PUBLIC HEARING #3 TO RECEIVE INPUT ON DRAFT MAPS AND POTENTIAL ELECTION SEQUENCING FOR BY-DISTRICT ELECTIONS

Fiscal Impact:

None.

Background:

On August 15, 2023, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 23-85 Declaring the City of San Clemente's Intent to Initiate Procedures to Consider Transition from At-Large Elections to By-District Elections Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 10010. Pursuant to Elections Code section 10010, the City Council held the first two public hearings on August 15, 2023 and September 5, 2023, to receive public input regarding the composition of the districts, the number of districts and potential election sequencing.

Following the timeline set forth in Resolution No. 23-85 and Election Code 10010, the City will hold at least three more public hearings and an ordinance transitioning from at-large to by-district elections should be adopted by Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

As part of the transition, the City has retained the services of National Demographics Corporation (NDC), whose consultants Doug Johnson and Dr. Justin Levitt, are assisting with the design and revision of proposed maps as determined through the public hearing process and in compliance with the CVRA.

By adopting Resolution No. 23-85, the City Council has adopted a tentative timeline (Attachment 1), which identifies the preliminary schedule for public hearings and public outreach. Under the Safe Harbor provisions of Election Code 10010, a city must hold a series of public hearings: including at least two public hearings prior to the drafting of proposed district maps; and at least two additional public hearings after the maps are drawn. Drafts of the maps must be published at least seven days before consideration at a hearing, and if revised, the map must be made available to the public for at least seven days before its adoption. If the proposed district elections are to be staggered, the potential sequence of elections must be made public. If a final map is selected at the fourth public hearing, and no changes and made to the map, Council may introduce an ordinance at that time and conduct a fifth public hearing on the ordinance.

ANALYSIS:

The City conducted its first public hearing on August 15, 2023 to listen to public's input on composition and number of districts. As previously discussed at that meeting, the purpose of the first two public hearings was to inform the public about the districting process and to hear from the community on what factors should be taken into consideration when creating district boundaries. At the first public hearing, Council received public comment and provided input to staff regarding the communities of interest.

The City conducted its second public hearing on September 5, 2023 to receive public input regarding communities of interest and other local factors that should be considered while drafting district maps. Council received public comment and Council provided input to staff regarding the criteria for the composition of the districts. Council also discussed the number of districts and directed creation of draft maps with four (4) districts and a directly elected mayor rather than five (5) districts.

In creating the district boundaries, the City must ensure compliance with the following state and federally-mandated criteria:

Legal Requirements:

- 1. Each council district shall contain a nearly equal population as required by law; and
- 2. Each council district shall be drawn in a manner that complies with the Federal Voting Rights Act. No council district shall be drawn with race as the predominate factor in violation of the principles established by the United States Supreme Court in Shaw v. Reno, 509 U.S. 630 (1993), and its progeny.

The Council shall adopt district boundaries using the following criteria as set forth in the following order of priority:

- 1. To the extent practicable, council districts shall be geographically contiguous. Areas within districts that meet only at the points of adjoining corners are not contiguous.
- 2. To the extent practicable, the geographic integrity of any local neighborhood or local community of interest should be respected and included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation in a manner that minimizes its division. A "community of interest" is a population that shares common social or economic interests that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation.
- 3. Council district boundaries should be easily identifiable and understandable by residents. To the extent practicable, council districts shall be bounded by natural and artificial barriers, by streets, or by the boundaries of the city.
- 4. To the extent practicable, and where it does not conflict with the preceding criteria, council districts shall be drawn to encourage geographical compactness in a manner that nearby areas of population are not bypassed in favor of more distant populations and where doing so does not conflict with higher-ranked criteria.

5. Where doing so does not conflict with higher-ranked criteria, the City Council may consider other traditional principles in the development of districts. For example, to the extent practicable, each council district shall respect the previous choices of voters by avoiding the creation of head-to-head contests between councilmembers previously elected by the voters, insofar as this does not conflict with federal or state law.

Public Input and Public Participation Toolkit:

City staff has and continues to conduct outreach, in both English and Spanish, to advise its residents of each public hearing by posting on social media channels such as the City's Facebook page and Instagram. Additionally, the City has made informational flyers, providing sample maps in both English and Spanish, available throughout City's facilities. The City has also noticed each public hearing in the City's adjudicated newspaper, The San Clemente Times, in Spanish and English. City staff has created a website page dedicated to this transition, whereby information is available in Spanish. The City Clerk notified all Homeowners Associations and conducted public outreach at the Human Affairs Committee. Staff provided an update to the public at a Planning Commission meeting and Public Safety Committee meeting, and all City Commissions and Committees were notified.

In addition to the public engagement process described above, the City created a "Draw a Map" webpage and through different social media channels, invited the public to use the Public Participation Toolkit on the City's Website to directly draw and submit maps for possible district boundaries. To date, the City has received 18 maps, 10 of which are unique.

Maps may continue to be hand-delivered or mailed to the City Clerk's Office located at 910 Calle Negocio, San Clemente, CA 96273, scanned and emailed, or photographed and emailed to districtelections@san-clemente.org or to the City Clerk's office at cityclerk@san-clemente.org. The deadline to submit draft maps is October 6, 2023.

Remaining Public Hearings Required:

Pursuant to Elections Code section 10010, the City Council must hold at least two public hearings on the draft district maps before introducing an ordinance to formally adopt a district map, set the sequence of elections and transition to district-based elections. This October 3, 2023 public hearing will be the third public hearing. The fourth and fifth public hearings are scheduled for October 17, 2023.

Draft Maps for Consideration on October 3, 2023:

Following the close of the second public hearing on September 5, 2023, NDC prepared a few draft district maps and sequences of elections for City Council consideration. Members of the public have also submitted their own draft district maps and sequences of elections for City Council consideration. All draft district maps must be available to the public seven days prior to consideration at a public hearing. The draft maps and proposed election sequences to be considered by the Council at the October 3, 2023 City Council meeting were published on the City's website on September 21, 2023. These draft maps will be considered by the Council, along with public input at this third public hearing on October 3, 2023. Those draft maps and potential sequencing of district elections are attached to this staff report as Attachment 2.

Three unique draft district maps were submitted by members of the public and are identified as Maps 101-113.

Due to the publication deadline of September 21, 2023, any map received after September 14, 2023 cannot be considered by Council at the October 3, 2023 meeting. City Council consideration of newly submitted draft maps will occur at the October 17, 2023 City Council meeting.

Remaining Public Hearings:

The final two public hearings are both currently scheduled for Tuesday, October 17, 2023. It is anticipated that, after receiving public comment at the meeting on October 17, 2023, the Council may introduce an ordinance to adopt district boundaries and to establish district elections. It is anticipated that the Council may consider final action on the ordinance (second reading) at the public hearing on November 7, 2023. However, if the City Council amends one of the draft district maps at one of the required public hearings, the revised district map must be available to the public seven days prior to the next public hearing.

It is important to note that the transition should be completed by Tuesday, November 7, 2023. Adopting an ordinance transitioning from at-large to by-district elections by this date will avoid litigation being initiated against the City for alleged violations of the CVRA.

Council Options:

- Conduct the Third Public Hearing to receive public input regarding the content of the draft maps and the proposed sequences of elections.
- Direct Staff to return to Council with additional information.

Environmental Review/Analysis:

This is not a "project" under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Recommended Actions:

Staff Recommendation

- 1. Open and conduct a third public hearing.
- 2. Receive a report from NDC, the demographic consultant, concerning the draft maps proposed, as well as the process for obtaining public input on the draft maps of potential voting districts and potential election sequencing for by-district elections pursuant to Elections Code § 10010.
- 3. Invite members of the public to provide feedback on the draft maps and potential election sequencing presented.
- 4. Provide direction to NDC about any modifications to one or more proposed district maps and the potential election sequencing to implement the by-district election system and close the public hearing.




