Staff Recommendation

- 2. Approve, and authorize the City Manager to execute, Contract No. C23-48, by and between the City of San Clemente and WestAmerica Communications, Inc., providing for printing services for the quarterly recreation magazine for a term of two (2) years, in an amount not to exceed \$114,576, plus a 5% contingency of \$5,728, per year, for a total not to exceed contract amount of \$120,304 annually.

G. <u>CONSIDERATION OF PARTICIPATION IN SANDAG REGIONAL BEACH</u> SAND PROJECT III

Staff Recommendation

Authorize the Mayor to execute, and staff to submit, a letter to the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) requesting that the City of San Clemente, as a member City in the Oceanside Littoral Cell, have the opportunity to participate in the Phase I planning tasks of the Regional Beach Sand Project (RBSP) III, which supports continued San Clemente Coastal Resiliency Plan implementation goals of establishing a citywide comprehensive beach restoration program.

H. CONSIDERATION OF AUTHORIZING A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE CALIFORNIA COASTAL COMMISSION FOR IDENTIFICATION OF OFFSHORE SAND SOURCES

Staff Recommendation

Adopt Resolution No. 23-91, which will:

- Authorize the submittal of an application to the California Coastal Commission for a Local Coastal Program Grant to fund an offshore borrow site investigation to find additional sand sources that can be used to develop additional beach nourishment projects in San Clemente and pursue additional grant funding opportunities to support coastal resiliency plan implementation.
- 2. Find the project that the grant funding would be used for is categorically exempt under Class 6 (Information Collection, 14 CCR 15306), Section 15306 of the state CEQA Guidelines.
- 3. Authorize the City Manager to execute the grant agreement, if awarded.

I. CONSIDERATION OF A RESOLUTION RATIFYING AN EMERGENCY CONSTRUCTION AGREEMENT WITH GCI CONSTRUCTION, INC. FOR THE SAN CLEMENTE VILLAS BY THE SEA STORM DRAIN REPAIRS; PROJECT NO. 26001

Staff Recommendation

Adopt Resolution No. 23-92, which will:

- Make a finding that an emergency existed due to the potential failure of the slope where the damaged storm drain is located and that the situation required immediate action to prevent or mitigate impairment to property and public services that might otherwise occur if the City were required to incur delays attributed to the typical engineering analysis and competitive bidding process.
- 2. Declare that the public interest and necessity demanded the immediate expenditure of public funds to safeguard public health.
- 3. Ratify Contract No. C23-49, by and between the City of San Clemente and GCI Construction, Inc., providing for the emergency repairs for the San Clemente Villas by the Sea Storm Drain Repairs, Project No. 26001, that have already been performed, in an amount not to exceed \$95,500.

A. PUBLIC HEARING #2 REQUESTING PUBLIC INPUT REGARDING THE COMPOSITION OF POTENTIAL COUNCIL ELECTION DISTRICTS

Public Hearing to solicit public input on the composition of the districts in preparation for the transition from at-large to district-based elections for City Council pursuant to Elections Code Section 10010 and Government Code Section 34886, effective for the November 2024 General Municipal Election.

Staff Recommendation

- 1. Conduct the public hearing and receive public input regarding the composition of the potential Council election districts.
- 2. Provide direction to NDC on the Council's preference for 5 Council districts with a rotating Mayor, or for 4 Council districts with a citywide-elected Mayor. If 4 districts with a Citywide-elected Mayor is preferred, provide guidance on

whether the Mayoral term should be 2 years or 4 years.

B. <u>INTRODUCTION (FIRST READING) OF ZONING AMENDMENT 22-366, AN</u> ORDINANCE RELATED TO ZONING PERMIT STREAMLINING

Public Hearing to consider a City-initiated amendment to Title 17 (Zoning) of the San Clemente Municipal Code to update the staff-level approval process for minor architectural changes; consolidate planning applications to make it easier for the public to understand which zoning permits are required and reduce staff time on report writing, shortening the timeline between application submittal and decisions; reduce the level of public hearing decisions for several planning application types; clarify planning permit review procedures to facilitate staff and public understanding and implementation.
