment of San Clemente Beaches through preservation and restoration through beach nourishment and retention, to preserve, enhance, and where necessary, restore the quality of the coastal water resources and ensure proper and efficient use of the beaches, surf zone and coastal area for the benefit of present and future generations. The Committee shall strive to raise public awareness in promoting a positive environmental stewardship for the greater good of the San Clemente area.

The Committee shall advise the City Council by making recommendations on policy, programs and regulations related to the City's coastal environment and resources. Additionally, the Committee shall work to raise public awareness and promote a shared environmental vision by facilitating partnerships between State and local departments, community groups and businesses. In carrying out its mission the Committee shall promote forward-looking solutions regarding coastal resource issues including, but not limited to, air and water quality, pollution prevention, beach and coastal zone preservation, stewardship, solid waste reduction/recycling and sustainability.
