<u>Wayne Eggleston</u>, San Clemente, opined on the number of districts and keeping a rotating mayor; urged council to keep the districts as simple as possible for residents.

<u>Donna Vidrine</u>, San Clemente, encouraged Councilmembers to maintain transparency during the transition to district elections.

<u>Tim Brown</u>, San Clemente, opined that Council should have five districts with a rotating mayor.

There being no others desiring to speak, Mayor Duncan closed the Public Hearing.

Council provided direction to NDC to move forward with preparing district maps with four districts and an elected at-large Mayor, with consideration of the Mayor holding a 2-year term.
